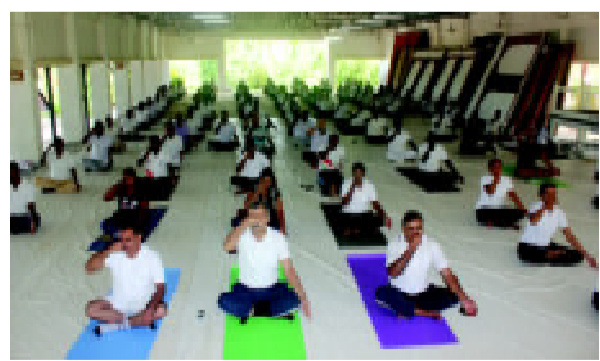

**Rani Rampal to lead India at women's Hockey World League Semi-Final**

New Delhi, June 21  
Striker Rani Rampal will lead an 18-member Indian women's team at the Hockey World League Semi-Final to begin on July 8 in Johannesburg. Defender Sushila Chanu Pukhrambam has been named as Rani's deputy for the tournament. The team features an experienced line-up with Deep Grace Ekka, Sunita Lakra, Monika, Sushila and Gurjit Kaur forming a part of the defensive line. The team has two goalkeepers -- Savita and Rajani Etimaru while the midfield consists of Ritu Rani, Lilima Minz, Navjot Kaur, Renuka Yadav, Nikki Pradhan and Namita Toppo. The forwardline features Rani, Vandana Katariya, Preeti Dubey, Anupa Barla and Reena Khokhar. Though the Indian eves suffered a 0-5 loss in their previous tour in New Zealand where they played the hosts in a five-match Series, they will aim for better results at the Hockey World League Semi-Final (Women) which also



happens to be a qualifying tournament for the 2018 Women's World Cup in London. "While our first aim is to do well in the pool stage and do well against opponents like South Africa and Argentina, our big target is to qualify for the World Cup next year. Though the qualifying criteria is top five teams, since England are the hosts, our criteria will be to finish in top 6 to qualify for the World Cup," said chief coach Sjoerd Marijne. India are grouped in Pool B along with strong opponents Argentina, South Africa, Chile and USA. The event will also see participation from Germany,

**India wants to host 2032 Olympics, 2030 Asian Games: IOA chief**

Mumbai, June 21  
India's Olympic Association has asked the government for permission to bid for the 2032 Olympics and 2030 Asian Games as part of a drive to put the country at the heart of the international sporting community, IOA President N Ramachandran said. Ramachandran said the IOA also wanted India to host the

Asian Beach Games in 2020, the Olympic Council of Asia's general assembly that year, and the International Olympic Committee session in 2021. The aim, Ramachandran said, was to use the engagement as a catalyst for the growth of Olympic sports in India and to help improve the country's miserable standing in pretty much every sport apart from

cricket. As the world's second-most populous nation after China, Ramachandran said it was time for India to follow its powerful neighbour in showcasing its burgeoning economic muscle through sport.

**Anil Kumble steps down as India head coach**

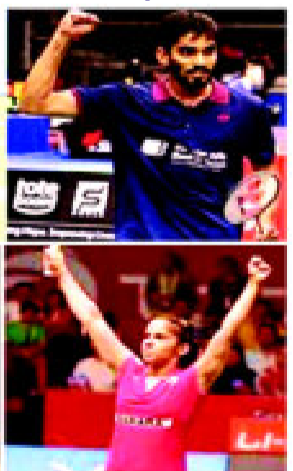
New Delhi, June 21
