## Govt to consider CBSE recommendation for making board exams mandatory for Class X: HRD Minister

New Delhi, Dec 21  
Human Resource Development Minister, Shri Prakash Javadekar today said that the government will duly consider the recommendation of Central Board Secondary Examination, CBSE for making Class 10th Board Examination compulsory from 2018.

Briefing reporters in New Delhi, Shri Javadekar said, after completing the due process, the final order in this regard will be issued. He said, out of two crore students who appeared in the various boards' exam, only seven lakh students do not sit in the exam. He said, in view of situation, there was a demand from various quarters for making the board exam compulsory and government's wants to do it. Shri Javadekar also clarified that there has been no change in the existing patterns of board exam for 2017 but from 2018 every student will have to appear in 10th board exam. In reply to a question about the language formula, Shri Javadekar said, the government is not imposing any language but it wants the people to learn more and more languages.

## Rs 50,000 fine on airlines if their planes empty human waste in air: NGT

New Delhi, Dec 21  
National Green Tribunal (NGT) has ordered to impose a fine of 50,000 rupees on airlines whose aircraft empty toilet tanks in air while landing and splattering human waste on houses. The NGT directed aviation regulator Directorate General of Civil Aviation, DGCA to issue a circular to all airlines, whose planes are involved in the act, to pay 50 thousand rupees as environmental compensation.

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Swatanter Kumar passed a number of directions on a plea of a retired army officer alleging dumping of human excreta by aircraft over residential areas near the IGI Airport in New Delhi. The tribunal asked the DGCA to issue circular to all ground handling services and airlines to ensure that they do not release waste from human waste tanks while landing or anywhere near the terminals of the IGI Airport. It asked DGCA to also issue directions that aircraft on landing shall be subjected to surprise inspection to see that human waste tanks are not empty. Normally, the waste in the aircraft tanks are disposed of by ground handling personnel once the plane lands.

## CBSE removes lesson on Nadars from textbook

## Board was asked by HC to review 'derogatory' references

New Delhi, Dec. 21  
The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has directed that a topic in the Class IX Social Science textbook on 'Caste conflict and dress change' with references to the Nadar community be dropped from the curriculum. "No questions from the section should be asked in 2017 Summative Assessment," a Board circular addressed to teachers and students read. The topic features in 'India and the contemporary world-I', one of the Social Science textbooks published by the National Council of Education and Research Training (NCERT) and used in CBSE schools across the country. In the chapter titled 'Clothing: A social history', the Nadar community is referred to under the 'caste conflict and dress change' sub-head, wherein it is stated that a majority of them were considered a 'subordinate caste' and that they were expected to follow the local custom of not covering their upper bodies. Whereas, 25% for the general category and 35% for the special category in Rural area. The maximum cost of the project/unit admissible under manufacturing sectors is Rs. 25 lakh, Service sector is Rs.10 lakh and under business/trading sector is 3 lakhs. 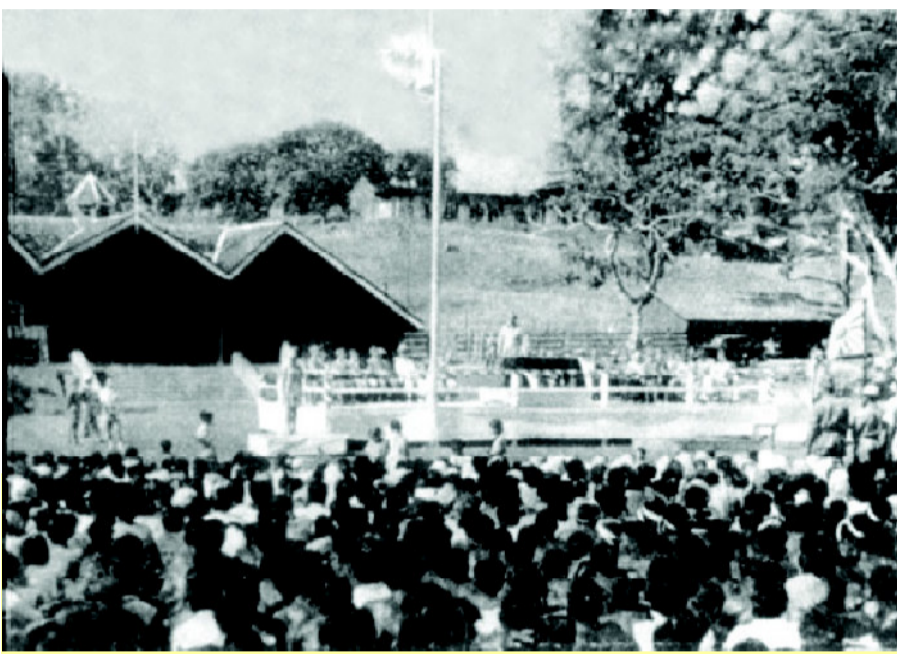
## Handicraft artisans invited to participate in Fair in mainland

69th National Track Cycling Championship begins  
Deborah to spearhead  
A&N Islands challenge  
in the meet

Thiruvananthapuram, Dec. 21  
The 69th national track cycling championship began at the Velodrome at LNCPE Kariyavattom here today. H. Deborah, the only Indian who took part in the World Cycling Championship is the star attraction of the event. Deborah, who was once ranked fourth in the world, will take part in her favourite 500m sprint event and will spearhead Andaman and Nicobar Islands' challenge in the event. Lidyamol, V. Rajani, Kezia Varghese are some of the internationals who will be seen in action during the five-day meet. In the men's section, institution teams - Railways, Services and BSNL - are expected to dominate but they will face threat from cyclists from Punjab and Maharashtra. In the women's section, Andamans, host Kerala, Maharashtra and Manipur are expected to vie for top honours.



ICC rankings: Ravindra Jadeja jumps to career-best 2nd place, Ashwin retains top spot

Dubai, Dec 21  
Following his match-winning 7/48 in the final Test against England, Ravindra Jadeja has jumped to a career-best second spot in the latest ICC Test ranking for bowlers. Jadeja's match-haul of 10/154 has put him 8 points adrift of Ashwin, who continues to hold the top spot. Jadeja has gained 66 points and has leapfrogged the likes of Josh Hazlewood, James Anderson, Dale Steyn and Rangana Herath, which means this is the only occasion since 1974 that the top two spots in the ICC bowling chart have belonged to Indians - Bishan Bedi and BS Chandrasekhar being the last pair. Jadeja has also gained one place to reach a career-best third rank in the list of allrounders, which also is ruled by Ashwin. Apart from a tally of 43 wickets from nine matches this year, Jadeja has also contributed with the bat, scoring three half-centuries, two of which - a career-best 90 and 51 - came in the series against England. Ishant Sharma, who played



the final Test was promoted by two places to hold the 23rd spot while triple-centurion Karun Nair has rose 122 places to be ranked 55th. His Karnataka team-mate KL Rahul, who scored 199 in the first innings, has also leaped 29 places to be placed at a career-best 51st.
