The Department of Art & Culture, A&N Administration in consultation with the Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial Committee has set up a Museum in the building constructed under MPLAD Fund in 2004 in the premises of Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial. The Museum was inaugurated by the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray by unveiling the plaque and cutting the ribbon in the presence of the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar here this morning. The Patron, Homfraygunj Martyr's

Memorial, Shri Gauri Shankar Pandey, Secretary, (Art & Culture), Smti Neha Bansal, Secretary (Law), Shri Pradeep Banerjee, Dy. Commissioner, South Andaman, Shri Udit Prakash Rai, Adhyaksha, ZPSA, Smti Baby Fareeda, ex- Adhyaksha, Smti Minati Biswas, Pradhan, Homfraygunj, Smti Mary, Committee Members and family members of Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial, senior citizens and PRIs were present on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the Member of Parliament offered his tribute to the 44 Martyr's who were shot dead and buried by the Japanese

Forces on Jan 30, 1944. He said the history of Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial need to be made known to people and called upon one and all to come forward and make this memorial a grand one. He also urged the Secretary (Art & Culture) to hold discussion with the Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial Committee members pertaining to their various demands and requested for a copy of the documents/records of the Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial which he said, will be presented before the Lok Sabha Museum.

to Viper Island, replication of Netaji Club formerly known as Browning Club, establishment of Vishwa Shanti Park in the premises of Homfraygunj Martyr's Memorial etc. can be taken up by the Art & Culture Department, the fund for which will be provided under MPLAD Fund. He further stated that many development projects can be initiated here in the Islands by involving the Islanders, business and contribution from various companies through their CSR activities. First-ever Tri Service Joint Exercise between India & Russia begins

Moscow, Oct 20

The first-ever Tri Services Joint Exercise between Indian and Russian Armed Forces, INDRA-2017 began yesterday near Vladivostok in Russia. Two indigenously built Indian Naval ships INS Satpura and INS Kadmat reached Vladivostok Port yesterday and were given a traditional ceremonial welcome.



The Indian contingent for the Exercise is led by the Task Force Commander Major General ND Prasad. The Exercise INDRA in its previous nine editions has been conducted as a single service exercise alternately between the two countries. This year the Exercise has been upgraded to involve all the three Services Army, Navy and Air Force. It further accentuates the importance of Joint Services in the present world environment. The Exercise INDRA will be conducted from today at the 249th Combined Army Range Sergeevskiy and in the Sea of Japan near

Vladivostok. The Indian contingent comprises of 350 personnel from Army, 80 from Air Force, two IL 76 aircraft and one Frigate and Corvette each from the Navy. The Russian Federation Armed Forces will be represented by approximately 1000 troops of the 5th Army, Marines and Ships of Pacific Fleet and aircraft from Eastern Military District. Exercise INDRA-2017 will be a landmark event in the history of Indo-Russian defence co-operation and will strengthen mutual confidence, interoperability and enable sharing of best practices between both the armed forces. Male crocodile captured from Manglutan nallah Translocated to far off place from human habitation

Port Blair, Oct 20

The South Andaman Division has captured a 2.43 mtrs. long semi-adult male crocodile from Manglutan nallah under Manglutan Forest Range yesterday. This crocodile was being seen in the Manglutan Nallah since last about one month and was causing panic among the villagers. Earlier, the Divisional Forest Officer, South Andaman with a view to safeguard the people residing nearby the area declared this crocodile is dangerous to human beings and directed the Range Officer to immediately capture the



animal and translocate it to a far off place from human habitation. Accordingly, traps with dead chicken as bait were laid in the potential sites of crocodile visit and in the first attempt itself, the Forest officials of Manglutan Range succeeded in capturing the crocodile in the morning of Oct 19. It was

later successfully released on the same day in the wild at a far off place from human habitation i.e. in Komiyo Creek, Rutland Island with the assistance of Wildlife Division, Port Blair. The whole operation was carried out under the close supervision of Shri T.P.Mukesh, Range Officer, Manglutan.

AB de Villiers returns to top of ODI rankings for batsmen

Dubai, UAE, Oct 20
Swashbuckling South Africa batsman AB de Villiers has once again grabbed the top position in the ICC ODI Player Rankings for batsmen.

An astonishing knock of 176 by De Villiers in the second ODI against Bangladesh in Paarl, which consisted of 15 fours and seven sixes and came off only 104 balls, has also helped South Africa edge India at the top of the ODI Team Rankings by taking a 2-0 winning lead in the three-match series.

The latest rankings, which take into account the first two matches of the South Africa-Bangladesh series and the first three matches of the ongoing Pakistan-Sri Lanka series in the United Arab Emirates, see De Villiers climb to the top of the ODI table for the 14th time in his career.

The 33-year-old, who has leapfrogged Australian David Warner and India captain Virat Kohli, had first attained top position on May 30, 2010, and the number of days he has spent at the top is second most after retired West Indies great Vivian Richards. De Villiers has now been at the top for 2,124 days while Richards was number one for 2,306 days.

Other batsmen to move up include Pakistan's Babar Azam



(up two places to a career-best fourth position), the South African pair of Quinton de Kock (up three places to fifth) and Hashim Amla (up two places to ninth), and Bangladesh's Mushfiqur Rahim (up five places to 18th). Among bowlers, Hasan Ali's haul of 5 for 34 in the third ODI against Sri Lanka in Abu Dhabi, which his team won by seven

wickets for a decisive 3-0 lead in the five-match series, has given the pace bowler a big boost in ranking points.

The 23-year-old, who has taken nine wickets in the series so far, has moved up six places to become the fifth bowler at the top of the ODI rankings this year after Trent Boult, Imran Tahir, Kagiso Rabada and Josh Hazlewood.

Messi joins 100-goal club in Europe in Barca stroll

Athen, Oct 20
Lionel Messi scored his 100th goal in European competition as Barcelona moved close to qualifying for the Champions League knockout stages by outclassing Olympiakos 3-1 on despite playing the second half with 10 men. Gerard Pique was sent off two minutes before halftime for two bookings, one for tugging an opponent's shirt and the other for slapping the

ball into the net, but Barca were barely threatened by a hapless Olympiakos side who are badly under-performing in their Greek title defence.

The Athens club, who won three league titles and two domestic Cups under current Barca coach Ernesto Valverde, are fifth in the standings in the Greek top flight and have lost all their games in the Champions League.

Prannoy stuns Chong Wei, Saina, Srikanth too reach quarters

Odense, Oct 20

H S Prannoy recorded his second successive win over three-time Olympic silver medalist Lee Chong Wei, while Saina Nehwal and Kidambi Srikanth also registered contrasting wins to advance to the quarterfinals of the Denmark Open Super Series Premier here.

Just four months back, Prannoy had created a flutter when he dispatched Chong Wei in straight games in the Indonesia Super Series Premier and the unseeded Indian dished out another superb performance on Thursday to oust the former World No. 1 Malaysian 21-17 11-21 21-19 in a match that lasted an hour and three minutes here.

"I am happy to beat him again today. Even at this age, he is one of the best players, who can play in any conditions. I am not thinking much ahead as I have done this before but couldn't win the title so I will just look at the next match," Prannoy told reporters after the match.

World No. 8 Srikanth, who already has two super series



titles at Indonesia and Australia to his name, defeated Korea's Jeon Hyeok Jin 21-13 8-21 21-18, while Saina, who won a bronze at the Glasgow World Championship, prevailed over Thailand's Nitchaon Jindapol 22-20 21-13 in women's singles pre-quarterfinals.

US Open champion Prannoy will next face Korea's top seed Son Wan Ho, Srikanth will meet current world champion Viktor Axelsen, while Saina will square off against Japan's Akane Yamaguchi.

Also through to the quarters were England's Rajiv Ouseph, Hong Kong's Wong Wing Ki Vincent, Korea's Lee Hyun Il, Chinese Taipei's Chou Tien Chen.

In women's singles, top seed and world no 1 Tai Tzu Ying,

Korean duo of Sung Ji Hyun and Kim Hyo Min, Japan's Sayaka Sato, China's Chen Yufei and Thailand's Ratchanok Intanon also reached the last eight.

Prannoy trailed Chong Wei, who turns 35 tomorrow, 1-2 in career meetings before the match. However, buoyed by his recent win over the celebrated Malaysian in June, the Indian produced another sensational performance, befitting his new-found stardom of a giant-killer.

The 25-year-old Indian started off well and dictated terms as he built up a 10-7 lead but the former World No. 1 leveled par with a lucky net chord before entering the break with a slender lead when the Indian's return missed the sideline.

FIFA U-17 World Cup India 2017 reaches quarter-final stage

Kolkata, Oct 20
The FIFA Under-17 World Cup India 2017 has reached the quarter-final stage, with the first set of last-eight matches taking place tomorrow.

The early kick-off in Guwahati will see two West African rivals meet, as Mali and Ghana will determine who will be the last team left from their continent in the semi-finals.

While Ghana topped their group with two wins, Mali stood second in Group C with equal number of victories.

Ghana are seeking to revive



their glory days in the tournament, having last won it way back in 1995.

The second FIFA Under 17 match sees USA take on England in Goa.

Mali reached the final last eight after seeing off Paraguay in New Delhi, while England reached this stage after a penalty shoot-out to get past Japan in Kolkata.

India v New Zealand: India chase top spot in ODIs, New Zealand a slice of history

New Delhi, Oct 20
India have just been displaced at the top of the ICC ODI championship by South Africa, but Virat Kohli's buoyant team have a chance to reclaim the top spot heading into a three-game series with New Zealand starting October 22 in Mumbai. India are placed second on the basis of decimal points, but have the same number of points (120) as South Africa, and can move back to the top with a series win over New Zealand. In 2017, India have won 17 of 22 completed ODIs - a span that includes a 3-0 sweep of England, a 3-2 run in the ICC Champions Trophy, where they lost to Pakistan in the final, a 3-1 win in the West Indies, a 5-0 whitewash in Sri Lanka and most recently a 4-1 victory over Australia at home. In the same time, Kane Williamson's

New Zealand have won seven of 13 completed ODIs - beating Australia 2-0 at home, losing 2-3 to South Africa at home, winning a low-key series featuring Ireland and Bangladesh (to whom they lost once) and then being knocked out of the Champions Trophy in the first round with another defeat to Bangladesh.

Statistically, things are not stacked in New Zealand's favour when it comes to ODIs in India. While in multi-team tournaments their record on Indian soil is 18-11, the bigger picture is that New Zealand have never won a bilateral ODI series in India. The five series contested between the two teams - in 1988, 1995, 1999, 2010 and 2016 - were each won by the home team. The first of these was a 4-0 win for Dilip Vengsarkar's team over

John Wright's tourists, following India's 2-1 victory in the Tests. India won by four wickets, five wickets, 53 runs and two wickets before the fifth match in Jammu was abandoned due to heavy rain.

In 1995, Mohammad Azharuddin's Indian team won 3-2. New Zealand took the series lead in Jamshepur with Martin Crowe scoring an unbeaten hundred, but India won the second and fourth matches - the third was abandoned - to take the advantage back. Lee Germon's team made it 2-2 with a 99-run win in Nagpur, setting up the decider nicely. The sixth ODI was a one-sided affair, with New Zealand bowled out for 126 in 35 overs and India cantering home with six wickets and 108 deliveries remaining.
