The Vice President, Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu has said that India has put 'Dharma' at the centre of governance. He was addressing the Members of Andhra Pradesh &

Telangana Advocates Associations, in Hyderabad yesterday. The Acting Chief Justice of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Justice Ramesh Ranganathan, Deputy Chief Minister of

Telangana, Shri Mohammad Mahmood Ali and other dignitaries were also present on the occasion. The Vice President said that Dharma is for the stability of society, the

maintenance of social order and the general well-being and progress of human kind. Whatever conduces to the fulfillment of these objects is Dharma, he added. The Vice President said that upholding Dharma means sustaining our civilization and if we follow the rule of law, our human society will survive and this is why we say: "Dharmo Rakshati Rakshitaha". He quoted Chanakya as saying "Law and morality sustain the world". We all have a stake and a role to play in making this happen in our lives, he added. India becomes second largest fish producing country in the world: Minister

New Delhi, Nov 21

Union Agriculture and Farmer Welfare Minister, Shri Radha Mohan Singh has said that the previously implemented "Letter of Permit" or "L.O.P." system in the E.E.E. has been stopped since January, 2017. Besides, specific decisions have been taken to safeguard the interests of traditional fishermen in the area of EEZ beyond 12 nautical miles, which is regulated by the Government of India, such as the traditional fishers have been exempted from the fishing ban implemented during monsoon period in the EEZ; use of LED lights/ other artificial lights for fishing as well as practice of bull-trailing or pair-



trailing have been completely banned, recently on 10th November, 2017. The duration of fishing ban has also been increased from 47 days to 61 days, with the consent of all coastal State Governments. Shri Singh has said that the scheme 'Blue Revolution' has been launched with the outlay of Rs. 300 crore for the integrated

development of the Fisheries sector in the country. As a result, overall fish production has registered an increase of about 18.86% in comparison to the last three years, whereas inland fish production has registered a growth of more than 26%.

Combining the production of all types of fisheries (capture and culture), the total fish production in the country has reached at about 11.41 million tonnes in 2016-17. Shri Singh further said that about 1.5 crore people in the country are employed in the fisheries sector for their livelihood. The Union Agriculture Minister said this in a function organized on "World Fisheries Day" in the National Agricultural Science Center (NASC) Complex at New Delhi today. Justice Bhandari received 183-193 votes in the General Assembly and secured all the 15 votes in the Security Council after separate and simultaneous elections

Create awareness among school kids on Blue Whale: SC to states

New Delhi, Nov 21

The Supreme Court has directed all state governments to make school children aware of the dangers posed by virtual dare games like Blue Whale Challenge.

A three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra said today that school-going children should be made aware of the beauty of life and the dangers posed by such games.

It directed the Chief Secretaries of all states to ask the Secretaries of the concerned departments to take necessary steps in this regard. The bench also



directed the Union Human Resources Development Ministry to take requisite steps to inform all schools in the country about the ill-effects of such games. The apex court also considered the interim report of a committee set up by the Centre to enquire into the suicides committed

by students in some states while playing the Blue Whale challenge. The bench disposed of the petition filed by a lawyer seeking framing of guidelines to regulate and monitor virtual digital games like Blue Whale and other life-threatening online games.

CBEC asks FMCG companies to revise MRP on all products in line with latest reduction in GST rates

New Delhi, Nov 21

Centre has appealed industry leaders to pass on the benefit of GST rate reduction to the consumers. In a letter to all the major Fast-Moving Consumer Goods (FMCG) companies, Central Board of Excise and Customs (CBEC) Chairperson, Ms Vanaja Sarna stressed on the need to immediately revise the MRP on all the

products in which reduction of GST has been announced.

The Chairperson also requested them to give wide publicity to the revised MRP of products. In a statement, Finance Ministry said, it expects that the industry would immediately respond to the earlier appeal made by Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley on this issue.

The Ministry said the benefit of reduction in the GST rates has to be passed on by the suppliers to the consumers. The reduction in GST rates is also expected to encourage domestic demand and investment. The GST Council on 10th of this month had reduced taxes on 178 items which came into effect from 15th of November.

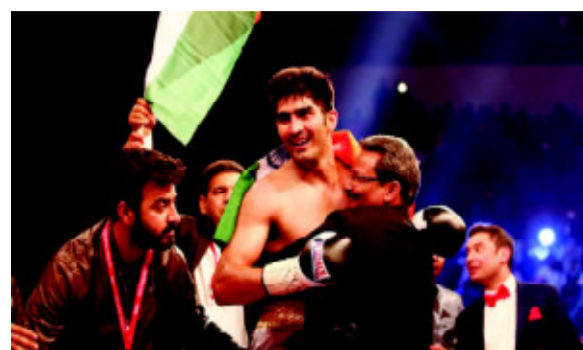

Vijender Singh to take on British boxer Rocky Fielding in 2018

New Delhi, Nov 21
Vijender Singh is scheduled to fight British boxer Rocky Fielding for the British and Commonwealth Super middleweight title. A press release said that Fielding has been ordered to defend his title against Vijender come March 30, 2018. Fielding had won the title on September 30 with a win over David Brophy in Liverpool. Although the fight is scheduled for March 30, it will be confirmed only when both sides are on the same page and agree on the terms of the fight. 32-year-old Vijender Singh turned pro in October 2015 and since then has raced to a 9-0 record. He currently holds the WBO Asia Pacific and Oriental Super Middleweight title. Fielding, on the other hand, is far more experienced



than Vijender and has won 25 of his 26 fights including 14 knockouts. He has held the WBA Inter-Continental super middleweight and WBA Commonwealth and English Super middleweight titles. Vijender had most recently defeated Chinese boxer Zulpikar Maimaital in a closely fought bout. The fight went all 10 rounds with Singh the winner in a unanimous verdict - 96-93, 95-94, 95-94. With that win,

Vijender not only successfully defended his WBO Asia Pacific super middleweight title and also took his opponent's WBO Oriental super middleweight belt. But the Haryana boxer gave the Oriental Super Middleweight belt back to Zulpikar. It was a time when tensions were mounting between India and China and Vijender said that he is giving back the belt as a way of appealing for peace at the border.

Fisheries Day worldwide every year. Shri Singh emphasized that the vast aquatic resources present in the country provide more opportunities and potential for further development in fisheries sector. He said that main aim of Blue Revolution Scheme is to increase the fish production and productivity to up to 8% annual growth rate and to produce 15 million tonnes of fish by 2020. This scheme will contribute significantly to achieving the targets of doubling the income of farmers and fishermen by 2022. Shri Singh said that in line with Blue Revolution Scheme and with active participation of all the States / Union Territories, Government of India has taken effective steps and proposed a long-term plan "Blue Revolution Mission-2016" for the period from 2015-16 to 2019-20. Under this scheme, it is proposed to achieve full production capacity and increase the fish productivity from the aquatic resources and aquaculture in both inland and marine sectors.

India captain Virat Kohli has moved up a spot to be fifth in the latest ICC Test rankings for batsmen while teammate Ravindra Jadeja has slipped a place to be third in the bowlers' standings. Kohli has edged David Warner to take the fifth position after completing his 50th international century in the first match of a three-Test series against Sri Lanka in Kolkata. Kohli, who is top-ranked in both ODIs and T20s, scored a fine 104 not out on day five before the game ended in a draw. Opener Shikhar Dhawan has gained two places to reach the 28th position while among



India's bowlers, paceman Bhuvneshwar Kumar has gained eight places to be at career-best 29th position and Mohammed Shami has moved up one slot to the 18th position. Jadeja, who started the Sri Lanka series with the opportunity to reclaim the top bowling and all-rounder

rankings, could not work towards the objective in Kolkata as all Sri Lanka batsmen fell to pace bowlers. Jadeja has slipped to third position among bowlers and also lost 20 points in the rankings for allrounders but still has a lot to look forward to in the remaining matches.
