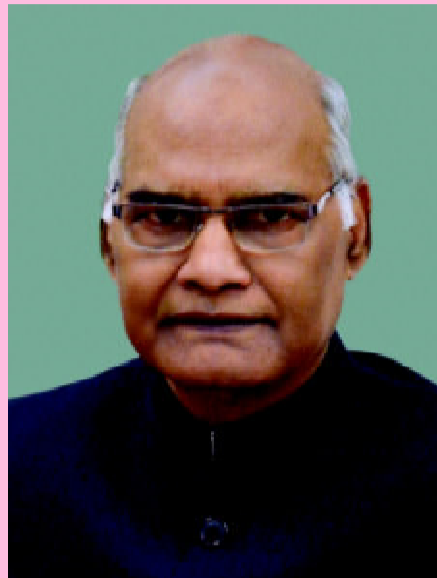

## Shri Ram Nath Kovind to be sworn in as 14<sup>th</sup> President of India on July 25

New Delhi, Jul 21

President elect Shri Ram Nath Kovind will be administered oath of office by Chief Justice of India on Tuesday (July 24), in a special function at the Central Hall of Parliament. NDA candidate Shri Kovind was elected as the 14th President of India yesterday after securing victory over opposition Smti Meira Kumar. He got 2,930 votes valued 7,02,044 and Smti Kumar got 1,844 votes valued 3,67,314.

Addressing media after his victory at his residence in Delhi, the President elect said, his elevation to the highest office is a message for the people who work with honesty. Shri Kovind said, he will represent the working class and poor sections of society in the Rashtrapati Bhavan.



### Bill to facilitate SBI merger with subsidiaries introduced in LS

New Delhi, July 21

Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley introduced the State Banks (Repeal and Amendment) Bill 2017 in the Lok Sabha on Friday. It seeks to repeal the State Bank of India (Subsidiary Banks) Act of 1959, the State Bank of Hyderabad Act, 1956 and to further amend the State Bank of India Act, 1955. The legislation seeks to formalise the integration of its erstwhile subsidiaries - the State Banks of Bikaner and Jaipur, Hyderabad, Mysore, Patiala and Travancore.

## Daring rescue at high seas by Coast Guard 11 crew of sinking ship saved; rescued Captain & crew thank CG



Port Blair, July 21

A daring rescue operation at high seas by the Coast Guard A&N region resulted in the rescue of 11 crew of Sinking Ship MV ITT Panther off Diglipur sea yesterday. MV ITT Panther, a general cargo vessel, on its way from Kolkata to Port Blair with an eleven member crew, made a distress call as the ship started sinking due to bad and rough weather conditions.

Speaking to the media persons soon after their arrival at Port Blair after being rescued, the Captain of the Ship, Amitabh Mukherjee informed that in the early hours of July 20, the weather condition turned rough, with strong monsoon winds and waves as high as four to five meters. The situation became critical when the vessel started tilting dangerously because of the shifting of cargo. "As the ship started sinking, we had no other option left

than to abandon the ship. As the crew members got on to their rafts, a distress call was made to the Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre in Port Blair", he said. Shri Mukherjee showered all praise for the Coast Guard A & N region for responding immediately and rescuing all of them

despite the bad weather and rough sea condition. Coast Guard Officials informed that reacting almost immediately, the Indian Coast Guard launched its aircraft to locate the 11 people adrift at sea. On receiving coordinates, ICGS Rajkamal and ICGS Bhikaji Cama (Contd. on last page)

# Mithali Raj-led India ready for final vs England

Derby, July 21  
India captain Mithali Raj has warned England not to expect an easy contest when they come up against her side in the Women's World Cup final on Sunday.

Harmanpreet Kaur struck an astonishing unbeaten 171 – the highest score by an Indian player, male or female, in a World Cup knockout match – to set the platform for a thrilling 36-run semi-final victory over defending champions Australia at Derby on Thursday.

That set-up a rematch of the opening fixture of the tournament, where India beat England by 35 runs, to decide who lifts the World Cup trophy in front of a sell-out Lord's crowd.

"As a team we are all very excited to be part of the final," said Raj, reflecting on India reaching their first World Cup final since 2005.

"We knew that this tournament wasn't going to be easy but the way the girls have turned up at every situation when the team needed, whether it was the batters or bowlers, this win has definitely changed the scenario in terms of how the girls will look up to the final.

"It definitely isn't going to be easy for England. But it will come down to how we perform on that day. We really have to work on our planning and strategy because England have also peaked after being defeated by us in the first game.

"They have performed well in the run up to the final, so playing a host in their own country is going to be a challenge. But saying that this unit is up for it."

Raj, while addressing the post-match press conference, pointed to Harmanpreet's knowledge of Australia's bowlers, courtesy her stint at the Women's Big Bash League (WBBL), which ultimately helped the Women in Blue plan for the semi-final.

"I think the transformation [has come] after she played in the WBBL," she said. "That exposure she and Smriti (Mandhana) got by interacting with other players has been massive. As I mentioned in the last press meet, against Australia it was they who were giving us more inputs about these players."

"If more players are a part of these leagues where they exchange ideas and follow the routine of other players, being part of the meetings, it will only help improve the standard of women's cricket, as well as it's very beneficial for youngsters and players from Indian team," Raj added. Player-of-the-match Harmanpreet Kaur hit an unbeaten 171 off 115 balls, the second highest score of the tournament.

Only her third ODI century, Harmanpreet Kaur produced an innings of destructive batting, smashing 20 fours and seven sixes, as India set six-time champions Australia 282 to win. "We're going to have to look at a few things and see what we're going to need to do, because all of the teams around the world are improving.

"We've got a fair bit of work to do to make sure we keep getting better to make sure we beat sides like England and India."

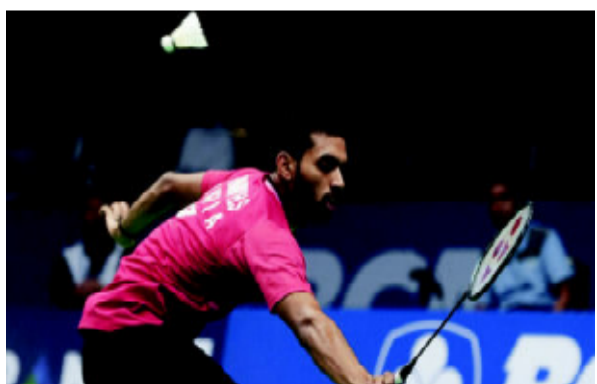
## Kashyap, Sameer Verma and H S Prannoy advance to US Open quarterfinals

Indian shuttlers P Kashyap, Sameer Verma and H S Prannoy advanced to the quarterfinals of the men's singles' competition at the USD 120,000 US Open Grand Prix Gold here. Kashyap crossed the second round after his opponent Hungary's Gergely Krausz retired midway in the second game with the scoreline reading 21-18 17-6 in favour of the Indian.

The Commonwealth Games champion then defeated Sri Lanka's Niluka Karunaratne, seeded 16th, 21-19 21-10 in the prequarterfinals match on the same day.

Kashyap will next face compatriot and fifth seed Sameer Verma, who notched up victories over Croatia's Zvonimir Durkinjak and Brazil's Ygor Coelho.

Sameer, who is making a comeback after recovering from a shoulder injury, had to fight hard to get the better off



Zvonimir 21-19 25-27 21-15 in the first match. He then saw off ninth seed Ygor 18-21 21-14 21-18.

Second seed H S Prannoy, meanwhile, brushed aside Ireland's Joshua Magee 21-13 21-17 before staving off a challenge from Netherlands' Mark Caljouw, seeded 12th, 21-8 14-21 21-16 in 48 minutes.

Prannoy will face eighth seed Kanta Tsuneyama of Japan next.

## Harmanpreet Kaur creates history by scoring 171\*



New Delhi, July 21

Harmanpreet Kaur created history on Thursday for Indian cricket when she scored an unbeaten 171 runs from 115 balls with 20 fours and seven sixes coming in her rapid fire inning that thumped the Australian attack and created a big ask for them while batting second at Derby. In the semi-final, she became the first Indian player – male or female – to score over 150 runs in an ODI knockout contest. This has only been done by six players in the history of the sport – now including Harmanpreet. She also became just the second Indian woman to record a score of over 150 runs in ODIs. Deepthi Sharma has a score higher than Harmanpreet's in women's ODI history. Her records don't just end there. She also became the highest run scorer in Women's World Cup knockout games – finals, semi-finals and quarter-finals – of the tournament – and the third highest overall. Australia's Karen Rolton had made 107 not out in the final of the 2005 World Cup which was the previous best in the knockout matches and the only century as well. Harmanpreet now has the highest score by an Indian in Women's World Cups as she edged Mithali Raj's 109 runs – which stood for just six days – against New Zealand in the crucial encounter that helped qualify the team for the semi-finals. Harmanpreet paced her innings beautifully to start steadily before picking up pace and obliterating the Australian attack including scoring 22 runs in one over from Ashleigh Gardner. In that over, Harmanpreet smacked two fours and two sixes to hurt her bowling figures. The Indian batsman scored her first 50 runs from 64 balls, second 50 runs in 26 balls and took the level up a serious notch for the final 50 in just 17 balls.
