President calls upon researchers to address climate change & work towards low-cost health care

Mohali, May 20
The President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, graced and addressed the 7th convocation of Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Mohali today (May 20, 2018) in Mohali, Punjab.

Speaking on the occasion, the President said that though a young institution, IISER is an extremely important centre of higher education and research in our country. This Institute has quickly become one of northern India's foremost destinations for students and faculty interested in the pursuit of scientific advance. It is well on its way to fulfilling its mandate of promoting and providing facilities for basic science research and integrating these with the needs of India and of our wider society.

The President said that today Mohali is a hub for



the knowledge economy, for Information Technology, biotechnology and bioinformatics and related fields. It is critical therefore that we see IISER as not just a standalone institution but as the fulcrum of an entire ecosystem. That is how this institution must grow and develop.

The President said that the purpose of scientific research is three-fold. First, science and technology must continue to play a role in nation building. As our nation evolves and as our society changes, our needs too are transformed. Yet, science and technology will always be required to find answers to developmental questions. Today, the questions before us range from battling climate change to provide low-cost but effective healthcare solutions. And from helping our farmers overcome productivity and water-scarcity challenges to building sustainable cities and houses that are socially inclusive and provide a life of dignity to the last family in the last mohalla. The IISER network must immerse itself in these tasks.

PM Modi to visit Russia for informal summit with President Putin

New Delhi, May 20
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will visit Russia' Sochi on Monday where he will hold an informal summit with Russian President Mr Vladimir Putin.

Russia's summer beach resort city Sochi is all set to welcome Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on Monday. After becoming Russia's president for the 4th time, Mr Vladimir Putin himself invited Prime Minister Shri Modi to visit Russia where both the leaders will hold informal talks.

The two leaders will review the entire gamut of bilateral relations. Since India and Russia are both victims of terrorism, the two sides will also discuss ISIS threat and the situation in Afghanistan and Syria. After hosting Winter Olympics in 2014, Sochi gained popularity worldwide and became one of the best tourist destinations in Russia. The resort city Sochi is ready



to add another chapter in the time tested friendship. In recent years, Sochi has become a diplomatic hub. Sochi is often called the unofficial 'Summer Capital' of Russia, or the Black Sea Pearl. This is the country's biggest and busiest summer sea resort, attracting more than four million visitors annually with its amazing mountainous coastline and endless shingle beaches similar to Indian climate. From May to September Sochi's population at least doubles with tourists, including celebrities and the political elite of the country. "This will be an important occasion for the two leaders to exchange views on international matters in a broad and long-term perspective with the objective of further strengthening our Special and Privileged Strategic partnership," the MEA said in a statement. It said both the leaders will also discuss their respective national developmental priorities and bilateral matters. "This informal Summit in Sochi between Prime Minister Shri Modi and President Mr Putin is in keeping with the tradition of regular consultations between India and Russia at the highest levels," the MEA said.

GST Council asks Centre & states to expedite setting up of appellate authorities

New Delhi, May 20
The GST Council has asked the Centre and States to expedite setting up of appellate authorities for aggrieved entities to appeal against orders of the Authority for Advance Rulings (AAR).

According to official sources, the Secretariat of the GST Council has issued letters to the states, Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) to nominate members to the AAAR on an urgent basis so that they can start functioning.

As per the State GST law, the appellate authority will



have two members, the Chief Commissioner of Central tax as designated by CBIC and the Commissioner of State tax. The appellate authority has been mandated to pass order within 90 days of the filing of appeal.

An official said, with AARs in different states started giving rulings since March, it has become imperative for the Centre as well as states to set up the Appellate Authority for Advance Ruling.

Tourism Ministry proposes lifting restrictions on foreigners visiting Northeast

New Delhi, May 20
The Tourism Ministry has proposed lifting restrictions on foreigners travelling to Arunachal Pradesh and parts of Sikkim, Minister Shri KJ Alphons has said.

Foreigners now need special permits such as a Protected Areas Permit (PAP) and Restricted Areas Permit (RAP) to be able to travel in these areas.

"The Ministry has proposed opening up the Northeast for tourists. In the last six months the government has opened up many restricted areas and if the plan in the Northeast works, then many more border areas can be opened up," Alphons told. The ministry proposed this

on May 17 at a meeting with senior Home Affairs and Defence Ministry officials.

India 6th wealthiest country with total wealth of 8,230 billion US dollars

New Delhi, May 20
India is the sixth wealthiest country in the world with a total wealth of 8,230 billion US dollars. According to the AfrAsia Bank Global Wealth Migration Review, the US is the wealthiest country in the world with a total wealth of 62,584 billion dollars. China stood at the second place with 24,803 billion dollars, while Japan is at the third place with 19,522 billion dollars.

Total wealth refers to the private wealth held by all the individuals living in each country. It includes all their assets less any

liabilities. Government funds are excluded from it. Larger countries have an advantage due to higher populations. Other countries in the top 10 wealthiest list include the UK, Germany, India, Australia, Canada, France and Italy. Factors that will help in wealth creation in India include, large number of entrepreneurs, good educational system, robust outlook for IT, business process outsourcing, real estate, healthcare and media sectors which will result in a 200 percent rise in wealth in 10 years.

Globally, the total private wealth held worldwide amounts to around 215 trillion US Dollars. There are about 5.84 lakh multi-millionaires in the world, each with net assets of 10 million dollars or more and 2,252 billionaires, each with net assets of 1 billion dollars or more. Global wealth is expected to rise by 50 percent over the next decade, reaching 321 trillion dollars by 2027. The fastest growing wealth markets are expected to be India, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, China, Mauritius, the report said.

Mary Kom-led India boxing teams to train in Italy, Ireland for Asian Games

Ireland, May 20
The legendary MC Mary Kom will lead a star-studded Indian women's boxing team's training stint in Italy as part of the preparations for the upcoming Asian Games. India's top boxers began their preparation for the Asiad in earnest, with the women's team leaving for Italy on Friday and the men's squad off for Ireland on Sunday. The Boxing Federation of India has drawn out a three-month calendar that will see its boxers get extensive training in foreign camps, besides participation in key tournaments to be battle ready for the big continental games. The women pugilists will be training at the elite Olympic Performance Training Centre, alongside top women boxers from Finland, Romania, Italy



and Montenegro who are already preparing there for the EUBC Women's European Boxing Championships. The squad is led by India's most accomplished boxer, Mary Kom (48 kg), with Monika (48 kg), Sarjubala Devi and Pinki Rani (both 51 kg), Meena Maisnam (54 kg). Also in the team are two-time Asian Championship silver medalist Sonia Lather and 2017 World Youth Champion

gold medalist Shashi Chopra in the 57 kg, Laishram Sarita Devi and Pavitra in the 60 kg, Simranjit Kaur (64 kg), Lovlina Boroghain and Pooja (69 kg) giving her company in the light to middle-weight categories. Former World Championship silver medalist Saweety Bora (75 kg), Asian Championship bronze medalist Seema Poonia (81 kg) and Lalafakmawii Ralte (+81 kg) will be fighting in the heavyweight categories.

Badminton World Federation decides against introduction of new scoring method

New Delhi, May 20
The Badminton World Federation has decided against using the new scoring system after several players and associations cited concerns over the proposed changes during the Annual General Meeting held on Saturday. Earlier, the BWF was inclined to use a system that was in favour of quicker matches but the proposal was dismissed during the AGM- attended by 189 member associations, a day before the Thomas and

Uber Cup. In a statement released on social media, the BWF wrote, "Badminton will continue to be played under the 3x21 scoring system." Accepting the decision, BWF president Poul-Erik Hoyer said, "Our membership has spoken and we respect its decision to retain three games to 21 points, though clearly our proposal resonated with a significant section of our membership." Supporting the decision world number one Viktor Axelsen said

that the new rules could disrupt the physically grueling aspect of competition and make it less interesting to watch. "I'm afraid we won't see that as much if we play to 11 points even though it's five sets. Also I know that some of the matches might be sort of boring to watch if there is too big of a difference in the level of players. I think that 21 points it's fine, I don't think it's a problem," the men's world champion added. "So I'd rather continue with how things are."

Rafael Nadal beats Novak Djokovic, sets up Zverev clash in Rome final

Rome, May 20
Rafael Nadal closed in on an eighth Rome Masters title as he dismissed old rival Novak Djokovic 7-6 (7/4) 6-3 to reach the final for a record-extending 10th time. The Spanish top seed will meet second-seeded holder Alexander Zverev, a 7-6 (15/13) 7-5 winner over Australian Open finalist Marin Cilic yesterday. His impressive win over Djokovic will give Nadal added confidence ahead of the French Open, where he has won a record 10 titles. Nadal, still unbeaten in semi-finals at the Foro Italico, unleashed a trademark clay-court attack after winning a tight first set lasting well over an hour in his 51st meeting with old rival Djokovic. "I need to be able to play my best tomorrow," Nadal said of his Sunday final. "I'm very happy with my game. It all worked for me, the tactics,



the shots." "To play against Novak you always have to play at the limit of your game with a high intensity and understand well the tactics you want to play." The 31-year-old world number two cut the deficit in his head-to-head series with Djokovic to 26-25 since they first faced off in 2006. But the Serb complained afterwards about poor scheduling which affected his preparation, playing a late-afternoon quarter-final on Friday before returning to court on yesterday mid-afternoon. "I don't want to

seem like I'm complaining about losing the match because of the schedule. But having to end at night and coming back to play early in the day affects a lot," he said. "Nobody has ever, ever reached me in my entire career to ask me about what I think would be the best scheduling. I don't think that is fair, we will address it in the next players' council." Djokovic has rediscovered his form this week after months of elbow injury problems, including an operation earlier this year.

India lose to France in Thomas Cup Final

Bangkok, May 20
Young Indian male shuttlers made a disastrous start to their campaign at the Thomas Cup Final as they suffered a 1-4 loss to France in a group A opening match to jeopardise their chances of qualifying for the knockout stage, here today. World no 18 B Sai Praneeth gave India a positive start, defeating France's Brice Leverdez 21-7 21-18 to take a 1-0 lead but none of the other

players could step up when it mattered. In the second match, world no 38 Arjun MR and Ramchandran Shlok wilted under pressure, losing 13-21 16-21 to Bastian Kersaudy and Julien Maio, ranked 47th. Swiss Open champion Sameer Verma, ranked 21, was then handed the responsibility of bringing India back in the contest but he went down 18-21 22-20 18-21 to Lucas Corvee, ranked 43rd, in the

second singles as France grabbed a 2-1 lead. World no 70 Arun George and Sanyam Shukla then took the field in the second doubles match but they were no match for 103 ranked Thom Gicquel and Ronan Labar, losing 10-21 12-21 in a 28-minute duel. Lakshya Sen then fought hard before losing 20-22 21-19 19-21 to Toma Junior Popov in the third singles. India will next face Australia tomorrow.

South Korea defeat India to lift 5th Women's Asian Champions Trophy

Donghae City, May 20
Defending Champions Indian Women's Hockey Team lost to hosts South Korea 0-1 in the Final match of the 5th Women's Asian Champions Trophy played here at the Sunrise Stadium on Sunday. The match saw South Korea keep a resolute defence and score the only goal of the match in the 24th minute when Youngsil Lee found the back of the net. India's defence was tested in the early stages of the match as South Korea started the game well, winning possession in the midfield and putting pressure on the Indian defence. However, India defended their lines well as they tried to attack the hosts on the counter in what was a well-matched first quarter for both the teams. South Korea had the better chances in the first period but the teams ended the first quarter goal-less as neither team managed to find



an opening. The second quarter saw the hosts put constant pressure on the Indians as they won three Penalty Corners in the span of two minutes, but Indian Goalkeeper Savita made sure that she made some reflex saves to deny the hosts of taking an important lead. It was a phase in the match where South Korea dominated as they looked for an opening and they succeeded in the 24th minute

when they caught India's defence on the counter-attack. Mi Hyun Park made a darting run towards the baseline on the right flank and passed the ball across the Indian goal, which was deflected into the back of the net by Youngsil Lee to give her team the lead. India struggled to build momentum after going behind as the hosts took their one-goal lead into the half-time break.

Rajinder Singh named Hockey India president

New Delhi, May 20
Rajinder Singh was on Saturday named president of Hockey India (HI), following Mariamma Koshy's resignation from the post. Singh will take charge as president from today, according to a media release. "We are happy to name Mr Rajinder Singh as the president of Hockey India from 19 May 2018 following the resignation of Ms. Mariamma Koshy. We wish Mr. Rajinder Singh the best in this new role," Hockey India Secretary General Mohd. Mushtaque Ahmad said. Koshy, a former State-level centre forward player, was



appointed the president of HI in November 2016 following Narinder Batra's decision to step down after being elected as the president of International Hockey Federation (FIH). "Ms Mariamma Koshy has contributed to Indian Hockey

over the last two decades and we are grateful for her services. She has been a guiding light for the Federation and also a big source of inspiration to many players and administrators alike. We wish her the best in her future endeavors," Ahmad said.

NASA's latest planet-hunting probe completes lunar flyby

Washington, May 20
NASA's latest planet-hunting satellite has successfully completed a lunar flyby, passing about 8,000 kilometres from the Moon, and beamed back a test image revealing more than 200 thousand stars. The flyby provided a gravity assist that helped the Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite (TESS) sail toward its final working orbit. As part of camera commissioning, the science team snapped a two-second test exposure using one of the four TESS cameras. The image,



centered on the southern constellation Centaurus, reveals more than 200,000 stars. Launched from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida on April 18, TESS is the next step in NASA's search for planets outside our solar system, known as exoplanets.

The mission will observe nearly the entire sky to monitor nearby, bright stars in search of transits, periodic dips in a star's brightness caused by a planet passing in front of the star. TESS is expected to find thousands of exoplanets.

have a symbiotic relationship with business and industry. Product invention and process innovation; converting the learning of the lab into commercially viable products; using technology to promote efficiency, enterprise and employment – there is so much science and commerce can do together. The combination of research institutions, technology start-ups incubated in campuses, and a knowledge-based business culture can be transformational. Silicon Valley in California and Bengaluru in India are examples of this. IISER must strive to play a similar role in Mohali and neighbouring cities. Third, the President said, institutions of scientific education and research are important in themselves for blue-sky innovation and for expanding the frontiers of knowledge. This is the fundamental and most critical value of scientific research. It is to keep alive the instinct of curiosity that is at the root of our civilisation. As the history of science tells us, this route requires patience. But it can lead to unexpected and dramatic leaps in human imagination. The President urged students of IISER to keep these three motivations in mind as they climb higher. He said that in their own way, these three motivations of science and research will help them to serve our fellow citizens, to serve our society and country, and to serve the larger cause of humanity.
