## Promoting & strengthening AYUSH systems of medicine

### 80% work for new State of the Art 50- bedded AYUSH Hospital at Junglighat completed; to be finished by Jan. 2021

#### To serve as referral Hospital benefitting entire populace of UT

Port Blair, Dec. 1

In order to promote AYUSH systems of medicine, the GoI has taken a number of steps and implemented many initiatives. To meet the increasing service need of the Islanders, particularly the in-patient care service, the A&N Administration has planned the construction of new State of the Art 50- bedded integrated AYUSH Hospital at Junglighat. The foundation stone of the project was laid by the Hon'ble PM during his visit to the Islands on 30th December, 2018. The civil work is being completed in two phases with the combined funding under NAM and UT Health Budget.



The Health Department and A & N State AYUSH Society is making efforts to complete the project at an early date, which will serve as a referral Hospital for AYUSH systems and thus not only benefit the populace of South Andaman District but also the

entire UT.

The triple-storied first phase building is having a provision of adequate space for Shatkarma (Yogic cleansing), Halls for Yoga practice, Central Medical Depot of Ayurveda & Homoeopathy, QMS Store, Admn. Block, Seminar Hall etc. The land and budget of Rs. 4.35 Crores has already been made available for the civil works of the first phase. More than 80 percent work has been completed and currently electrical work is under progress. The civil work is nearing completion and the building is likely to be handed over to AYUSH in January, 2021.

The second phase building has a provision for 50-bedded wards,

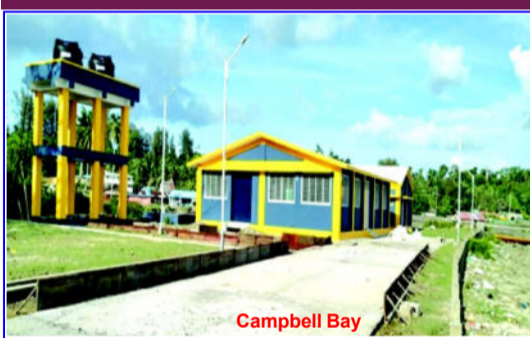

## Creation of fisheries infrastructure facilities

### 12 Fish Landing Centres constructed at different Islands; 5 more to come up soon

The A & N Administration has initiated major projects for creation of infrastructure facilities to increase fish production in the Islands and to promote the livelihood of the fishing community. To explore fishing potential of the area, Fish Landing Centers (FLCs) are being established in different Islands with a view to provide basic infrastructure for facilitating organized fishing / fish landing.

A Master Plan was prepared by the Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India during 2006 for Development of Fish Landing

Centers at 19 locations in A&N Islands. So far, out of 19 Fish Landing Centers, construction of 12 Fish Landing Centers have been completed. Out of these, 8 FLCs have been inaugurated and is being utilized by the fishermen. The FLCs put into operation are located at Junglighat, Diglipur, Mayabunder, Rangat, Yerrata, Gupatapara, Shaheed Dweep and Tee-Top, Car Nicobar.

Apart from this, four Fish Landing Centres at Panighat, Wandoor, Uttara (Kadamtala), Hut Bay (Little Andaman) have been completed. The construction work of 5 FLCs at Swaraj Dweep,

Betapur, Teressa, Katchal and Campbell Bay are in progress while the construction work for two FLCs one each at V K Pur, Little Andaman and Kamorta will be started soon.

The construction of Fish Landing Centers would not only help upgrade the existing environmental condition of the areas, but also improve the quality of life of the local population, particularly the poor fisher folks.

After the completion of the Fish Landing Centers, the fisher folk can land their fish catch in

### High-Tech Speed Laser Gun aiding Traffic Police in spotting speeding vehicles

#### 172 vehicles caught violating speed limit

The Traffic Unit of Andaman & Nicobar Police has been undertaking various initiatives to curb accidents and fatalities on roads. The latest in its endeavor is the introduction of High-Tech Speed Laser Gun on 27/10/2020 for detection of over speeding by the vehicles in the city as well as on NH-4.

Every year, many thrill seekers give away their lives in road accidents. They not only risk their own lives but also put others at risk. While technology has made our lives easier, the element of human error always looms over our heads posing danger. New cars and bikes are launched with engines that are more



sophisticated and with improved safety features but even then regularly come across news items detailing casualties due to road accidents. Many of these victim two-wheeler rider & pillion rider have been found not wearing helmets and also over-speeding.

To rein in the menace of over speeding/dangerous driving by vehicles, various drives have been conducted using these newly acquired High-Tech Speed Laser Guns in the accident prone areas like Girls School Road, Haddo

foreshore road, Sippighat, Chouldhari, Ograbraj, Tushnabad etc. and the Traffic Police has succeeded in imposing challans on 172 vehicles (115 two-wheelers and 57 four-wheelers), that were found over speeding. An amount of Rs. 1, 80, 000/- have been recovered as fine and their driving licenses have been seized and recommended for suspension for three months. Out of these, one car with speed of 93 Km/h on Sippighat main road stretch was caught with the highest speed so far. Apart from the above, 172 over-speeding vehicles, during this period, overall 4051 vehicles were also challaned for various offences and Rs. 23,00,000/- fine has been recovered from them.  
The Andaman & Nicobar Traffic Police is committed to ensure on-road safety and security of citizens of the Island and appeals to driver/ rider not to drive beyond the speed limits and follow the traffic rules. **BrahMos successfully test fired by Indian Navy**

BrahMos Supersonic Cruise Missile in Anti-Ship mode was successfully test fired today at 0900 hrs against a decommissioned Ship. The test firing was carried out by Indian Navy. The missile performed highly complex manoeuvres and hit Bull's eye of the target.  
BrahMos is the supersonic cruise missile jointly developed by DRDO and NPOM of Russia as a Brahmos Aerospace joint venture, which became Brahmos Aerospace Private Limited. The missile has established itself as a major force multiplier in modern-day complex battlefields with its impeccable anti-ship and land-attack capabilities with multi-role and multi-platform abilities and has been deployed in all the three wings of the Indian Armed Forces.

**ORDER No. 439**

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 10(2)(i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Union Home Secretary and Chairman, National Executive Committee (NEC) vide order dated 25.1.2020 has issued guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution, which will be in force up to 31.12.2020.

WHEREAS, the Chief Secretary, Andaman and Nicobar Administration in exercise of the powers conferred under section 24(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, has issued directions vide order No. CS/Sr.PS/05/2020 dated 30.11.2020 which will be applicable in whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands till 31.12.2020;

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of powers vested in the undersigned u/s 51(b) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and in order to enforce strict compliance of the National Directives on COVID-19 and contain the spread of COVID-19 in North and Middle Andaman District, I, Dr. Angel Bhati Chauhan, IAS, District Magistrate, North and Middle Andaman District, hereby direct the following: -

**COVID APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR**

1. Strict enforcement of wearing of face masks, hand hygiene and social distancing must be ensured.
2. Wearing of face masks is an essential preventive measure. In order to enforce this core requirement, imposition of appropriate fines, on persons not wearing face masks in public and work spaces.
3. Observance of social distancing in crowded places, especially in markets, weekly bazaars and public transport, is also critical for containing the spread of the infection. The SOP to be issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) to regulate crowds in market places, shall be strictly enforced by the Administration.
4. Concerned departments shall issue necessary guidelines for regulating travel in other modes of public transport, e.g., buses boats etc., and ensure that these are strictly complied with.
5. The National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in ANNEXURE-I, shall be strictly followed.

**SURVEILLANCE AND CONTAINMENT**

6. Effective live demarcation of Containment Zones, in vulnerable and high incidence areas, is key to breaking the chain or transmission and controlling the spread of the virus. Containment Zones shall be carefully demarcated at the micro level, taking into consideration the guidelines prescribed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) in this regard. The list of Containment Zones will be notified on the websites.
7. Within the demarcated Containment Zones, containment measures, as prescribed by MoHFW, shall be scrupulously followed as under:
  - i. Only essential activities shall be allowed in the Containment Zones.
  - ii. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services.
  - iii. There shall be intensive house-to-house surveillance by surveillance teams formed for the purpose.
  - iv. Testing shall be carried out as per prescribed protocol.
  - v. Listing of contacts shall be carried out in respect of all persons found positive, along with their tracking, identification, quarantine and follow up of contacts for 14 days (80% of contacts to be traced in 72 hours).
  - vi. Quick isolation of COVID-19 patients shall be ensured in treatment facilities/COVID Care Centres.
  - vii. Clinical interventions, as prescribed, shall be administered.
  - viii. Surveillance for ILI/SARI cases shall be carried out in health facilities or outreach mobile units or through fever clinics in buffer zones.
  - ix. Awareness shall be created in communities on COVID-19 appropriate behavior.
8. The local district and police authorities to ensure that the prescribed Containment measures are strictly followed.

**STRICT ADHERENCE TO THE PRESCRIBED SOPs.**

9. All activities have been permitted outside Containment Zones, except for the following which have been permitted with certain restrictions:
 

- i. Social/religious/sport s/entertainment/educational /cultural gatherings with up to a maximum of 50% of the hall capacity, with a ceiling of 200 persons in closed spaces; and keeping of the size of the ground/space in view, in open spaces.

Prior permission of the District Administration shall be obtained by the organizers/individuals for the above events. However, based on the assessment of the situation, the District Administration, if required, may reduce the ceiling up to 100 persons or less, in closed spaces.

10. SOPs have been prescribed for various activities. This include: schools; higher educational institutions; hotels and restaurants; shopping malls; entertainment parks; yoga centres and gymnasiums; assemblies and congregations, etc.
11. For case of reference, the list of activity wise SOPs with their web-links is given as Annexure-II.
12. The SOPs shall be strictly enforced by the authorities concerned, who shall be responsible for their strict observance.

**LOCAL RESTRICTIONS**

13. The District Administration based on assessment of the situation, may impose local restrictions, to contain the spread of COVID-19 such as night curfew. However, there shall not be any local lockdown outside the Containment Zones.
14. All departments need to enforce social distancing in offices. In case, the weekly positivity rate is more than 10%, the General Administration of the A & N Islands shall consider implementing staggered office timings and other suitable measures, with a view to reduce the number of employees attending office at the same time, thereby ensuring social distancing.
15. There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods.

**PROTECTION OF VULNERABLE PERSONS**

16. Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.

**USE OF AAROGYA SETU**

17. Aarogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk infection, and thus acts as a shield for individual and the community.
18. With a view to ensuring safety on offices and work places, employers on best efforts basis should ensure that Aarogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.
19. Organisations and business entities with 50 or more employees are encouraged to avail the Aarogya Setu openAPI Service (<https://openapi.aarogyasetu.gov.in>). OpenAPI feature will facilitate organisations and employees to return to work in a COVID-19 risk free environment.
20. Individuals are advised to install the Aarogya Setu application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

**MOVEMENT OF PASSENGERS**

(i) As per Deputy Commissioner South Andaman's Order No. 1327 dated 30th November 2020, all incoming passengers from mainland destined to Rangat Tehsil, will be compulsorily kept under Institutional quarantine, till they test Negative (-ve) for COVID-19 or for 7 days, whichever is earlier.

(ii) All Drivers and helpers of cargo vehicles/ persons requiring emergency movement on the ATR and moving towards North & Middle Andaman District shall also be tested first and allowed to move only if they test (-ve) for COVID-19. In compliance with the directions of the Tribal Welfare department and SOP issued by this for essential movement.

I. All the private office, workplaces, shops, markets, industrial & commercial establishment rendering services/activities like Nursing Homes, Private Clinics, Hospitals, Chemists/Pharmacies, Petrol Pumps/Fuel Depots, Hotel and Restaurants, ATMs in North and Middle Andaman District shall function from 0700 hrs to 2130 hrs. All establishments shall display a board or banner in a prominent place, showing the right way of wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands and cough etiquettes.

II. All the establishments shall ensure strict adherence of COVID-19 protocols like wearing of masks and maintenance of social distancing/2 Gz Ki Doori. It shall be sole responsibility of the owner/ in-charge of shop/business establishment to ensure strict compliance of National Directives on COVID-19 and SOPs failing which in addition to criminal proceedings, the shops/ business establishment shall be sealed for 14 days.

III. Any person violating the measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of IPC and provisions under section of 144 Cr.P.C. of 1973 will be used for the strict enforcement of social distancing and other legal provisions as applicable. They shall also be liable to pay fines as per the orders in force.

This order shall come into effect from 01/12/2020 and shall remain in force up to 31/12/2020.

Annexure I

**NATIONAL DIRECTIVES FOR COVID-19 MANAGEMENT**

1. **Face coverings:** Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places; in workplaces; and during transport.
  2. **Social distancing:** Individuals must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet (2 gaz ki doori) in public places. Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers.
  3. **Spitting in public places** will be punishable with fine, as may be prescribed by the State/ UT local authority in accordance with its laws, rules or regulations.
- Additional directives for Work Places**
4. **Work from home (WfH):** As far as possible the practice of WfH should be followed.
  5. **Staggering of work/ business hours** will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial & commercial establishments.
  6. **Screening & hygiene:** Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash or sanitizer will be made at all entry points and of hand wash or sanitizer at exit points and common areas.
  7. **Frequent sanitization** of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.
  8. **Social distancing:** All persons in charge of work places will ensure adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

9. SOPs have been prescribed for various activities. These include: schools, higher educational institutions; hotels and restaurants; shopping malls, multiplexes and entertainment parks; yoga centres and gymnasiums; assemblies and congregations, etc.
- 10.The SOPs shall be strictly enforced by the authorities concerned, who shall be responsible for their strict observance.

**Local restrictions**

11. The District Administration, based on assessment of the situation, may impose local restrictions, to contain the spread of COVID-19 such as night curfew. However, there shall not be any local lockdown outside the containment zones.
12. All departments need to enforce social distancing in offices. The District Administration may issue special directions to the offices in case the weekly positivity rate is more than 10% or if the conditions necessitate such restrictions.

13. There shall be no restrictions on inter-state and intra-state movement of persons and goods.  
**Protection of vulnerable persons**  
14. Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.  
**Use of Aarogya Setu**  
15. Aarogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk of infection and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community.  
16. With a view to ensuring safety in offices and workplaces, employers on best effort basis should ensure that Aarogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.  
17. Organizations and business entities with 50 or more employees are encouraged to avail the Aarogya Setu OpenAPI Service. OpenAPI feature will facilitate Organisations and employees to return to work in a COVID-19 risk free environment.  
18. Individuals and advised to install the Aarogya Setu application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.  
**Movement of passengers**  
19. All passengers arriving in Nicobar District shall compulsorily undergo home quarantine for a period of 10 days, except in such cases and under such conditions that are deemed necessary. Similarly, all persons arriving in Katchal, Teressa and Choura from Kamorta and in Little Nicobar from Great Nicobar, shall be placed in home quarantine for 10 days.  
20. All passengers destined for Katchal, Teressa, Choura and Little Nicobar from within the Nicobar district shall compulsorily undergo RT-PCR test, except in such cases and under such conditions that are deemed necessary.  
21. All outbound passengers from Nicobar District intending to travel by helicopter or ship services shall compulsorily undergo Rapid Antigen Test at a cost of Rs. 500 per head. The cost of test shall be borne by the passengers themselves except medical patients who are referred and Govt. Officers/ officials on duty.  
**Responsibility of Establishments**  
22. All the private office, workplaces, shops, markets, industrial and commercial establishments rendering services/ activities like Nursing Homes, Private Clinics, Hospitals, Chemists/ Pharmacies, Petrol Pumps/ Fuel Depots, Hotels and Restaurants, ATMs in Nicobar District shall function from 0700 hrs to 2100 hrs. All establishments shall display a board or banner in a prominent place, showing the right way or wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands, and cough etiquettes.  
23. All the establishments shall ensure strict adherence to the COVID-19 protocols like wearing of mask and maintenance of social distancing/ 2 Gaz Ki Doori. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/ in-charge of shop/ business establishment to ensure strict compliance of National Directives on COVID-19 and SOPs failing which in addition to criminal proceedings, the shops/ business establishment shall be sealed for 14 days.  
Any person violating the measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of the IPC and provisions under Section 144 of the CrPC, 1973 will be issued for the strict enforcement of social distancing and other legal provisions as applicable. They shall also be liable to pay fines as per the orders in force.  
This order shall come into effect from 01.12.2020 and shall remain in force up to 31.12.2020.
