## LG completes one year in office; holds press conference

# Highlights development works done in A&N Islands during last one year



Port Blair, Aug 21

**The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi has reiterated the commitment of the Administration towards the welfare of the people and the development of A&N Islands. He said this while addressing the media persons during a press conference, held at the Megapode Resort here today, on completion of one year in office by him. The Chairperson, PBMC, Shri B Eswar Rao and all senior officers of the A&N Administration were present in this press conference.**

Addressing the scribes, the Lt Governor said that all the Central Schemes have been enthusiastically implemented in these Islands during the past year and the A&N Administration has implemented various welfare schemes for the betterment of the Islanders. He also gave sector wise details of the projects taken up by the Administration under the guidance of the Central Govt. Highlighting some of the major achievements of the A&N Administration during the

past one year, the Lt. Governor hailed the implementation of GST by the Hon'ble Prime Minister, which, he said, is the most significant landmark decision towards improving the country's economy, since Independence.

To remove all the initial bottlenecks coming in the way of effective implementation of GST in the Islands, a new GST Department has been established in coordination with the Central Government. The Officers of the GST Department have

contacted all the business establishments and trained them so that they can be inspired to join the system. The officials of the GST Department met each and every trader to educate them about GST, its benefits and how to handle registration issues. With the coordinated efforts of the GST Department, District Administration and Business Establishments, as many as 3500 business units have registered themselves under GST in the Islands, said the Lt. Governor.

The Lt. Governor further said that concerned by the increasing number of oral cancer cases in the Isles, the Administration has banned zarda and gutkha in these Islands. He said, good result have been witnessed following the ban on consumption, production, sale and stocking of zarda and gutkha, since October 2, 2016. He further mentioned that considering the ill effects of alcoholism on the Islands' society, a Prohibition Department has also come into effect since October 2, 2016, and to

bring down the consumption of alcohol in the Islands, a New Excise Rule has been implemented in the Islands w.e.f. January 2017. The Prohibition Department is organizing various awareness programmes and de-addiction camps throughout the Islands, said the Lt. Governor expressing his satisfaction that the sale of alcohol has decreased by 26.6 % between January and July 2017, as compared to the last year. (Contd. on last page)

At a commissioning ceremony, held at Indian Naval Jetty, Haddo, here today, the Lt. Governor, A & N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, chief guest of the function, commissioned the ship by unveiling its name plate and dedicating it to the service of the nation.**

The First Lady of A&N Islands, Smti Prem Mukhi, the Commander-in-Chief, A & N Command, Vice Admiral Bimal Verma, senior officers from the Defence and the Civil Administration and the Rear Admiral (Retd.) V K Saxena, Chairman, & Managing Director, Garden Reach Ship Builders & Engineers, Kolkata also attended this function. The Ship is commanded by Cdr Kaushik Chatterjee.

Commissioning the ship, the Lt. Governor said, the strategic location of



Andaman & Nicobar Islands in the Indian Ocean Region, their distance from the mainland and the propensity of the region for natural calamities call for a formidable defence infrastructure. The Andaman & Nicobar Command works hand in hand with the Andaman & Nicobar Administration to attain self reliance in this

sphere in these Islands. For ensuring security of the maritime borders, maintaining a constant vigil and surveillance of these Islands is a must, he said.

The Lt. Governor also informed about the various health facilities being included in the Islands. The A&N Administration will soon procure the necessary machines for establishing the Cath Lab for angioplasty (stents) & cardio thoracic surgery facilities for bypass surgery in the GB Pant Hospital here. Tenders have been floated for the purchase of the equipments for the establishment of Cath lab too. The facility of spinal surgery has been made available in G.B Pant Hospital itself and now patients need not go to mainland for spinal surgery. Two more Dialysis Units have also been added in G.B Pant Hospital. The Primary Health Centre of Teressa has been shifted to a newly constructed building while a new Primary Health Centre has been opened in Katchal Island. Construction work for 30 bedded ward for eye patients, 20 bedded ward for burn patients and 10 bedded ward for cancer patients at G.B. Pant Hospital will be completed in few weeks and will start operating soon, the Lt Governor said mentioning that an Operation Theatre was also inaugurated at CHC Bambooflat in the month of November 2016.

About Tourism sector, the Lt. Governor stated that tourism plays a very important role in the economy of the Islands and it has a great potential for employment generation. The arrival of tourists in the Islands has seen an increase of 33.8% as compare to the last year with 4.65 lakhs tourists visiting these Islands between August 2016 and July 2017. With a view to promote eco-tourism in the Islands and to increase the accommodation facilities in the coming tourist season, tented accommodations and tree houses are being developed in different tourist spots of the Islands, said the Lt. Governor adding that bed & breakfast scheme is also being taken up. The work for establishing floating HDPE Jetty in the Ross & Smith and Avis Islands has already commenced while the demarcation of sea beaches of Avis Island, Ross & Smith, Lalaji Bay and Mark Bay with marking buoys is also underway. With a view to enlighten the masses about the historical legacy and glorious history of the Islands, the re-development work of Viper Island has also commenced, he said adding that boats connecting Ross, Viper and North Bay are being restarted.

Turning to the connectivity issues of the Isles, the Lt. Governor informed that the tender for laying of Optical Fiber Cable (OFC) has been floated on July 7, 2017 and the work is expected to be allotted shortly. The Rs. 1102.38 crore project will bring a sea change in the Information & Technology sector in the Islands, said the Lt. Governor.

Referring to the Solar Power situation in the Islands, the Lt. Governor stated The Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh laid the foundation stone for Solar Power Plants of 17 MW capacity at Manglutan and 8MW at Chidyatapu on 7th April 2017. Rooftop Solar Power Plants have been set up in 18 Govt buildings which are providing 01 MW power while the project for installation of rooftop solar power plant in 1000 houses has also been sanctioned. Under this, 70% subsidy is being provided and the Central Government has released an amount of Rs. 2.4 crores towards this project. This project will begin within this month and will lead to generation of 2 MW additional solar power. Rooftop solar power plants will be set up in all the State and Central Government buildings, Schools, Hospitals and Judiciary buildings across the Islands in a phase manner by Solar Corporation of India, New Delhi for which tender for installation of 11 MW rooftop solar power plants have been floated. About 3.68 lakhs LED Bulbs have been distributed throughout the Islands, which has led to a decrease of 7 to 8 % consumption of electricity. Under the Smart City scheme, the work for converting 12,500 street lights of Port Blair into LED lights will commence soon. This will save around 0.7 MW of power, he said.

About the Shipping sector, the Lt. Governor said, the A & N Administration has ordered four big ships, two for mainland and two inter-Island, with Cochin Shipyard Ltd. and the construction of these vessels is progressing as per schedule. The Administration has also ordered ten smaller ships.

Out of these ten smaller ships, four smaller harbor crafts of 150-passenger capacity are ready and will reach here as soon as the weather is suitable. Construction work of the remaining six 250 passenger capacity vessels is underway at Bharati Shipyard Ltd. in Mangalore. The construction work is progressing as per schedule and the vessels are expected to be delivered by March/April 2018. MV Bharat Seema, a 388 passenger-cum 100 ton cargo vessel was inducted into service on Oct 7, 2016 while the 450 passenger capacity and 100 ton capacity vessel 'MV Coral Queen' has been chartered, which is giving its services in the Southern group of the Islands since June 26, 2017. In the Neil Island, an additional Jetty is being constructed while the present jetty is being extended. The work for extending the berthing jetty in Hope Town also commenced in April 2017 and is expected to be completed by Feb 2018. The ALHW is carrying out the work of increasing the Dry Dock of Port Blair by 90 metres. This project is likely to be completed by December 2019.

Turning to the Fisheries sector, the Lt Governor said, a Fish Landing Centre (FLC) was inaugurated at Guptapara on 20th September 2016 while the foundation for extended FLC at Junglighat was laid on May 29, 2017 and a Diesel Bunk was installed at this Fish Landing Centre with the support of IOC, to provide diesel for the boats of fishermen. He said the Administration is constructing Fish Landing Centres at Havelock, Campbell Bay, Hut Bay and Katchal which are expected to be completed shortly. Construction of Ice Plant and Cold Storage at Panighat and a new Ice Plant at Mayabunder is under progress, the Lt Governor added.

Referring to the Road & Bridges Sector, the Lt Governor said that the work for construction and widening of the 83 kms of National Highway-4 i.e 33 Kms from 12 km to 45 Km and 50 kms from 240 Km to 290 Km, has started by the Central Government with a cost of Rs 383 crores. Tender for 77 kms of NH-4 i.e. 31 kms from 107 km to 138 km and 46 kms from 194 km to 240 km are being floated while the construction work for the Humphrey Strait Bridge with an estimate of Rs 202.90 crores has already commenced, the Lt Governor said adding that the tender for the second bridge at Middle Strait has already been floated. This bridge will cost Rs 205 crores. Both the bridges are likely to be completed by 2020.

Expressing happiness that the Administration has made a discernible progress in the education front, the Lt Governor said, the overall percentage of the AISSCE-2017 in Isles stood at 78.58 percent witnessing an increase of 6.98 percent compared to last year. Similarly, the overall percentage of class 10th exam stood at 99.20 percent. It's a matter of pride for all us that 77 schools secured 100 percent results in the class 10th exam-2017 while 13 students of Govt School achieved 10 point CGPA in this exam. He further informed that a new Polytechnic has been sanctioned, which will start during the academic year 2018-2019 at Diglipur.

He also spoke about the Law College, which was started on October 10, 2016 paving way for providing law education in the Islands. The matter of establishing a Central University is under the active consideration of Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, he said.

The Administration is giving adequate attention to sports in the Isles. An Indoor Multipurpose Sports hall, built at cost of Rs 4.61 crores was inaugurated at Kanyapuram in the month of January 2017. For promoting sports in Isles, a Sports Academy for boys and girls in basketball, swimming, and cycling has also been started on Oct 1, 2016. In the current financial year 2017-18, the Department of Youth and Sports will construct a Mini Stadium at the Laltha Singh Ground at Haddo, he said.

In the farming sector, the Lt Governor said, the Hon'ble Prime Minister has launched many schemes for the welfare of farmers to ensure that their income is doubled by 2022. Schemes like Crop Insurance, Prime Minister Irrigation Scheme and Soil Health Card have been launched for the farmers. To save the farmers from the middlemen, a policy is being framed based upon the Model Act prepared by the Central Govt. Apart from this, fertilizer and farm instruments subsidy is also directly deposited in the account of the farmers as per the Prime Minister's Project of Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), so that they can directly purchase fertilizer and farm instruments from the open market. Organic Mission has already been started in Neil Island and pre-organic Neil agriculture products are already available in Port Blair. All the hoteliers in Neil have been asked to use organic produce of Neil Island in their hotels. Organic mission would be launched soon in Hut Bay, he said.

The Lt. Governor also mentioned that under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, 2062 households have been provided with free LPG connections. He also said the opening of the Govt. petrol retail outlet at Havelock has brought down the rate of petrol and diesel by Rs 18/- ltr providing much relief to the people in that Island. Another Govt. petrol retail outlet will be opened at Campbell Bay Island soon, followed by Neil Island.

The Lt. Governor expressed happiness that the PBMC has introduced Unit Area Method for collecting property tax which has brought transparency in the system. This has tripled the revenue collection and helped root out the Inspector Raj. Under the new system of tax collection, the House Tax of many people has come down.

The Lt Governor further stated that the Swacchh Bharat Abhiyan started by our Hon'ble Prime Minister has been embraced by the Islanders here. As part of the Swacchh Bharat Abhiyan (Urban), Individual toilets have been constructed in 292 households and 3 Community toilets have also been created. Apart from these, construction of 92 individual toilets and 56 community toilets will be completed soon. On October 2, 2017, Port Blair will be declared 'Open Defecation Free'. Under Swacchh Bhaart Abhiyan (Rural), Individual toilets in 5000 households and 41 community toilet premises have been created. By March 2018, the entire A&N Islands will be declared as 'Open Defecation Free'.

In the civil aviation sector, the Lt. Governor stated that 14 scheduled flights are being operated daily even in the current lean season. "It is expected that 22 flights will be operated daily in the month of October", he said adding that the Central Govt's Regional Connectivity Scheme 'Ude Desh Ka Aam Admi', will be started in these Islands too for which a MoU has been signed between Ministry of Civil Aviation and Airport Authority of India. Under this Scheme, Flights will be operated from Port Blair to Car Nicobar, Campbell Bay and Shipbur at Diglipur. With the efforts of the Central Govt, the stalled work of new Airport Terminal Building, to be constructed at a cost of Rs 450 crore has again started by a new company from the month of April 2017.

About A&N Police, the Lt Governor said, for the safety of Women and to create a better & positive understanding between Police and Society, Pink Police Patrol has been launched in these Islands. The all women patrol party is instrumental in patrolling around the educational Institutions and parks of the Port Blair City and 3 cases involving women were attended and intervened by it.

In the Civil Supplies sector, the Lt Governor said in order to bring transparency in the Public Distribution system, Smart Ration Card has been introduced under the e-PDS project of the Central Government. Out of the 478 PDS functioning across the Islands, 368 PDS have been converted into e-PDS, thus covering 77% population of the Islands. He also mentioned that 98% population in the A&N has been covered under Aadhaar scheme.

The Lt Governor also mentioned that under APWD, a water treatment plant was commissioned on 09th March 2017, at Tirur, Ferrargunj Tehsil which will provide treated water to a population of 3300 people of eight villages of South Andaman. Later, the Lt Governor also answered various queries raised by the scribes. Earlier, the Secretary IP, Ms Nitika Pawar welcome the Lt. Governor and others present in the press conference.

equipments will surely augment the maritime security, humanitarian relief capabilities, ability to conduct search and rescue operations and disaster relief operations by the Andaman & Nicobar Command. "This would enhance our reach to the far-flung Islands, in time of need and also for ensuring the presence of our forces on those Islands", he said.

Lauding the role of the Command in relief and rescue operations in the Islands, the Lt. Governor said, the Command, ever since its inception has played an important role in all facets of life in these Islands. It has always been on the forefront of the entire spectrum of activities, from search and rescue operations to humanitarian and disaster relief management as well as providing logistic supports to remote Islands. The induction of the Ship would surely enhance operational capability of the Command, he said.

The Lt. Governor said, the Navy's strength at sea is determined by the technological strength ashore. "Our indigenous capability alone can provide us real strength at sea. The fact that we are able today, to commission a state-of-the-art warship like L-52 endowed almost entirely with Indian capability, in terms of her design and construction, power generation package and more importantly, her weapon and sensors, is an eloquent testimony of our nation's technological prowess and the skill of its work-force", he said.

The Lt. Governor later went round inside the ship and was apprised about the various facilities, such as communication, navigation, armaments etc. He extended his wishes of victories in all endeavours to the Commanding Officer, officers and sailors of L-52.

Speaking on the occasion, the Commander-in-Chief, A & N Command, Vice Admiral Bimal Verma, AVSM, said that the busy and strategic location of these Islands and the huge maritime foot prints indicates the need to enhance the maritime security capability. The primary role of L-52 will be to transport, deploy and recover troops and armament from ship to shore and vice versa, during amphibious operations. The ship will significantly enhance the sealfit capability of the Andaman and Nicobar Command, which is most essential for Amphibious operations and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) missions, he added.

Rear Admiral (Retd.) V K Saxena, Chairman & Managing Director, Garden Reach Ship Builders & Engineers, Kolkata while speaking on the occasion informed that L-52 is the second of the eight Mark IV class Navy ships being built by GRSE Kolkata. The first one was commissioned in March this year while by the end of this year, L-53 and L-54 will be delivered to A & N Command. The remaining six ships will be built and delivered in the next two years.

The Commander of the Ship, Cdr Kaushik Chatterjee read out the Commissioning Order of the Ship to the august gathering on the occasion and the commissioning ceremony concluded with the National Anthem.

Culture, A&N Administration to document and preserve the language and culture of the Nicobarese people.

Speaking on the occasion, the Secretary (Art & Culture) dedicated the work to the people of Nicobar and emphasized the need to digitize the work for making it more widely available. She also stated that a workshop would soon be conducted by inviting the authors of the books and other stake holders to arrive at the way forward by which this work of immense literary value can be shared with the masses. She pointed out that this research work has resulted in the finding that there are six distinct languages among the Nicobarese and not one as hitherto commonly believed.

The DC, Nicobar, Smti Neha Bansal while speaking highlighted the need to make these books available in the libraries of all schools and colleges as well as release of the videos on YouTube, so that the world becomes aware of the beautiful people that the Nicobarese are. The Director, ANTRI said that these books can serve as a catalyst for motivating the Nicobarese to learn the languages spoken by the different groups living in the Nicobar group of Islands as well as the urgent need to document and preserve the Great Nicobarese language which is on the verge of extinction.

The representatives of the Nicobarese people also shared their views and expressed their desire to preserve the Nicobarese way of life which focuses on collective spirit rather than individual aspirations, a communication said.
