## Centre to make AC driver cabins in buses and trucks mandatory

New Delhi, Dec 20  
Union Transport Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari has said that with the objective of reducing the number of road accidents, the Centre is mulling various proposals including to make air-conditioning mandatory in the driver's cabin of buses and trucks. Speaking after inauguration of 76th conference of Indian Road Congress in Indore yesterday Shri Gadkari said, every year around 1.5 lakh people die and three lakh people get injured in road accidents in the country. Around 5 lakh accidents take place every year and the

Government want to curtail this number by at least 50 per cent, he said. The Minister said that attention must be paid to road engineering, otherwise in future the country may have to think of registering cases against those who make detailed project reports (DPRs) of roads, if a faulty road is found to be reason of the accident. The engineers, he said, should not change the land acquisition plans for roads under pressure from local politicians.

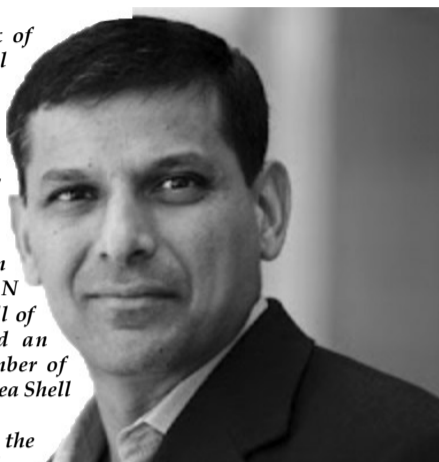
## RBI Governor Dr. Raghuram Rajan arriving today; to hold series of meeting

## BSNL offers bonanza to new customers, slashes mobile call rates by 80%

New Delhi, Dec 20

To speed up customer acquisition, state-owned telecom firm BSNL has slashed mobile rates by up to 80 percent for the first two months under a scheme for new customers. "BSNL has revamped its infrastructure now. We have decided to cut mobile call rates by up to 80 percent for new customer so that they get experience of our revamped services," BSNL Chairman and Managing Director Anupam Shrivastava told PTI. The call rates have been reduced both per minute and per second billing plan, and will be valid only for the first two months of a customer's joining BSNL.

New customer buying BSNL connection will have to buy plan voucher of Rs 36 for per second plan and Rs 37 for per minute plan, including MNP customers). Customers opting for Rs 37 scheme will be charged 10



paisa per minute for making local as well as STD calls within BSNL and 30 paisa per minute on other network. Similarly, after recharging phone for Rs 36, customer will be charged 1 paisa for every 3 second duration on local and STD calls made within BSNL network and 2 paisa for 3

second on other network. The state-run telecom company has roped in Aegis BPO for its customer service which also serves leading private telecom operators. BSNL has also started monitoring complaints on the social media to provide resolution to aggrieved customers.

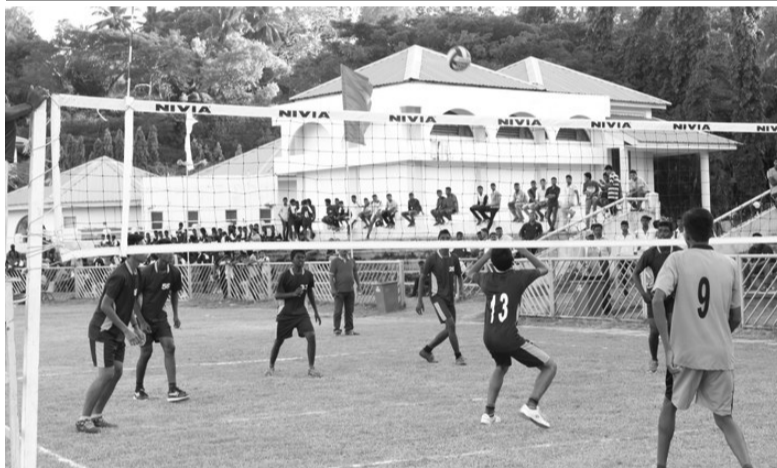
