The President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu inaugurated the 7th India Water Week today at Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that it is impossible to imagine life without water. In Indian civilization, water is not only important in life but also in the journey after life. That is why all water sources are considered sacred. But at the present if we look at the situation the condition seems worrying. Due to the increasing population, the condition of our rivers and reservoirs is deteriorating, village ponds are drying up and many local rivers



have become extinct. Water is being over-exploited in agriculture and industries. The environmental balance on the earth is getting disturbed, weather patterns are changing and unseasonal excessive rainfall has become common. In such a situation, discussing the management of water is a very commendable step. The President said that the issue of water is relevant not only for India but for the entire world. This issue is linked to national security too as the vast amount of available freshwater is spread between two or more countries. Therefore, this combined water resource is an issue in which the international cooperation is necessary. She was happy to note that Denmark, Finland, Germany, Israel and the European Union are participating in the 7th India Water Week. She expressed confidence that all will benefit from the exchange of ideas and technologies on this forum.

The 'Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana' is a major initiative in this area. This nationwide scheme is being implemented to increase the irrigated area in the country. In line with water conservation goals, the scheme also envisages adoption of precision-irrigation and water saving technologies to ensure "per drop more crop". The President said that providing clean drinking water to the growing population will be a big challenge in the coming years. RBI launches pilot project of Digital Rupee in wholesale segment



New Delhi, Nov.1

The Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) or Digital Rupee commenced today in the wholesale segment on pilot basis. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in a press release said the Digital Rupee will be used for settlement of secondary market transactions in Government securities. It said that use of the E-Rupee is expected to make the inter-bank market more efficient. RBI said, the settlement in Digital Rupee will reduce transaction costs. It said, based on the learnings from this pilot project, other wholesale transactions and cross-border

payments will be the focus of future pilots of the Digital Rupee roll out. RBI has identified nine banks for participation in the Digital Rupee's wholesale pilot project which are State Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Yes Bank, IDFC First Bank and HSBC. RBI said, the first pilot of the Digital Rupee in the retail segment is planned for launch within a month in select locations. It said, Digital Rupee in retail segment will commence in closed user groups comprising customers and merchants. (Source: india.gov.in)

EPFO decides to allow withdrawal of accumulations in EPS-95 for subscribers

New Delhi, Nov. 1

Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has decided to allow withdrawal of accumulations in Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 (EPS-95) for those subscribers who have only less than six months of service left. Currently, the EPFO subscribers who have less than six months of service left are allowed to withdraw the accumulations in their

employees' provident fund account only. Yesterday, Union Minister for Labour and Employment, Shri Bhupender Yadav chaired the meeting of the Central Board of Trustees, EPFO in which, the Board recommended to the Government to make certain amendments to extend proportionate pensionary benefits for members who have been in the scheme for more than 34 years. This

will help pensioners in getting higher pension at the time of fixation of the retirement benefit. Ministry of Labour and Employment in a statement said that the board has recommended enabling equitable transfer value calculation in cases of grant of exemption or on cancellation of exemption from EPS-95. Canine Distemper Virus infection- a life threatening canine viral disease noticed in dogs in & around Port Blair

Deptt. of AH&VS issues advisory for pet owners

Port Blair, Nov. 1

Since the last couple of months, Canine Distemper Virus infection- a life threatening canine viral disease has been noticed in dogs in and around Port Blair. Canine Distemper Virus (CDV) causes a major disease in

domestic dogs that develops as a serious systemic infection in unvaccinated or improperly vaccinated dogs. Distemper is a contagious and serious disease caused by a Morbillivirus that attacks the respiratory, gastrointestinal and nervous systems of

puppies and dogs. Symptoms of Canine Distemper in dogs include a high rise in temperature 103 to 104 degrees Fahrenheit (Diphasic fever), dry nose, congested eyes, ocular nasal discharge, pneumonia, loss of appetite, vomiting, abdominal pain, etc.

Nervous symptoms include restlessness, excitement, chumpy jaw, excessive salivation and convulsions, epilepsy, chorea (jerky movements of a group of muscles), muscle spasms in lips, cheeks, jaw, head, neck, and limb muscle. Cutaneous (Contd. on last page)

symptoms like hyperkeratinization of footpads making them hard, the dog experiences difficulty in walking on hard objects leading to lameness.

The press release from Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services (AH&VS) stated adding that there is no cure for canine distemper infection. Treatment typically consists of supportive care and efforts to prevent secondary infections; control vomiting, diarrhoea and neurologic symptoms; and combat dehydration through administration of fluids.

Pet owners are advised to take up the following measures to control the spread of infection:

- ▶ Maintain cleanliness in the premises by using mild disinfectant and antiseptic lotion and isolation of affected pet.
- ▶ Make sure your dog is properly vaccinated. Typically the first dose of vaccination is given from 6-8 weeks of age, and then every 3-4 weeks until the pup reaches 16-20 weeks of age.
- ▶ Limit your unvaccinated dog's exposure to other dogs.
- ▶ Keep food and water bowls clean, not just because of the risk of distemper infection, but as a measure of good hygiene. Most regular household disinfectants kill distemper virus, including a 1:20 dilution of household bleach with water.
- ▶ Feed a semi-solid soft or liquid diet to the dog suffering from Distemper. The balance of water, electrolytes, and probiotics in the body should be maintained by feeding curd. If the dog is suffering from vomitings and diarrhoea, then infusion of fluids is a must with the consultation of the Veterinarian.

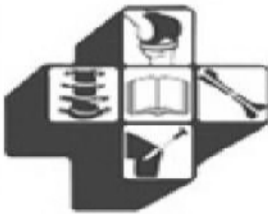

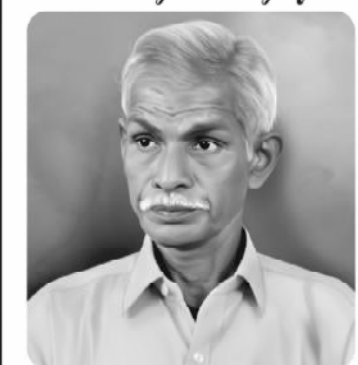
