International Child Rights Day celebrated in Isles

Conducive environment necessary for holistic development of children: LG



Port Blair, Nov. 20

Along with the rest of the world, International Child Rights Day was also celebrated in the Islands today. To commemorate the occasion, a state level programme was organized by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights in collaboration with the A&N UT Commission for Protection of Child Rights (UTCPCR), at DBRAIT auditorium here this morning. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Admiral D. K. Joshi PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) was the chief guest on the occasion. Member, NCPCR, New Delhi, Shri Yashwant Jain, Smti Rupa Ray, Adhyaksha, ZPSA, Smti Baby Fareeda, Chairperson, SSWB, Dr. Poonam Arora, Chairperson, UTCPCR, Smti Kiran Tigga, State President, BJP, Shri Vishal Jolly, members of UTCPCR, PRIs, senior officers of the Administration and students were also present on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the Lt. Governor expressed happiness in being part of the celebration of 'International Child Rights Day'. He said, on this day in 1959, 'Declaration of the Rights of the Child' was adopted by the UN General Assembly for promoting all child rights while the 'Convention on the Rights of the Child' was adopted

in 1989.

He said, it is already mentioned in the Directive Principle of our Constitution that States will formulate their policies in such a manner that all children get the opportunity for their overall development and are not subjected to any exploitation or crime.

Creating a healthy and conducive environment for

the holistic development of the sensitive minds of the children has been a challenge before the society and the Administration. Such environment for children will lead to the development of the country, said the Lt. Governor.

He said, every child has the basic and inalienable rights to survival,

protection and participation in all developmental activities in the society and nation. The Lt. Governor further stated that children are the most valuable resource of the country and hope of our future; hence they should be protected and secured from all forms of abuses and exploitations.

The Lt. Governor remarked that every child

is endowed with special talents & potential; hence they must get conducive atmosphere and opportunity to flourish as per their capabilities. Children with special needs must get equal opportunities and must be assisted in every possible way for their growth, he remarked.

As per the schedule of the Commission for Special Summary Revision 2018 period for filling of claims and objections is fixed from 31.10.2017 to 30.11.2017 and special campaign dates with BLO of Political parties for receiving claims and objections is on 11.11.2017 and 25.11.2017.

All the eligible un-enrolled citizens have been requested to enroll their names during this period or on the special campaign dates at their respective polling stations with the concerned BLOs or at the offices of ERO/AEROs concerned.

In order to ensure hassle free enrolment of the General Public, State

Contact Centre (SCC) and District Contact Centre (DCC) are set up which function all working days from 9 AM to 5 PM.

Tender floated for new stretch of NH in A&N Islands: MP

Port Blair, Nov 20

The National High Way and Infrastructure Development & Corporation (NHIDCL), a PSU under MoRTH has floated tenders for rehabilitation/up-gradation of NH in A&N Islands from Km 107.760 to Km 129.445 (Baratang to Gandhighat jetty), from Km 130.600 to Km 138 (Gandhi Ghat Jetty to Kadamtala) and Km 155.00 to Km 181.0 (end of Jarwa area of Kadamtala to

Rangat), total 57.71 kms for a total length of 54.71 kms, a press release issued by the office of the Member of Parliament said here today. The release further mentioned that the estimated cost for these stretches is Rs.322.34Cr and completion period of work would be 2 years from the date of award of the work. The last date for submission of tender document is 28.12.2017 which will be opened on 29.12.2017.

Similarly, the tender for rehabilitation/upgradation of Jarawa area of NH (223) form km. 59.400 to 107 kms and km 138.30 to km 155.00, total length of 64.30 for an estimated cost of Rs.50.11 Cr. has also been floated which shall be completed within one year from the date of award of the work. The last date for submission of bid is 28.12.2017 which will open on 29.12.2017, the release added.

A&N Islands signs MoU with Govt. of India under UDAY Scheme

27 States and 4 UTs have joined UDAY till date

New Delhi, Nov 20

On the 2nd Anniversary of Ujwal DISCOM Assurance Yojana (UDAY) today, the Government of India signed four Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) under the Scheme with the State of Nagaland and with Union Territories (UTs) of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli & Daman & Diu for operational improvements. These State/UTs have joined only for operational improvement and shall not undergo financial restructuring/issue of bonds under the scheme. With the above, UDAY club has now grown to 27 states and 4 UTs.

An overall net benefit of approximately Rs. 551 crores, Rs. 18 crores, Rs. 13 crores and Rs. 10 crores respectively would accrue to the State of Nagaland & UTs of Andaman & Nicobar, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu by opting to participate in UDAY, by way of cheaper funds for capex, reduction in AT&C and Transmission losses, interventions in energy efficiency, etc. during the period of turnaround.

LED street light installation & maintenance without any cost

Project to be completed before schedule: PBMC

Port Blair, Nov 20

The Central Government issued directions for replacement of all conventional street lights here before 26th January 2018. However more than 10,000 street lights have been replaced with LED lights and remaining about 3500 street lights may be replaced in next 10 days. Hence, all the existing conventional street lights will be replaced with LED lights by Nov 30, i.e. almost two months before the schedule. The work of providing about 1300 additional street lights in newly extended six wards will start in first week of December and will be completed on priority. In a press release received here today, the Secretary PBMC Shri Yashpal Garg, informed that the project has been undertaken under



Smart City and being executed by a Government Company M/s EESL. The responsibility of installation and maintenance for seven years will be of M/s EESL. The street lights have been connected through GPRS and its switch on/switch off can be done even from the mainland. There will be no effective outflow of funds as presently average annual streetlight expenditure including maintenance is about Rs. 5

crores. On implementation of LED project, the annual expenditure including installment to M/s EESL will be about Rs. 2.33 crores (Energy bill Rs.0.87 crores+ EMI of Rs. 1.46 crores). The annual saving in electricity consumption will be 28 lakh units and hence the Electricity Department will also be saving about Rs. 4crores annually. All the street lights of the Municipal area will be replaced with LED lights without any financial

burden. In fact, during the project period of 7 years, the PBMC and Electricity Department will be saving about Rs. 40crores. After 7 years, the LED street lights will be maintained by PBMC, the release added.

Virat Kohli, Bhuvneshwar Kumar light up final day of drawn Test

Kolkata, Nov 20
Skipper Virat Kohli hit one of the finest counter-attacking centuries in recent times as India nearly scripted an epic win before the first cricket Test against Sri Lanka ended in a draw after a tantalising final days cricket.

Kohli's unbeaten 104 – his 18th Test and 50th overall hundred saw India declaring their second innings at 352 for 8. This left Sri Lanka with an improbable 231 to chase in little over a session. The target was out of reach but the Indian bowlers went full throttle raising visions of a victory, reducing Sri Lanka to 75 for 7 before umpires called off play due to deteriorating light. Nearly 20 overs of play was still left but the light was always going to be a factor as Bhuvneshwar Kumar (11-8-8-4) rocked the Sri Lankan batting in the company of Mohammed Shami (2/34 in 9.3 overs) and Umesh Yadav (1/25 in 5 overs). After being dominated for the better part of the first four rain-truncated days, Kohli took it in



his own hands to completely alter the complexion of the match. With opposition's best bowler Suranga Lakmal (3/93) removing KL Rahul (79), Cheteshwar Pujara (22) and Ajinkya Rahane (0) within the first hour of play, the visitors were sniffing victory with India effectively 91 for 4 at that point of time. Kohli didn't get any stable partners but initially played it safe till the lunch session before launching a ferocious counter-attack in the post-lunch session. The two sixes over extra cover

off Lakmal were a statement of intent that he was not ready to play for time trying to save the match. Instead of being match-saving innings, it nearly turned out to be a match-winning innings as he smacked 12 boundaries and two sixes. He assessed the pitch well knowing that survival won't help his cause and used his big front foot stride well trying to negate the swing. The Sri Lankan bowlers especially Lakmal tried to entice him with two short covers so that he plays the uppish drive that

had time and again brought about his downfall but the skipper didn't take the bait on most occasions.

India-Sri Lanka ODI series schedule changed

New Delhi, Nov 20
The first and second ODI between India and Sri Lanka, that are scheduled to take place in Dharamsala and Mohali respectively, will start two hours ahead of the scheduled start for day/night ODIs in India. According to the new schedule, the matches that are supposed to start at 1.30 PM will start at 11.30 AM. The reason behind preponing the start of the matches is because the cities are in the Northern part of India, where winter will be at its peak in December, making it difficult for the players to play in rough weather conditions during the night. Sri Lanka are currently in India to play three Tests, three ODIs and three T20s. The first Test of the tour is being played at the Eden Gardens in Kolkata, where rain played spoilsport on the first two days and the match is poised to end in a stalemate. After the first Test, the teams will move to Nagpur and Delhi for the second and third Tests respectively. After the Test series, both the teams will play in three ODIs that will be played in Dharamsala, Mohali and Vizag followed by three T20s in Cuttack, Indore and Mumbai. The first two ODIs will start at 11.30 AM and the third ODI will get underway at 1.30 PM. All the three T20s will start at 7.00 PM.

Dimitrov beats Goffin to win ATP Finals

London, Nov 20
Grigor Dimitrov beat David Goffin 7-5, 4-6, 6-3 in a gripping title decider at the ATP Finals to become the first debutant to win the season finale since 1998.

In a surprise final match-up, the Bulgarian sixth seed held his nerve under intense pressure at London's O2 Arena to seal the biggest title of his career on his fifth match point. He will climb to third in the rankings behind only



Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer as he begins to deliver decisively on his rich promise as a youngster.

improve their operational efficiency, and thereby reduce the cost of supply of power, the Central Government would also provide incentives to the State/UTs for improving power infrastructure and for further lowering the cost of power. The Central schemes such as Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana (DDUGJY), Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS), Power Sector Development Fund or such other schemes of Ministry of Power (MoP) and Ministry of New & Renewable Energy (MNRE) are already providing funds for improving power infrastructure and additional/priority funding would be considered under these schemes, if the State/UTs meets the operational milestones outlined in the scheme. Demand Side interventions in UDAY such as usage of energy-efficient LED bulbs, agricultural pumps, fans & air-conditioners and efficient industrial equipment through PAT (Perform, Achieve, Trade) would help in reducing peak load, flatten load curve and thus help in reducing energy consumption in the State/UTs. Further, with improved efficiency, they would be in a better position to fund their capex at cheaper rates for Power infrastructure development/improvement in the State/UTs. The ultimate benefit of signing the MOU would go to the people of these state/UTs. Reduced levels of AT&C losses would mean lesser cost per unit of electricity to consumers. Further, an operationally healthy DISCOM/Electricity Department would be in a position to supply more power. The scheme would also allow speedy availability of cheaper power to households in the State/UTs that are still without electricity. Availability of 24*7 cheaper, round the clock power would boost the economy, promote industries/tourism, thereby improving employment opportunities for the people of these State/UTs.

Shiva Keshavan qualifies for his sixth Winter Olympics

New Delhi, Nov 20
Indian luger Shiva Keshavan will make his sixth appearance at the Winter Olympics as he qualified for the 2018 PyeongChang Winter Games at the ongoing Viessmann Luge World Cup 2017-18 in Innsbruck, Austria.

The three-time Asian Cup gold medalist luger needed five necessary points to achieve the qualification standard for next year's mega-event and he managed to achieve that at the World Cup. Competing in the Viessmann Luge World Cup on Sunday, Keshavan, the current Asian Champion, finished 23rd out of 57 athletes with a time difference of 0.701s from the winner. "I am very happy that I have fulfilled the Olympic criteria, I still have to participate in the next five compulsory races but I am relieved that the pressure for getting the World Cup points is over and I can push myself to



take more risks and get closer to the leaderboard," a delighted Keshavan said in a statement. "Thrilled to announce that I have achieved the minimum 5 points for Olympic selection in the very first of five qualification races! Thank you for your support and keep following the next four weeks of World Cups," he later wrote on his Facebook page.

Usain Bolt to 'coach' Australian cricketers

Sydney, Nov 20
Australia's cricketers have called on retired sprint king Usain Bolt to boost their running between the wickets during the Ashes Test series against England. The Jamaican track superstar, the world record holder in the 100m and 200m and eight-time Olympic champion, is working with the Australian batsmen to improve their "explosiveness" off the mark.

Sindhu spearheads India's campaign at Hong Kong Open

Hong Kong, Nov 20
Playing her fifth successive tournament in little over a month, Olympic silver medalist P V Sindhu will have to battle exhaustion when she leads India's challenge at the USD 400,000 Hong Kong Super Series, starting here tomorrow. Left with little time to prepare after literally living out of a suitcase in the last month, Sindhu found the going tough last week as she was a tad slow in her movement on court and her strokes also lacked the trademark sharpness.



The result was Sindhu suffered a listless loss against a young talent in China's Gao Fangjie, who went on to reach the final at China Open Super Series premier last week. The Indian will have to recover quickly from that defeat and put her best foot forward against a qualifier in the opening round here. The 22-year-old from Hyderabad is expected to meet Akane Yamaguchi of Japan in the quarters if she crosses the first two rounds. Yamaguchi has been in sizzling form this season and clinched the China Open title last week after making her third

Former Wimbledon champion Jana Novotna dies at 49

New York, Nov 20
Former World No 2 Jana Novotna died peacefully in her sleep, surrounded by her family, at 49 on Sunday. She had been battling with cancer for a long time. The player from Czech Republic won 17 Grand Slam titles through her career – 12 in doubles, four in mixed doubles and her solitary Slam in singles came at Wimbledon in 1998. She beat Frenchwoman Nathalie Tauziat in the final and thus became the last Czech player to win a Slam until Petra Kvitova won in 2011. Hailed for her prolific and athletic game at the net, Novotna totalled 24 titles through her 14-year career along with 76 titles in doubles. She reached the Wimbledon final twice – in 1993 and 1997 – before triumphing in 1998. Clearly grass was the surface where she made the most impact highlighted by her foray into the final on eight occasions in doubles and once in the mixed doubles as well.

Islands highlighted the role of soft skill in the development of personality and better performance in the daily life.
