## Right use of fertilizer & new techniques will help in doubling farmers' income by 2022 : PM

New Delhi, Oct 21

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has said that cooperative major IFFCO's initiatives to train the farming community on right use of fertilizers, advanced techniques and cash-less transactions will help in doubling farmers' income by 2022.

In a message on the occasion of the cooperative's golden jubilee year, Shri Modi said, IFFCO's contribution in the upliftment of farmers and cooperative organizations is praiseworthy. He said, the cooperative has also played an important role in implementation of urea neem-coating programme rolled out by the government to curb black marketing of urea.

Stating that the government has fixed a target to double farmers' income by 2022, Shri Modi said, IFFCO's initiatives to connect farmers with best farm techniques will be helpful in achieving this goal. Founded in 1967 with just 57 cooperatives, IFFCO is today an amalgamation of over 36,000 Indian cooperatives. On its 50th year, it is conducting training programmes for farmers at 125 locations across the country.

It will be simultaneously broadcast on AIR's website allindiaradio.gov.in. Mann Ki Baat is an apolitical and interactive broadcast focussing on welfare and well-being of the people.

## MES Builders Association meets Defence Minister

## Linkage of Aadhaar number to bank account is mandatory: RBI

New Delhi, Oct 21

Reserve Bank of India today said biometric identity number Aadhaar linkage with bank accounts is mandatory. The RBI clarification followed media reports quoting a reply to a Right to Information (RTI) application which suggested the apex bank has not issued any order for mandatory Aadhaar linkage with bank accounts. But the Reserve Bank, in a statement, clarified that linkage of Aadhaar number to bank account is mandatory under the Prevention of Money-



laundering (Maintenance of Records) Rules. It said, these rules have been published in the Official Gazette on 1st of June this year. It also said, these rules have statutory force and, as such, banks have to implement them without awaiting further instructions.

## ISS astronauts completes spacewalk to install new camera system

Washington, Oct 21

Two astronauts aboard the International Space Station (ISS) have completed a spacewalk to install a new camera system on the orbiting laboratory's robotic arm. They replaced a blown fuse and installed

a new high definition camera on the starboard truss of the station. In a blog post, the NASA scientists wrote on Friday that the spacewalk lasted for six hours and 49 minutes. Space station crew members have

conducted 205 spacewalks in support of assembly and maintenance of the orbiting laboratory. Spacewalkers have now spent a total of 53 days, 6 hours and 25 minutes working outside the station.

## India thrash Pakistan 4-0, enter final

Dhaka, Oct 21 After a goalless first half, Satbir Singh, Harmanpreet Singh, Lalit Upadhyay and Gurjant Singh scored one each to help India thrash Pakistan 4-0 in their final Super 4 game of Asia Cup hockey in Dhaka on Saturday. Thereby India entered the final of the continental tournament as the toppers of Super 4 with seven points. They had also topped Pool A before entering the Super 4 stage. India only needed a draw to qualify for Sunday's final but made sure they kept their track record intact against Pakistan in 2017. The Manpreet Singh-led team will take on either defending champions South Korea or Malaysia in the final? at Dhaka's Moulana Bhashani Hockey Stadium.



### Kidambi Srikanth enters in semi-finals of Denmark Open Badminton

Odense, Oct 21 Kidambi Srikanth knocked out local hero and World champion Viktor Axelsen in men's singles quarterfinals in the Denmark Open Super Series Premier Badminton in Odense last night. Srikanth, who had suffered losses against Axelsen in the last three encounters, showed tremendous resilience and mental fortitude to oust the reigning World number one 14-21, 22-20, 21-7 in a match that last 56 minutes at the Odense Sports Park. Earlier, Saina Nehwal suffered



a 10-21, 13-21 loss to Japan's World no 5 Akane Yamaguchi in women's singles quarterfinals. HS Prannoy, also succumbed to a series of unforced errors, losing 13-21 18-21 to World No. 2 Korean Son Wan Ho in men's singles.

### Indian juggernaut up against New Zealand's grit



Mumbai, Oct 21 Hardly challenged in a dominating run this season, India will once again start overwhelming favourites when they take on an inconsistent-but-gritty New Zealand in a three-match ODI series, starting in Mumbai on Sunday. The Indians are on a high after comprehensively thrashing world champions Australia earlier this month. And the Black Caps will have to come up with really a special effort to make a mark against the rampaging hosts. Banking on settled batting and bowling combinations with most of the columns ticked, the hosts appear to be too well-groomed a unit for the comfort of the visitors. Although India suffered a resounding loss to South Africa on

a belt of a track at this very venue three seasons ago, they went on to win three series on the trot in their backyard and are now a force to reckon with in the upcoming series. In fact, since surrendering to Australia back in 2009—10, India have lost only to Pakistan (2012) and South Africa in 16 bilateral rubbers, a clear indication of how dominant they have been in familiar conditions. Considering that the 4-1 result over Australia was achieved without skipper Virat Kohli being in top form and despite the absence of prolific opener Shikhar Dhawan, it was a huge achievement.

Guwahati, Oct 21 Mali are the first team into the semi-finals of the 2017 FIFA U-17 World Cup with a comfortable win over Ghana. The African champions were on point with their tactical gameplan as well as execution and reduced the strong Ghana side to mere onlookers as they mounted attack after attack in the first half. In poor playing conditions amidst heavy rainfall, as Ghana struggled to get the ball on their feet and build their game, Mali shone through with



their simple yet effective approach. A penalty midway through the second half raised Ghana's hopes of coming back into the quarter-final but a solid back four of Mali held on for a fine victory at Guwahati.

### India enter into finals of World Archery Championships

Mexico, Oct 21 The Indian team entered the finals of World Archery Championships in Mexico today. The team got the better of Germany 232-227 in the compound women's team semifinals, to set up a gold-medal match against Colombia. The Indian team comprising Trisha Deb, Lily Chanu Paonam and Jyothi Surekha Vennam defeated their



German rivals quite comfortably.

Deb, Paonam and Vennam scored matches of 232, 233 and 232 points as they beat Russia, Denmark and Germany in the elimination matches. Paonam and Vennam both finished in the top-10 individually at these championships, while Deb came 17th after losing in the third round. The Indian squad had the highest per-match average of any team in the field in Mexico.
