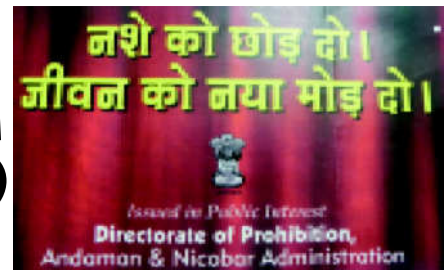

New Delhi, Feb 21

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said that India's oral tradition has evolved constantly to adapt to changing times and circumstances keeping the eternal values intact. He said false perception was created about India that India needed social, political and economic reforms initiated by

outsiders.

Prime Minister was delivering the inaugural address via video conferencing at Sri Ramakrishna Vachanamrita Satram, Sri Ramakrishna Ashram, Tiruvalla in Kerala today. Shri Modi said India's soil is that soil from where change has always originated and our civilization stands tall,

overcoming obstacle. The Prime Minister said to reach the common people there was a need to make Dharma or right living more accessible and closure to their daily lives.

He said bhakti saints used music, poetry and local languages to bring God closer to people and they broke barriers of caste, class, religion and gender.

India & Rwanda sign MoUs in innovation, aviation and visa requirements

Kigali, Feb 21

India and Rwanda have inked agreements in the fields of innovation, aviation and visa requirements. The agreements were signed in Kigali yesterday in the presence of Vice President Shri Mohammed Hamid Ansari and Rwandan Prime Minister Mr Anastase Murekezi during a business forum meet. Shri Ansari, who is in Rwanda on the first leg of his 2-nation visit to East Africa, also launched a India-Rwanda innovation growth programme. The three important agreements signed by India

and Rwanda are bilateral air service agreement between two countries, an establishment of an Entrepreneurship Development Centre in Rwanda duly financed by Government of India and an agreement for exemption of visa requirements for diplomatic and service passports. Earlier on the day, Vice President has met President of Rwanda and shared views of mutual benefits. He also met President of the Senate of Rwanda and presented him a copy of Indian Constitution.

Stent manufacturers assure Govt to maintain supply

New Delhi, Feb 21

Stent manufacturers have assured the government that the supply of the medical device will be maintained and no shortage will be allowed. The government held a meeting with the stent makers and importers to review its availability in market in New Delhi yesterday. The meeting came in the backdrop of reports about artificial scarcity of stents in the garb of withdrawing the device for price relabeling. An official in the Department of Pharmaceuticals said, it was decided that a

separate meeting with associations and bodies of hospitals will be called with the assistance of Health Secretary to sensitise the hospitals also if required. There are reports about shortages of stents in hospitals after the government reduced their prices by up to 85 per cent by capping rates of bare metal stents at 7,260 rupees and drug-eluting ones at 29,600 rupees on 13th of this month.

Towards a 'cashless' Nicobar

First POS machine installed; more merchants & shopkeepers place orders with SBI

Port Blair, Feb 21

As part of the campaign of the Nicobar District Administration to make Nicobar Cashless, the first POS machine was installed at AC Enterprises, HQ area, Car Nicobar. The Proprietor Shri Ganesh has informed that transaction amounting to one lakh rupees has already been done since the installation. At present, on average, 35 to 40 transactions take place on a daily basis through the machine.

In addition to the POS machine, Shri Ganesh



has also set up a Pay TM QR code for the customers willing to go for mobile internet based Pay TM wallet transaction. However, due to

intermittent mobile connectivity in the Islands, people are more inclined towards POS machines rather than Pay TM.

Drawing inspiration from

the business strategies of Shri Ganesh, more merchants are coming forward for installation of these machines and accordingly, have placed their requests with the State Bank of India, Car Nicobar. It is expected that by the end of the current Financial Year, majority of the shopkeepers and merchants of Car Nicobar will possess the POS machines which will truly benefit the people of the Islands. All these have been possible through persistent efforts of the Deputy Commissioner (Nicobar).

New Delhi, Feb 21 Minister of State (I/C) for Youth Affairs & Sports Shri Vijay Goel here today felicitated the Indian Cricket Team on winning T-20 World Cup Cricket for the Blind 2017 at a function held at his residence. Indian Team won the World Cup after defeating Pakistan in the finals at Bengaluru on 12 February 2017. Speaking on the occasion Shri Goel said after success of Para Athletes at Rio

Paralympics 2016, Indian team for Blind Cricket has added another chapter of glory in history of Indian Sports by retaining T 20 World Cup. He said government is committed for the promotion of sports in the country. He said his Ministry will consider granting recognition to CABI as sports federation. Shri Goel also said that there is no misunderstanding in the prize money given to the winning

team of 2017 World Cup Cricket for the Blind and the Ministry will follow the same practice for cash prize which was adopted in 2012 when Indian Team won the 1st T20 World Cup for Blind cricket. Shri Vijay Goel gave a warm send off to the team for their campaign in 2017 at New Delhi and he has already approved an assistance of rupees 30 lakh to Cricket Association for the Blind in India (CABI).

India women clinch thrilling win in World Cup Qualifiers Final

Colombo, Feb 21 India women beat South Africa by a solitary wicket and needed the last ball of the 50 overs to clinch the victory over South Africa in the final of the Women's World Cup. Thanks to Harmanpreet Kaur's six and a double in the last over, the Indian women took home the win after needing nine runs from the final over. Both India and South Africa were already assured of places in the ICC Women's World Cup 2017 with a round to go in the Super Six stage of the tournament. India to exemplify their win have remained unbeaten throughout the tournament while South Africa have lost only once - to India. In the final, South Africa, batting first, scored 244 when batting

first with India grabbing the win thanks to Kaur's heroics in the end to not be phased by pressure. For South Africa, there was no outright high run scorer with everyone chipping in with scores in 30's and 40's but it was M du Preez top-scoring with 40 runs from 72 balls. Rajeshwari Gayakwad picked up three wickets for India to finish with 3/51 from 9 overs. Shikha Pandey took two wickets. In reply, Mona Meshram scored a half century at the top of the order (59 runs from 82 balls) with Deepti Sharma top scoring with 71 runs from 89 balls. At one stage, India looked to be cruising to victory with 209/4 after 43 overs. But then India

lost four wickets in the matter of 14 runs from two overs to throw away the advantage and draw unnecessary pressure at the death. However, Harmanpreet persisted in the final over despite Poonam Yadav falling late on. But it was the six over deep midwicket on the fifth ball of the over and then a double on the last ball that sealed the deal. The celebrations said how much it meant to the team with Kaur hoisting her bat up in the air and then went on to hug her teammates in delirious celebrations. Sri Lanka and Pakistan are the other teams to have qualified for this tournament to join Australia, England, New Zealand and the West Indies for the World Cup.

Special drive against illicit trafficking of alcohol; 88 bottles seized, 5 arrested
