## PM lays foundation stone for Dr. Ambedkar National Memorial; delivers Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture

New Delhi, Mar 21  
 The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, today laid the foundation stone for the Dr. Ambedkar National Memorial, to be built at 26, Alipur Road in Delhi, the place of Mahaparivran of Dr. Ambedkar.  
 The plaque for the foundation stone was unveiled by the Prime Minister at Vigyan Bhawan. Later, delivering the sixth Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture, the Prime Minister categorically asserted that no changes will be made to the Union Government's reservation policy, so as to deprive the weaker sections of society, of their existing entitlements. He strongly condemned those who he said were spreading lies and misinformation in this regard. He recalled that such misinformation had been spread even when



Shri Vajpayee was the Prime Minister. Recalling the contributions of Dr. Ambedkar, the Prime Minister said that the Dr. Ambedkar National Memorial would soon become one of the iconic buildings of Delhi, and declared that he would himself inaugurate it on Babasaheb's birthday - April 14th - in 2018. The Prime Minister explained that five places were being developed as "Panchteerth" in honour of Dr. Ambedkar. These included his birthplace in Mhow, the place in London where he stayed while studying in the UK, Deeksha Bhoomi in Nagpur, Mahaparivran Sthal in Delhi, and Chaitya Bhoomi in Mumbai. In addition, the Prime Minister also referred to the building for the Dr. Ambedkar Foundation

being built at Janpath in New Delhi. Describing Dr. Ambedkar's contributions for the nation, he said that while Sardar Patel had united the country politically, Dr. Ambedkar had united it socially through the Constitution. He recalled how Dr. Ambedkar had advocated equal rights for women, even in an era where this idea faced stiff political opposition. He said that it is an injustice to Dr. Ambedkar to limit his contributions to just the Dalits, or even just

At present 121 CBNAAT machine are functioning and five hundred more such machines were launched today. He said, the new diagnostic machine is a revolutionary rapid

molecular test which detects Mycobacterium tuberculosis and rifampicin drug resistance, simultaneously. The Minister said, this test is fully automated and provides results within two hours. Djokovic, Azarenka roll to easy title wins at Indian Wells



Indian Wells, Mar 21  
Novak Djokovic rolled past Milos Raonic 6-2, 6-0 to win the BNP Paribas Open for a record fifth time, while improving to 22-1 in matches this year. It was the Serb's third consecutive title in the California desert, breaking a tie with four-time

champion Roger Federer, who lost to Djokovic the past two years in the final and skipped this year because of a knee injury. The women's final was equally one-sided. Victoria Azarenka defeated error-prone Serena Williams 6-4, 6-4, returning Azarenka to the world's top 10 for the first time since August 2014.

Djokovic needed an hour and 17 minutes to dispatch Raonic, whose big serve got broken five times. The 25-year-old Canadian served just four aces and had 27 unforced errors. His first serve averaged 128 mph, much faster than Djokovic's 111 mph — but he connected on only 55 percent. The Serb landed 68 percent of his first serves and was never broken.

Indian boxers head to China for Olympic qualifiers

New Delhi, Mar 21

Determined to keep the Olympic dream alive despite the long-standing administrative mess, a spirited Indian boxing team, featuring the likes of M.C. Mary Kom and Shiva Thapa, will take off on Monday night for the Asian Qualifiers in Qian'an City, China. Ten men and three women from the 13-strong team which will be in action from March 25. In the men's competition, only the top three boxers in each weight category will make the Olympic cut with the third spot decided via a box-off between the two bronze-medallists. In the women's draw, only the gold and silver medal winners will qualify for Rio de Janeiro. In the absence of a recognised federation, the Indians will once again compete under the flag of the International Boxing Association (AIBA). "It is going to be a very tough tournament because not many from the Asian region qualified during



last year's World Championships. I am expecting around 30 countries and more than 250 boxers to be there at this event," national coach Gurbax Singh Sandhu told PTI ahead of the team's departure. None of the Indian boxers have so far qualified for the Olympics. During last year's World Championships, Shiva (56kg) won a rare bronze medal for the country but could not seal an Olympic ticket owing to his loss in

the quota box-off. It is not going to be any easier at the continental qualifiers either. "If you start thinking about the difficulties, you only make it tough for yourself. So it's better to focus on what one actually can do. We have trained hard just the way we do before any big event and hopefully, we shall deliver," said Shiva, who recently won a gold medal at the South Asian Games in Guwahati.

Similarly, the vision for providing electricity to all unconnected villages, which the Union Government has promised by 2018, is also a step towards fulfilling Dr. Ambedkar's vision, the Prime Minister said. The Prime Minister recalled his recent meetings and interactions with Dalit Entrepreneurs, and the suggestions made by them. He said all these suggestions had been implemented by the Union Government in the recent Union Budget. The Prime Minister said that the National Agriculture Market, an e-platform for farmers to get the best possible price for their produce, would be launched on 14th April this year.

- Only one ticket will be issued per applicant. But in case of family, a maximum of 4 tickets will be issued per application.

- For all tickets booked through CSCs, the passenger will have to pay service charges to the CSC @ Rs 50/- (Rupees fifty only) per passenger.

- The Passengers to approach the CSC centres from the day of opening of booking window. Based on availability of tickets, CSC operator will obtain the details of the Passengers and issue a confirmation slip to passenger and also a SMS alert with confirmation number.

- The confirmed passengers by the CSC have to make payment within 24 hours by visiting any one of the following offices (1) Inter Island helicopter terminal, Port Blair (2) Deputy Commissioner, North & Middle Andaman (3) Deputy Commissioner, Nicobar (4) Asst. Director, Shipping Services, Chennai (5) Deputy Resident Commissioner, A&N Bhavan, Salt Lake, Calcutta.

- On receipt of formal Tickets from Air India, it will be delivered to individual passenger by the concerned booking office.

- No refund will be allowed for cancellation of ticket (s), if there is no demand for the cancelled seat and it goes unoccupied due to cancellation. However, 20% cancellation charges will be recovered otherwise.

Similarly, the chartered flight tickets between Kolkata - Port Blair - Kolkata sector shall also commence through the CSCs shortly, a communication from the Dy. Director, Civil Aviation said here today.
