Creation of Health ID under National Digital Health Mission

Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor leads by example; appeals Islanders to create Health ID for themselves & family members

Port Blair, Sept. 21

The National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) was officially launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on 15th August, 2020 across six Union Territories including A&N Islands on a pilot basis. The National Health Authority, New Delhi is the Nodal Agency for implementation of NDHM. Health ID creation of all the citizens is one of the key building blocks under NDHM. Health ID under NDHM is free of cost, voluntary and consent based, that can be created using Aadhaar or mobile number along with basic information.

Leading by example, the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of A&N Islands, has created his Health ID. The Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor has appealed to all the Islanders to create Health ID for themselves and all their family members. During the last one month, about 5380 Health

IDs have been created in these Islands. At the National level, one lakh and twenty thousand unique Health IDs have been created across the six UTs in the last one month.

It is to mention that creation of Health ID will enable people to keep a track of their health data and share it only with verified doctors or health providers when needed after an informed consent. The Health ID is designed with highest standards of security and privacy and will enable inclusive access to all health services.

The Islanders can create their Health ID online by visiting the site <https://healthid.ndhm.gov.in/>. The Health ID can be created using Aadhaar number option or Mobile number to receive their OTP and filling up basic information which includes name, sex, date of birth and mobile number. The State Health Agency is the implementing agency for NDHM in these Islands. Parliament passes two Farm Bills Bills give freedom to farmers to sell produce anywhere in the country as per price determined between seller & buyers: Minister

Port Blair, Sept. 21

Parliament has passed the Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill 2020 and the Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill 2020 with Rajya Sabha approving it yesterday.

Speaking on the Bills, Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmer Welfare, Shri Narendra Singh Tomar said that the Government has taken several steps for doubling the income of farmers after the consultations with the farmers and States. He said, significant increases have been done in the MSP of the agricultural produce in the last six years. In addition, one lakh crore Agricultural Infrastructure Fund has been launched for the development of the farming



sector. Shri Tomar termed the legislations historic adding that they will bring revolutionary changes in the lives of the farmers. He said earlier the farmers were not free to sell their produce to any buyers and Agricultural

Immunity booster dose for cloven hoofed animals Deptt. of AH & VS to conduct 'ear tagging & mass vaccination prog.' for Foot and Mouth Disease from Sept. 28

Port Blair, Sept. 21

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services will undertake the 26th round of ear tagging and mass vaccination programme for Foot and Mouth Disease in all the cloven hoofed animals of South Andaman from Sept. 28, 2020. This vaccination is important for providing immunity against the selected strains of FMD virus which can cause significant production losses in the animals, along with ulcerations and high fever.

In some cases, the infected animals may abort. All the services involved in the



vaccination programme are available free of cost for the farmers. Farmers have been

Partial reopening of schools for classes 9 to 12 for taking guidance from teachers

Directorate of Education urges schools to strictly adhere to SOPs issued by MoHA

Port Blair, Sept 21

The Directorate of Education, A&N Administration has circulated the Unlock-4 Guidelines issued by Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI to all the Zonal Officers/DDOs/Principals/Head of Institutions of Govt. Schools/Private/Aided/Unaided/Local Body Schools for compliance in letter and spirit. As per the guidelines issued by MoHA, schools will continue to remain closed for students and regular class activity up to 30th September, 2020. However, online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged. 50% of teaching and non-teaching staff will be permitted to be called to the schools at a time for online teaching/tele-counselling and related work, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, w.e.f 21st September, 2020. Students of classes 9 to 12 may be permitted to visit their schools, in areas outside the Containment Zones only, on voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their teachers. This will be subject to written consent of their parents/guardians and will be permitted with effect from 21st September, 2020.

In a press release issued here today, the Directorate of Education has stated that the

SOP regarding partial reopening of schools for students of 9th to 12th classes on voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their teachers, issued by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GoI has also been endorsed to all the Zonal Officers/DDOs/Principals/Head of Institutions of Govt. Schools/Private/Aided/Unaided/Local Body Schools, for strict compliance.

Accordingly, all the schools in A&N Islands have already been directed to take necessary precautionary measures for partial reopening of schools for students of 9th to 12th classes on a voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their teachers w.e.f. 21st September, 2020, which are as follows:

- Use of face covers/masks mandatory.

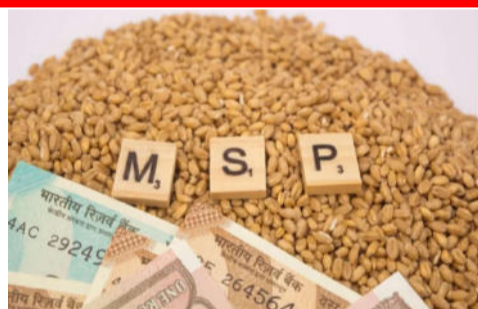

Govt. increases MSP of Rabi Crops including Wheat, Chana, Masoor, Mustard, Jowar, Safflower

New Delhi, Sept. 21
Government has increased the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of six Rabi Crops. Union Agriculture Minister, Shri Narendra Singh Tomar, in his statement made in Lok Sabha today informed that the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has cleared the hike in MSP of Rabi Crops including Wheat, Chana, Masoor, Mustard, Jowar and Safflower.



been hiked by Rs. 7 lakh crore to the 300. Mustard's MSP has been raised by Rs. 225 while the same for Chana has been hiked by Rs. 225. Increase in Jowar's MSP is by Rs. 75 while the same for Safflower has been hiked by Rs. 112 per quintal. Shri Tomar informed that the Government has sanctioned nearly Rs. 7 lakh crore to farmers for the procurements in the last 6 years. The Minister said, the hike in MSP reflects the Government's commitment to guarantee MSP and procurement in the country. (Source:india.gov.in)

MoRTH waives permit requirement for Transport Vehicles carrying Oxygen

New Delhi, Sept. 21(PIB)
The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has exempted the transport vehicles operators for the carriage and transportation and delivery of Oxygen Cylinders or Oxygen Tanks across the States or within a State from permit requirements till 31st March, 2021. This has been done as oxygen is an important item required for the treatment of COVID-19. It had been brought to the notice of the Ministry that there are problems being faced by certain Transport Vehicles operators in

this regard. The Ministry has, thus, issued a Notification, number SO 3204 (E) dated 21st September, 2020 for exemption of Permit requirements for these vehicles as required under Section 66 of the Motor Vehicles Act 1988. This step is likely to ensure smooth movement ensuring supply of oxygen across the country.

The dead body of the deceased is chemically preserved for identification. - Installation & use of Aarogya Setu App advised, wherever feasible.
- Entrance to have mandatory hand hygiene (sanitizer dispenser) and thermal screening provisions. Multiple gates/separate gates, if feasible, should be used for entry and exit.
- Seating arrangement to be made, ensuring a distance of 6 feet between chairs, desks etc.
- Staggering of guidance to be done, with separate timing slots, for adequate physical distancing and disinfection of classroom premises.
- The teaching faculty to ensure that they themselves and students wear faces masks throughout the conduct of the teaching/guidance activities.
- Cafeteria/mess facility, if any within the premises, to remain closed.
- Cleaning and regular disinfection (using 1% sodium hypochlorite) of frequently touched surfaces (door knobs, elevator buttons, hand rails, chairs, benches, washroom fixtures, etc.) to be made mandatory in all classrooms, laboratories, lockers, parking areas, other common areas etc. before beginning of classes and at the end of the day.
- Students and employee to be advised to dispose of used face covers/masks in separate covered bins placed in classrooms, work stations and other common areas.
- Awareness should be created among students to avoid gathering when leaving the school and during their free time.

Produce Market Committees, APMC are not functioning in a transparent manner. The Minister said, these Bills give the freedom to the farmers to sell their produce anywhere in the country as per the price determined between the seller and buyers. He said, these Bills will ensure better prices for the farmers' produce. The two Bills aim at increasing the availability of buyers for farmers' produce by allowing them to trade freely without any license or stock limit resulting in better prices for their produce. They will replace two ordinances promulgated by the Central Government in June this year. The Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill allows Intra-State and Inter-State trade of farmers' produce beyond the physical premises of APMC markets. As per the Bill, State Governments are prohibited from levying any market fee, cess or levy outside APMC areas. The Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill creates a framework for contract farming through an agreement between a farmer and a buyer prior to the production of any farm produce.

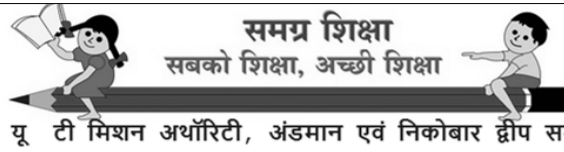
