Govt increases reservation from 3 to 5% for admission to PG medical courses for persons with disabilities

New Delhi, Mar 21
Government has granted approval to amend the regulation for admission to PG medical courses in order to expand the scope of persons with disabilities getting benefits of reservation. The percentage of seats to be filled up by persons with disabilities has been increased from 3 percent to 5 percent in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. Commenting on the decision, Health Minister Shri JP Nadda said, the government



has taken a historical decision for welfare of divyangs in line with the Prime Minister's vision of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'. He said, this will ensure that the Persons with Disabilities are equal contributors to the progress of the nation. MP urges for conducting Railway Recruitment Examination at Port Blair

Port Blair, Mar 21
The Member of Parliament, A&N Islands, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, has submitted a letter to Railway Ministry on 20th March, 2018 with the submission that the UT of A&N Islands is a remote area and most of the eligible aspiring candidates belong to economically weaker section and face financial constraint even for maintaining their livelihood. So, attending recruitment examination by the eligible candidates of this UT Islands at mainland is not only a matter of travelling long distance by ship, but also a matter of huge expenses towards travel and stay at mainland. Shri Ray in his letter further added that earlier there was Railway Recruitment Examination Centre at Port Blair which has been discontinued since past several years. Consequently, the aspiring

candidates who are from the economically weaker section of A&N Islands are deprived due to non availability of Railway Recruitment Centre at Port Blair. Recently, the Railway Department has notified large number of vacancies.

Considering the bottleneck situation of the Islanders, Shri Ray has requested the Railway Minister to conduct Railway Recruitment Examination in Port Blair also for the benefit of Islanders, a communication from MP's Office said.

India women take on Australia in T20 tri-series opener

Mumbai, Mar 21
Whitewashed by Australia in the three-match ODI rubber, the Indian women cricketers would be hoping for a reversal of fortunes when they clash with the same rivals in the lung-opener of the T20 tri-series starting here on Thursday. England is the third team to figure in the tournament in which all matches will be played at the Cricket Club of India's Brabourne Stadium. The Indian women's team would take confidence from their 3-1 win against South Africa in the five-match T20 series held in the Rainbow Nation. But having surrendered the ODI series rather tamely to Australia, it will be an uphill ask for the Harmanpreet Kaur-led side to face the same opponents, although the format is different. With back-to-back half centuries, Smriti Mandhana was the top run-getter for Indian women during the ODI series against Australia and she would look to continue her good run. Among others, the batting would depend largely on the



experienced duo of Kaur and Mithali Raj and the two players would need to fire big against a strong Australian pace attack. India women also possess other good batswomen like Veda Krishnamurthy and all-rounder Pooja Vastrakar, who scored a crucial 51 in the first ODI. Young Mumbai girl Jemimah Rodrigues too showed her skills when she scored a racy 42 after being asked to open the innings in third ODI. With experienced Jhulan Goswami back in the mix, it the seam attack looks more or less settled as Shikha Pandey would look to share the burden after taking five wickets during the ODI series. **Teams (from):**

Lewis Hamilton, Sebastian Vettel kick off race for fifth title in Melbourne

Melbourne, Mar 21
The first instalment of what Formula One fans hope will be a genuine season-long tussle kicks off on Sunday as four-times champions Lewis Hamilton and Sebastian Vettel lock horns at the season-opening Australian Grand Prix.

This year marks the first that two quadruple champions are competing in the same season and their battle to see who joins Argentine legend Juan Manuel Fangio in second place on the all-time list with five titles promises to light up the series. Michael Schumacher leads the

way on seven world titles. Hamilton emerged well on top for Mercedes at the end of 2017 after Ferrari's Vettel made the early running, but their rivalry added plenty of spice, the pair banging wheels on the track in Azerbaijan and exchanging threats off it.

Islands. He underlined the need to sensitize all the stakeholders about search and rescue operation and the need to involve airliners in such exercise.

Inspector General K R Suresh briefed the scribes about the significance of the exercise and said that these Islands are surrounded by ocean and a large number of flights and ships cross the territory daily. Therefore we need to remain alert and respond to those in distress at sea, he said adding that the exercise was a simulation of a real time search and rescue operation.

The exercise was planned to evaluate the preparedness for Search & Rescue Response for ditched civil aircraft off Port Blair. The support and cooperation provided by all stakeholders, is indicative of the resolve and firmness in such scenario.

The exercise evolutions included mobilisation of ships & aircraft of all resource agencies in Andaman Region, exercising reporting procedures, testing of distress communication links, deployment of CG Dornier for real-time reporting of situation and dropping of life raft thereafter. The exercise at sea was focussed on mass rescue techniques, wherein the modules included; fire fighting, rescue of survivors by helicopters, rescue by life rafts & scramble nets, mass rescue by boats & divers and also evacuation of critical injured on stretcher by helicopters.

Representatives from the resource agencies, stakeholders and A&N Administration as observers embarked Coast Guard Ship 'Sujay' for witnessing the exercise at sea. Correspondents from electronic and print media also witnessed the exercise.

Indian Coast Guard along with 29 stakeholders is responsible for marine search and rescue in the Indian search and Rescue Region over Indian Ocean. The Force has drawn up a Regional level SAR plan in tune with National SAR plan. A robust National Search And Rescue System for dealing with any contingency at sea is critical for trade and economical growth of the Nation. The Great Channel between the Nicobar Islands and Northern Sumatra that leads into the Malacca Straits is the Marine Drive of the high seas. Almost 220 ships cross the 160-km wide Straits daily making it among the busiest sea routes of the world and is highly venerable to accidents. Besides traffic through six degree channel, ten degree and coco channel also see significant daily traffic of large merchant vessels passing through. Safety of life and property at sea is thus important to enhance confidence in mariners, and thus ensuring continuous economic activities. Also, a large air traffic transits overhead Andaman sea amounting to over 800 aircraft criss-crossing on a daily basis.

This Regional Level SAR exercise was part of the regional efforts to validate and improvise the recently formulated MSAR plan for the A&N Region. Therefore, participation of all stake holders during such SAR exercise is appreciated to analyse the operations and will help in plugging any leakages that could cost precious lives during actual operations.

Certificates were also distributed to the winners of various events conducted by the club. The programme was attended by students and faculty members of different Departments, a communication said.

Yuki qualifies for Miami Masters

Miami, Mar 21
Yuki Bhambri made it to the Miami Masters, his second consecutive ATP 1000 series main draw, following a 7-5 6-2 win over Sweden's Elias Ymer in the second and final qualifying round. It was second meeting between the 25-year-old Indian and world number 133 Ymer, who had beaten Yuki in the first clash in 2015 at Aptos. The Indian Davis Cupper had qualified for the Indian Wells Masters and had shokked world number 12 Lucas Pouille in the second round. In his first round, Yuki has drawn Lucky Loser Mirza Basic, the world number 75



from Bosnia. It will be second between the two players with Basic emerging winner in 2016 at the Sofia event. If Yuki crosses first hurdle, he will run into world number 11 and eighth seed American Jack Sock. Yuki, of late, has created excellent results against top players. Yuki is lone Indian in the singles draw with Ramkumar Ramanathan. In the doubles, Rohan Bopanna and his Edouard Vasselin have been pitted against Adrian Mannarino and Daniil Medvedev.

Teenager Amanda Anisimova stuns Wang Qiang in Miami Open

Miami, Mar 21
American teenager Amanda Anisimova, fresh off an impressive run at Indian Wells, beat China's Wang Qiang 6-3 1-6 6-2 at the Miami Open on Tuesday to set up a second round clash with Spanish third seed Garbine Muguruza. The 16-year-old wild card, who had never won a WTA main-draw match until this month's BNP Paribas Open where she reached the fourth round, broke the world number



53 five times during a 98-minute match in which she committed six double faults. Next up for Anisimova, ranked 130th in the world, is Wimbledon champion Muguruza, who will be eager to get back to competition after falling at the first hurdle in Indian Wells.

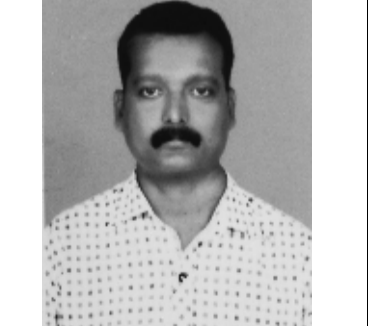

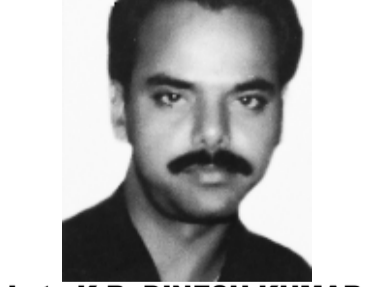
