District Administration (SA) extends lockdown/restricted movement till July 27 with more relaxation

Shops selling essential & non-essential items to be open from 6 am to 8 pm by observing COVID appropriate behaviour. Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 6 am to 8 pm

Port Blair, July 20

In order to ensure measures of isolation and social distancing in South Andaman District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e., Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and

adherence to COVID appropriate behaviour to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Shri

Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C has ordered that lockdown/restricted movement shall continue to be in force in the entire District of South Andaman with effect from July 21 to 27, 2021.

The order issued by DM (SA) further states that shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm by observing COVID appropriate behaviour. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business

establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall be liable for action under DM Act.

Food Safety Deptt. of District Administration conducts surprise raids at Ferrargunj & Port Blair area

24 Food Business Operators found selling Gutkha, Pan Masala, Khaini and scented tinned tobacco

Port Blair, July 20

Continuing with the action in compliance of the District Magistrate Order to prohibit manufacture, storage, distribution and sale on all forms of processed/flavoured/scented chewing tobacco, whether going by the name of Gutkha, Pan Masala, Zarda packed and unpacked/loose etc. which contain tobacco or nicotine as an ingredient in the entire District of South Andaman, the Officials of Food Safety Department of District Administration conducted surprise raids in the last few days in and around



Ferrargunj & Port Blair area.

Altogether 133 Food Business premises were checked and out of which, 24 Food Business Operators were found selling Gutkha, Pan Masala, Khaini and scented

tinned tobacco containing tobacco or nicotine. The banned items were seized from their possession and punitive actions as deemed fit are being initiated against the violators.

Meanwhile, the District Magistrate, South Andaman District has again sternly warned all concerned to refrain from sale of tobacco products and also requested the general public to deter from

to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again and also to prevent any disturbances to the peace and tranquillity and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Dr. Angel Bhati Chauhan, District Magistrate, North & Middle

Andaman, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C has ordered that all shops and establishments are permitted to open from 6 am to 8 pm. They shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least 1 meter from a person and not allowing more than 3 persons at a time inside the premises.

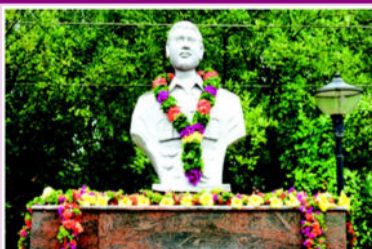
Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs.4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 10000/- for overcrowding in shops/establishments, along with sealing of shop for 14 days.

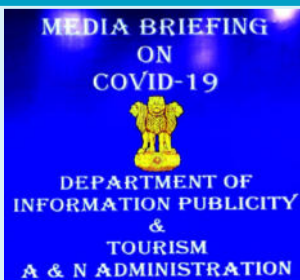

District Administration conducting random test through RAT in rural areas

109 persons tested at Brichgunj; all samples found negative



Port Blair, July 20
The District Administration, South Andaman has taken various preventive measures following the outbreak of the second wave of COVID. To track the disease in rural areas, the District Administration, is making the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT)- a pillar to track COVID in rural areas thereby making testing easier, faster and accessible to people. More than 100 random RAT tests are being conducted in rural areas on a daily basis. As part of this, the District Administration conducted mobile RAT screening at Brichgunj today. The random tests conducted on 109 persons, showed encouraging result as all the samples tested were found negative, a press release from DC (SA) said.

Vaccination drive in A&N Islands

2, 62, 687 eligible beneficiaries administered vaccine so far

Port Blair, July 20
The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands and as per data provided by Directorate of Health Services, a total of 2, 62, 687 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 4430 people were vaccinated today in Isles. 1916 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 427 were in



the age group of 18-44 years. In North & Middle Andaman District, 1479 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which 1171 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In Nicobar District, 1035 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 795 were in the age group of 18-44 years. As on date, a total of 70,929 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated in

It is once again reiterated that it is the responsibility of the concerned FPS Licensees to ensure that social distancing is maintained by the beneficiaries at the time of distribution. Further, all staff of the Licensee present at the shop have to wear face masks (compulsory) and gloves (preferable) at all times as well as ensure proper compliance of COVID appropriate Behaviour by the beneficiaries. No movement of men and material without valid movement pass/e-pass shall be allowed other than the time fixed for opening of shops between 6 am to 8 pm. Movement shall be allowed for emergency cases, medical emergencies, pregnant women and patients availing medical services. Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement permit issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Travel of persons who intend to proceed to their destinations at mainland after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/drop after 8 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis. Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Electricity, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 8 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

Movement of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of personnel involved in Private Security Services, Cable Services, Internet Service Providers, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, e-Commerce activities, Cold Storages, Godowns and Warehouses shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 8 pm. Movement of private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate. Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 8 pm only. e-Passes for operation of cargo movement after 8 pm needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate. Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 8 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 8 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of District Magistrate and e-Passes needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate.

Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 9 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 8 pm only, subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including Autos, Taxis and Jeeps in partial modification to this Office Order No.566 dt.23rd April 2021. Transportation of cargo shall also be permitted. SOPs in this regard issued by the Transport department should be strictly adhered to.

The e-passes issued by the Office of the District Magistrate to individuals for movement after 8 pm involved in various activities/services shall be revalidated on case to case basis. Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted till 8 pm. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (C, C1, B1, B2, B3 and B4 category) issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), South Andaman should be strictly adhered to. Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 6 am to 8 pm subject to strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person/organisation violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-. Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours.

No tribal passes will be issued for southern group of islands till further orders except for official purposes. All Religious places/ places of worship are allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm with only priest and two management staff to perform day to day rituals. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash or sanitizers will be mandatory. No devotees shall be allowed to enter the religious place. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.10,000/- payable by the Committee. Religious places/ places of worship in containment zones shall remain closed. Only those outside containment zones will be allowed to open up. e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which the application will be summarily rejected.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and fine shall also be imposed as per Order issued by this office from time to time. This order shall come into effect from 21st July, 2021 and shall remain in force till 27th July, 2021, the order to this effect issued by DM (SA) said.

Stand Up India Scheme extended up to the year 2025

New Delhi, July 20 (PIB)

Key Highlights:

- Stand Up India Scheme was launched by the Prime Minister on 05th April, 2016 and extended up to the year 2025.
- Stand Up India Scheme facilitates loans to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and women borrowers.
- A total of 1,16,266 loans amounting to Rs. 26204.49 crore extended under the Scheme since inception.
- Margin Money requirements for Scheme loans reduced in the Budget Speech for FY 2021-22
- Activities allied to agriculture included in the Scheme in the Budget Speech for FY 2021-22.

As informed by the Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance, the Stand Up India Scheme was launched by the Prime Minister on 05th April, 2016 and has been extended up to the year 2025. The objective of the Stand Up India Scheme is to facilitate loans from Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) of value between Rs. 10 lakh and Rs.1 Crore to at least one Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrower and one woman borrower per bank branch for setting up a green field enterprise in manufacturing, services or trading sector. As on 28.06.2021, a total of 1,16,266 loans amounting to Rs. 26204.49 crore have been extended under the Scheme since inception.

Pursuant to an announcement made by the Finance Minister in the Budget Speech for F.Y.2021-22, the margin money requirement for loans under the Scheme has been reduced from 'upto 25%' to 'upto 15%' and activities allied to agriculture have been included in the Scheme. Apart from this, no other change is contemplated in the scheme.

Government does not allocate funds for loans under the Stand Up India Scheme. Loans under the Scheme are extended by SCBs as per commercial parameters, Board approved policies of respective banks and extant RBI guidelines. An amount of Rs. 500 crore each was however released by Government in FY 2016-17 and FY 2017-18 and Rs 100 crore in FY 2020-21 towards the corpus of Credit Guarantee Fund for Stand Up India (CGFSI).

The Government has taken various steps towards effective implementation of the Scheme, these, inter alia, include provision for submission for online applications by potential borrowers through www.standupmitra.in portal, hand-holding support, intensive publicity campaign, simplified loan application form, Credit Guarantee Scheme, convergence with State and Central government Schemes wherever feasible, reduction in margin money and inclusion of activities allied to agriculture etc.

This information was given by Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment, Sushri Pratima Bhoumik in a written reply in Lok Sabha today.

No movement of public beyond these timings will be allowed except for:

Hospitals, medical labs, medicines and medical equipment, ambulance and hearse vehicle services, medical and its allied activities, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted. Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted. Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, Home Guards, Electricity, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments. Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in providing Broadcasting and Cable services, Internet service providers, all print and electronic media persons, private security services, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed for which valid passes shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate based on the certification from the concerned organisation.

Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 8 pm and beyond 8 pm subject to special permission of the District Magistrate. Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 9 pm on production of movement pass already issued by the District Magistrate. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 8 pm subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner/Incharge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the movement pass or using the same for the purposes other than it is meant for, the Owner/Incharge will be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.10,000/-, along with sealing of shop/establishment for 14 days and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. Public transport buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including autos/taxis and jeeps.

Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises (B1, B2, B3 and C category) shall be permitted till 08.00 PM. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licenced establishments shall be issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise) separately. Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 06.00 AM to 08.00 PM subject to strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person/organization violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 10,000/-.

Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. All Religious places/ places of worship are allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm with only priest and two management staff to perform day to day rituals. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash or sanitizers will be mandatory. No devotees shall be allowed to enter the religious place. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- payable by the Committee.

Religious places/ places of worship in containment zones shall remain closed. Only those outside containment zones will be allowed to open up. The movement passes issued by the District Administration from 22nd May, 2021 onwards shall remain valid.
