Requisitioning and Acquisition of Immovable Property (Amendment) Bill, 2017 passed in Lok Sabha

New Delhi, Dec 20
The Lok Sabha has passed a bill amending regulations governing compensation amount payable for acquisition of immovable property by the central government for defence and security purposes. The 'Requisitioning and Acquisition of Immovable Property (Amendment) Bill, 2017 seeks to amend a provision to allow the Centre to re-issue the notice of acquisition in order to ensure that the

property's owner gets an opportunity to be heard. The bill will have retrospective effect from 1952. Replying to a debate on the Bill in the House, Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri said, the amendment is being done only for national security and defence purposes. He said, the government intention is to pay fair and just compensation to land owner. He said, in cases where a

notice has been re-issued, the property owner will be entitled to an interest on the compensation payable to them. However, the re-issue of notice will not apply to cases where the compensation has already been awarded and accepted by the claimants. Resuming the discussion, Shri Ramesh Bidhuri of Bharthiya Janata Party termed the bill as in the interest of security of the nation.

India has maximum women pilots in the world: Minister

New Delhi, Dec.20
Minister of State for Civil Aviation Shri Jayant Sinha said that India has the maximum number of women pilots in the world be it in Air India or Indian Air Force. Addressing the gathering at golden jubilee

celebrations of the India Women Pilots Association in New Delhi yesterday, Shri Sinha said this is a testimony of the contribution made by women to the aviation sector and also by the country to their careers. He added that while the

presence of women has contributed to the progress of the aviation sector, their support is still needed to strengthen the area. Shri Sinha also suggested that the traffic problem in the country can be addressed if the sky area is utilised.

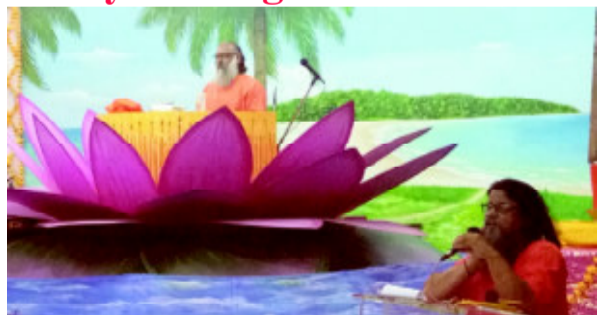

Perth, Dec 20
Steven Smith, the Australian skipper, has jumped to 945 points to retain his number one spot in the latest ICC rankings for Test batsmen. This comes after his match-defining knock of 239 in the first innings of the third Ashes Test, which the hosts pocketed by an innings and 41 runs to regain the Urn. Smith, who had attained 941 points after the first Test, lost three points on the back of scoring 40 and six in Adelaide. Smith has been at the top for nearly two years now,



precisely 114 Tests - fifth in the elite list. The list includes players of the calibre of Garry Sobers (189 Tests), Viv Richards (179), Brian Lara (140) and Sachin Tendulkar (139). England's Dawid Malan and Jonny Bairstow climbed to 52nd and 15th spot respectively.

Olympic gold is my ultimate
target: Mary Kom

New Delhi, Dec 20
She has achieved almost everything that women's boxing can offer, but five-time World Champion M.C. Mary Kom is still yearning for the greatest accolade in the world of sports - winning gold at the Olympics. Mary's only appearance at the Olympics came at the London Games in 2012 when women's boxing was introduced for the first time at the quadrennial sports spectacle. Having moved up to the 51 kg category, she had ended up with a bronze medal. She had admitted later that it was difficult to move out of her favourite 48 kg category - in which she had won her five world titles - but the change had to be made as it was not included at the Olympics or the



Asian Games. However, with the International Boxing Association (IBA) debating over the prospect of including the 48 kilogram division at next year's Asian Games and probably the 2020 Olympics, Mary is filled with renewed hope. "As long as I am alive, winning gold at the Olympics will always be my greatest dream. That will remain a target till the end of my career," she added. Mary added another title to her already overflowing trophy cabinet recently by winning gold at the Asian Women's Boxing Championship - her fifth title at the continental level - and has now set her sights on defending her Asian Games title next year.

Lieutenant Reyaz passionately spoke about his path to success. Reyaz informed that he was interested in joining Indian Armed Forces from his childhood days but due to lack of guidance he could join the Academy only after completing his engineering. "I was always passionate about joining the Armed Forces because of the uniform, the leadership, the weapon systems and honor & pride of serving the Country against all aggression", he said.

Reyaz did his schooling from GDMS and Nirmala Senior Secondary School and completed Graduation in BE (Biotechnology) from Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU), Karnataka. Before joining the Indian Naval Academy, Reyaz was working in Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) as an Investigator and was posted in Carnicobar.

Disclosing about the selection procedures, an ecstatic Reyaz informed that he qualified his Service Selection Board (SSB) interview from Naval Selection Board, Vishakapatnam which is a five day process comprising of series of psychological tests to assess the personality of the individual through various methods like personal interviews, group dynamics, and psychometric assessments and if qualified it is followed by medical examination. "This is not enough, an individual again has to compete for the all India merit list to join the academy. I joined the prestigious Indian Naval Academy (INA) 'Asia's Largest Military Academy', on January 7, 2017. I joined the executive branch 'The War Fighting Cadre' of the mighty Indian Navy and after almost a year of rigorous training, the passing out parade was held on November 22, 2017" he said.

My best moment came when I received Flag Officer Commanding in Chief (FOCINC) West Trophy by Vice Admiral SV Bhokare, AVSM, YSM, NM Commandant Indian Naval Academy for being the most promising Naval Cadet for my excellence in all spheres of training, he said.

My message to the youth is don't stop till you reach your goals. Youth should not run around looking for Government jobs as the jobs are very limited in these Islands. Try competing at all India level and make it a mission to accomplish it with full of dynamism.
