PM stresses on constant innovation & dynamic methods to deal with COVID-19 as virus continuously changes its form

New Delhi, May 20

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has stressed on constant innovation and adoption of dynamic methods and strategies to effectively deal with the challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic. He said, this virus is continuously changing its form and the scientists are working to deal with the mutant virus. The Prime Minister interacted with the District Officials of ten States on the Covid-19 situation today.

Prime Minister has said, amid the second



wave of coronavirus, mutant virus is posing a concern for the adult and children. He asked the State Administration and District Officials to prepare for this challenge by evaluating the data related to

seriousness of this infectious disease. He said, this will help in formulating the better strategies for the upcoming challenges. Highlighting the need to avoid wastage of Covid vaccine, Prime Minister said, wastage

of a single dose of vaccine means not being able to provide the necessary protective cover to one life. He said, the Government is continuously engaged in maintaining the supply of the vaccine. (Contd. on last page)

The left over beneficiaries (45+) have been requested to get themselves vaccinated. 665 doses of COVISHIELD vaccines were administered to the eligible beneficiaries by the health teams today (May 20), taking the total number of doses of vaccines administered so far to 1, 18,854. The district wise figure of administering of COVISHIELD doses to the eligible beneficiaries on May 20 by the Health Department states that in South Andaman, 379 persons above 18+ were administered the vaccine while in North & Middle Andaman District 276 persons and in Nicobar District, 10 were vaccinated, a press release from DHS said.

Forecast of onset of southwest monsoon in A&N Islands

Port Blair, May 20 India Meteorological Department, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India in a press release issued today stated that Southwest monsoon is very likely to advance over south Andaman Sea and adjoining southeast Bay of Bengal around 21st May, in association with the likely strengthening & deepening of south westerly winds over the region. Other atmospheric & oceanic conditions like conducive environment for convection, Sea surface temperatures are also remaining favourable for persistent cloudiness over Andaman Sea & adjoining areas of central & east central Bay of Bengal on 23rd May and it is very likely to increase Pressure area is very likely to form over North Andaman Sea and adjoining east central Bay of Bengal around 22nd May. It is very likely to intensify gradually into a Cyclonic Storm during the subsequent 72 hours. It is very likely to move north westwards and reach West Bengal - Odisha coasts around 26th May 2021.

During this period Squally Wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail over southeast Bay of Bengal & south Andaman Sea from 21st May onwards in association with the likely advance of southwest monsoon. The wind speed will reach 45-55 kmph gusting to 65 kmph is likely to prevail over Andaman Sea & adjoining east central Bay of Bengal on 23rd May and it is very likely to increase becoming 50-60 kmph gusting to 70 kmph from 23rd May and further becoming Gale wind speed during 24th - 26th May over major parts of central Bay of Bengal and into North Bay of Bengal and along & off Odisha - West Bengal - Bangladesh coasts during 25th - 27th May.

The Sea conditions will be rough to very rough over southeast Bay of Bengal & south Andaman Sea from 21st May onwards, into Central Bay of Bengal from 23rd - 25th May and into north Bay of Bengal along & off West Bengal - Odisha - Bangladesh coasts from 25th - 27th May and those who are out in the Deep Sea are advised to return to the coast by 23rd May, a press release from Directorate of Disaster Management said.

(Contd. from page 1) today (May 20) and during the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) conducted on these passengers, 1 person was found positive. He further informed that 79 persons were tested at Ferrargunj of which 3 persons were found positive.

About vaccination drive, the Secretary informed that it is continuing and today, 379 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated, in South Andaman, out of which 291 were of 18+ age and rest of them were above 45+ age.

The Secretary further urged the citizens to help Administration in its fight against COVID-19 by spotting persons violating COVID appropriate behaviour. The Secretary urged to click pictures of violators who are not wearing face masks, not following social distancing norms and inform through Whatsapp on A&N Police Helpline 3rd Eye mobile no. 9531892228 indicating the area and time of the violation sighted so that stringent action can be taken against the violators.

The Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De said that 15 new COVID patients were admitted today in G.B. Pant Hospital and 10 patients were discharged. With this, the number of corona positive patients in Hospital is 91. Out of the 91 patients, 75 are on Oxygen support and 3 are on ventilator.

The Deputy Director further said that altogether, 18 patients were admitted at COVID Care Centres, 1 patients was discharged and the number of patients in the COVID Care Centres is 48. He further informed that 1 covid patients was admitted and 1 patient was discharged from Covid Care Centre Wimberlygunj and a total of 9 patients are still admitted in the Centre, the he added.

Responding to a query regarding the chances of people recovering from COVID-19 can be afflicted by black fungus - or mucormycosis - disease, the Deputy Director said orders to procure medicines to treat mucormycosis has been placed and we will receive it very soon. As of now, no cases of mucormycosis has been reported in A&N Islands.

Port Blair, May 20 Firing practice will be conducted at Chinthe Long Range on May 24 & 29, 2021 and Baffle Range on May 27, 2021 from 9 am to 1 pm and 2 pm to 5 pm. All concerned have been warned to keep themselves and their vehicle/livestock away from the firing range during the above mentioned date and time, a press release received from District Magistrate, South Andaman said.

Monsoon Preparedness (For Cyclone, Heavy Rain, Water Logging etc.)

1. Listen to radio or TV weather reports for warning & advice and be alert.
2. Identify safe shelter in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest route to reach them.
3. All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised pucca house.
4. Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc. ready in waterproof bags. Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food covered.
5. Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate food grains and water in safe places.
6. If your area in flood-prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
7. Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
8. Raise furniture, clothing and valuable onto beds, tables and in attic in flood prone area.
9. Turn off the main electricity power supply. Do not use electrical appliance, which have been in flood water.
10. Do not get into water of unknown depth and current.
11. Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.
12. Do not venture into the sea if so advised. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house, if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
13. Remain indoors until advised that the cyclone has passed away.
14. In case of cyclone alert, do not go out, till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back. Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush.
15. Be careful of broken powers lines, damaged roads and house, fallen trees etc.
16. Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods,

Safety Tips on Monsoon Preparedness (For Cyclone, Heavy Rain, Water Logging, Flash Flood etc.)



- ✓ Listen to the radio (All India Radio stations give weather warnings).
- ✓ Keep monitoring the warnings. This will help you to prepare for a cyclone emergency.
- ✓ Pass on the information to others.
- ✓ Ignore rumours and do not spread them; this will help to avoid panic situations.
- ✓ Believe in the official information.
- ✓ When a cyclone alert is on for your area continue normal working but stay alert to the radio warnings.
- ✓ Remember that a cyclone alert means that the danger is within 24 hours. Stay alert.
- ✓ When your area is under cyclone warning get away from low-lying beaches or other low-lying areas close to the coast
- ✓ Leave early before your way to high ground or shelter gets flooded
- ✓ Do not delay and run the risk of being marooned
- ✓ If your house is securely built on high ground take shelter in the safer part of the house
- ✓ However, if asked to evacuate do not hesitate to leave the place.
- ✓ Board up glass windows or put storm shutters in place.
- ✓ Provide strong suitable support for outside doors.
- ✓ If you do not have wooden boards handy, paste paper strips on glasses to prevent splinters.
- ✓ However, this may not avoid breaking windows.
- ✓ Get extra food, which can be eaten without cooking. Store extra drinking water in suitably covered vessels.
- ✓ If you are to evacuate the house move your valuable articles to upper floors to minimize flood damage.
- ✓ Have hurricane lantern, torches or other emergency lights in working conditions and keep them handy.
- ✓ Small and loose things, which can fly in strong winds, should be stored safely in a room.
- ✓ Be sure that a window and door can be opened only on the side opposite to the one facing the wind.
- ✓ Make provision for children and adults requiring special diets.
- ✓ If the centre of the cyclone is passing directly over your house there will be a lull in the wind and rain lasting for half an hour or so. During this time do not go out; because immediately after that very strong winds will blow from the opposite direction.
- ✓ Switch off electrical mains in your house.
- ✓ Remain calm.
- ✓ Turn off gas and electric supply
- ✓ Secure door & windows during cyclone warning
- ✓ Trim branches hanging over your roof
- ✓ Don't take Shelter near tree & electric line
- ✓ Don't go for sightseeing

- ✗ Stay inside for atleast 30 minutes after you last hear thunder or see lightning.






