GoI to provide additional Concentrators to A&N Islands 'Free of Cost'

Port Blair, June 21

The Secretary Home, GoI today held a meeting to review the COVID-19 situation in the UTs through video conferencing. The Chief Secretary, A & N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain, DGP, ANP, Shri Satyendra Garg, Commissioner-cum-Secretary (Health), Dr. V. Candavelou and other officers and senior doctors of A&N Administration attended the meeting. The meeting was aimed to assess the status of



COVID-19 in UTs and the issues faced in management of COVID-19 and vaccination.

Further, the RTPCR tests have increased significantly in the last two weeks. The UT Administration is committed to save the life of the people of these Islands and hence, to shield the citizens, the vaccination process for 18-44 years will be augmented w.e.f 22.06.2021. All the beneficiaries will be given vaccination through onsite registration across all the Health Institutions.

The Govt. of India has also agreed to provide additional Concentrators to these Islands free of cost, a press release from DHS said.

During the virtual meeting, the UT performance was reviewed and it was observed that the A&N Islands has improved its situation on COVID and its management.

Preparation for National Rollout of National Digital Health Mission reviewed

A&N Islands achieve targets set by NHA for Creation of Health ID, Registration of Doctor & Health Facility

Port Blair, June 21

A video conference was held today by Secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Chief Executive Officer of National Health Authority to review the preparation for National Rollout of National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) which was attended by senior Officers of Administration and Health Department.

NDHM envisions to build the digital backbone to transform the healthcare delivery in the nation. It aims to provide a Digital Health Ecosystem to capture the health data and reports pertaining to health care services delivered, so that, it can easily be accessed by various stakeholders like patients, registered

hospitals, administrators and health research organizations. The Digital Health System shall adhere to the provisions of National Health Data Management Policy notified during December 2020 and

shall ensure privacy by design in the system so that data can be accessed only with the consent of the patient.

NDHM was launched as a pilot in the six Union Territories including Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 15-8-2020 by the Hon'ble

Prime Minister of India. The National Health Authority (NHA) is the nodal agency for implementation at national level. The Andaman Nicobar Islands have achieved the targets set by NHA for the three building

All beneficiaries to be given vaccination through onsite registration
 Recovered COVID-19 positive persons should get their vaccine after 90 days only

Port Blair, June 21

The A&N Administration is augmenting the process for free vaccination of the 18-44 years of age in this UT for COVID-19. In this regard, the onsite registration for vaccination will be

done for all the eligible beneficiaries from tomorrow (June 22). Each Health Institutions having COVID Vaccination Centre will start giving the vaccine to the eligible beneficiaries after verifying the Aadhaar

card and in rare cases other documents issued by the Govt. Each center will be administering the vaccine at the rate of 100 per vaccinator available at the center. Eligible beneficiaries have been requested to contact the nearest

Health Institutions to get themselves vaccinated.

Those who were positive with COVID-19 should get their vaccine administered after 90 days only.

the COVID situation. The Director (RD) has taken all necessary steps to control the situation on war-footing and ensure the containment measures. A total of 127 staff from various Departments has been engaged for field surveillance, who are conducting door to door survey and collecting information regarding the health status. Further, two teams consisting of 17 staff have



also been formed to act as Supervisors and Coordinators for collecting the information from the field staffs for providing medical guidance, medicines and other required help/guidance to the public.

During his visit to Little Andaman, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate (SA) had instructed the officers deputed there to ensure that all essential supplies are delivered door to door and no inconvenience is caused to the general public in any manner, which has also been ensured by the officials. The field surveillance staff have successfully covered the entire households of Little Andaman within two days. During the door to door survey, so far 103 ILI/SARI cases were detected and all the symptomatic cases were provided with medicine kits. The DM (SA) has expressed his happiness over the dedication and commitment shown by the field staffs, medical staff and also lauded the cooperation of the Ex-PRIs, community leaders and general public in supporting the efforts of the Administration, which would definitely help contain the present COVID situation in the Island, a press release from District Magistrate (SA) said.

reports are awaited. He also stated that during the RAT conducted on 192 passengers proceeding to N&M Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been detected. He said, that today till 3 pm, 382 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 330 were in the age group of 18-44 and the rest were above 45 plus age group.

The Deputy Director, G.B Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De disclosed that the Govt. of India has provided 3080 doses of vaccine for A&N Islands. He further disclosed that 12 COVID positive patients are presently undergoing treatment in the G.B Pant Hospital. Today, 1 COVID patient was discharged. He further informed that out of the 12 patients, 10 patients are on Oxygen support and no patient is on ventilator, he added. He further informed that in the three COVID Care Centres functioning in Port Blair, 1 new patient was admitted today. Altogether, 6 patients are presently being taken care of in these three COVID Care Centres while in COVID Care Centre at Wimberlygunj, only 2 patients are being taken care of, he added.

The withdrawal of one vehicle ferry vessel may lead to disruption in free tranship movement of vehicles through the vehicle ferry vessels in the above route, which is regretted. Nevertheless, the Directorate is making all efforts to repair the breakdown vessel at the earliest, however, till such time the commuters travelling to North and Middle Andaman have been advised to cooperate and plan their journey accordingly, so as to avoid inconvenience and difficulty, a press release from DSS said.

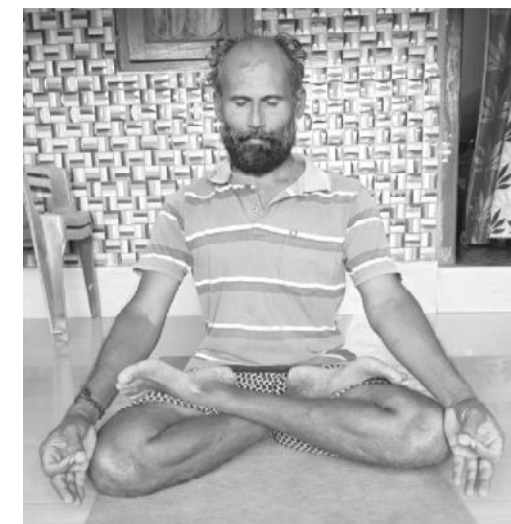

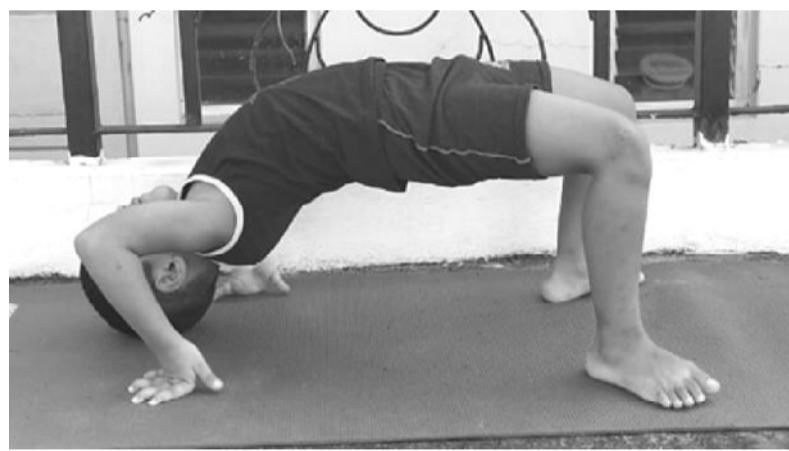

provision stores, vegetable shops, shops dealing with food, groceries, fruits, dairy and milk booth/shop, meat and fish, animal feed/fodder, bakeries shall be allowed to open between 6 am to 1 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate.

No movement of men and material other than the time fixed for opening of shops between 6 am to 1 pm shall be allowed. Movement shall be allowed for emergency cases, medical emergencies, pregnant women and patients availing medical services.

Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Travel of persons after 1 pm shall be allowed to proceed to their destinations at mainland on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/drop after 1 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 1 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Electricity, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 1 pm on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. The concerned department should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces.

Movement of persons going for COVID vaccination after 1 pm shall be permitted subject to production of acknowledgment slip/SMS.

Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 1 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in Private security services, Cable services, Internet service providers, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, e-commerce activities, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed till 6 pm on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. The concerned organization should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 1 pm. Movement of bare minimum private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 1 pm on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate. Godowns and allied establishments shall be permitted to operate beyond 1 pm till 6 pm for non-business purposes and shall not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/discharging of stocks etc. shall be permitted. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.50,000/-.

Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 6 pm only. Persons involved in distribution of milk shall be permitted till 6 pm on production of e-passes already issued/ to be issued by the Office of District Magistrate. In-situ construction activities shall be permitted, but no movement of labourers is permitted out of the work site. Contractor/Manager will be held responsible for any violation of the provisions and shall be liable for fine of Rs.50,000/- and impoundment of vehicle carrying labourers.

Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects shall be permitted with the permission of the District Magistrate. Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed between 8 am to 9 pm on production of e-passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Shops dealing with non-essential items shall be allowed to open on Saturday, Sunday and Monday between 6 am to 1 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Commercial vehicles such as Autos and Taxis shall be permitted to ply between 6 am to 1 pm only with maximum two passengers.

The e-passes issued by the Office of the District Magistrate to individuals for movement after 1pm involved in various activities/services shall be revalidated automatically and such individuals need not apply for fresh e-passes.

e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which the application will be summarily rejected.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services. Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and fine shall also be imposed as per order issued by the Office of District Magistrate South Andaman from time to time. The order to this effect issued by the District Magistrate (SA) shall come into effect from 22nd June, 2021 and shall remain in force till 28th June, 2021.

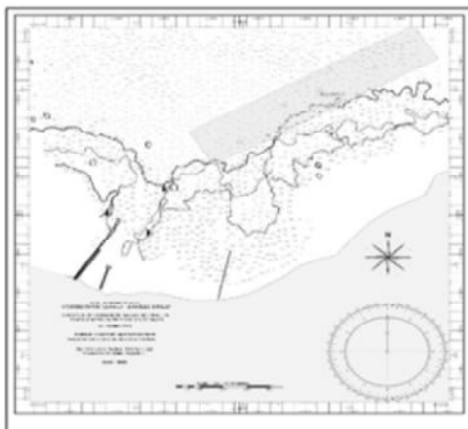
A&N command celebrates World Hydrography Day...

The CINCAN appreciated the yeoman service by the Indian Naval Hydrographic Organisation in capacity building initiatives among littorals in the Indian Ocean Region through hydrographic surveys and providing world class training to personnel from friendly foreign nations. The surveys help in augmenting the Sagarmala project under the NITI AAYOG for sustainable development of A&N Islands.

The Hydrographic Survey Unit at Port Blair under HQ ANC is responsible for the surveys around the A&N Islands and is fully equipped with state-of-the-art equipment for the conduct, analysis and preparation of reports of hydrographic surveys. HSU (PBR) participates in various joint operations with the Indian Army and Indian Air Force within the Andaman and Nicobar Command. The Unit has successfully conducted surveys for RCS 3.0 - UDAN, the prestigious Government of India project under regional connectivity by playing a vital role in identifying suitable sea plane landing sites at four locations in the Andaman group of islands at Shaheed Dweep, Swaraj Dweep, Hut Bay and Long Island, which will boost regional connectivity and tourism.

Indian Navy hydrography ships Sutlej from Southern Naval Command and Nirupak from Eastern Naval Command are currently deployed for hydrographic survey in Andaman and Nicobar Islands since April 2021. These ships utilize state-of-the-art Multi-beam Bathymetric Data Acquisition Systems to survey and update navigational charts of the A&N Islands. Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs. 4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 10000/- for overcrowding in shops/establishments, along with sealing of shop for 14 days. The establishments listed above shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of atleast one meter from a person and not allowing more than 5 persons at a time inside the premises. The said premises shall remain open on all days between 6 am to 1 pm. All remaining shops are permitted to open on all Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays between 6 am to 1 pm. All shops shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of atleast one meter from a person and not allowing more than 03 persons at a time inside the premises. Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs.4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 10000/- for overcrowding in shops/ establishments, along with sealing of shop for 14 days.

No movement of public beyond these timings will be allowed except for:

Hospitals, medical labs, medicines and medical equipment, ambulance and hearse vehicle services, medical and its allied activities, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted. Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, Home Guards, Electricity, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/officials, certified by the Head of Department, involved in providing essential and emergency services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication, Courts as per orders of High Court and E-commerce activities shall be permitted on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in providing Broadcasting and Cable services, Internet service providers, all print and electronic media persons, private security services, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/ Godown, ATMs, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed for which valid passes shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate based on the certification from the concerned organisation. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner/Incharge of the shop/ business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the movement passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the Owner/Incharge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 1 pm for general public and only for essential services and vehicles carrying essential cargo shall be permitted up to 6 pm.

In-situ construction activities shall be permitted, but no movement of labourers is permitted out of the work site. Contractor/Manager will be held responsible for any violation of the provisions and shall be liable for fine of Rs.25,000/- and impoundment of vehicle carrying labourers. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects shall be permitted with the permission of the District Magistrate.

Godowns and allied establishments shall be permitted to operate beyond 10 am till 6 pm for non-business purposes and shall not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/discharging of stocks etc. shall be permitted. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.25,000/- . Persons involved in distribution of milk shall be permitted till 6 pm on production of valid passes already issued/to be issued by the office of the District Magistrate.


The movement passes issued by the District Administration from 22nd May, 2021 onwards shall remain valid. Social/ Political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious/ festival related and other gathering and congregations shall be prohibited. All religious places/ places of worship shall be closed for public worship. Further religious congregations/gatherings are strictly prohibited. Any person/organisation violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 10,000/-, which shall be payable by the Management Committee.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.


Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s). This order shall come into force with effect from 22nd June, 2021 till further orders.
