Single window clearance system in place for investors: Chief Secretary

A conference on 'Andaman & Nicobar Islands: Growth Opportunities', was held in the conference hall of the Fortune Resort Bay Island here this evening. The conference was organized by the Confederation of Indian Industry, Eastern Region in which the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray and the Commander-in-Chief, A&N Command, Vice Admiral Pradeep Kumar Chatterjee were the guests of honour. The Chief Secretary, Shri Anand Prakash was the special guest on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the Member of Parliament expressed his happiness that members from the CII have converged into these Islands to know more about the prospects of investments here. Doing



business in Andaman is very easy as there is no hindrance at any level as compared to mainland, he said. India vs Australia: 5th ODI at Sydney

Sydney, Jan 22
India are staring down the barrel of an embarrassing whitewash after losing the first four contests of their five-game ODI series with Australia. With just 72 runs required from 75 balls and nine wickets in the bank, India should never have lost the Canberra ODI. Thanks to Kane Richardson, John Hastings and a collapse that saw nine wickets fall for just 46 runs, the possibility of a humiliating 5-0 scoreline is still on the cards at the SCG. Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma are the two leading scorers in the series, while Shikhar Dhawan's

ton in the Australian capital was the fifth century registered by an Indian player over the four games. What's more, India have produced totals of 309, 308, 295 and 323, scores with which one would usually expect to win more games. But Australia has shown what Men in Blue can do they can do better. The Baggy Greens are so dominant on their own turf that their win at Canberra means they're unbeaten over their last 19 home games, which is a world record. A staggering fact considering the fine lines that often decide ODI games. India have a record breaker of their

own, too, of course. Kohli's ton at Canberra was his 25th in ODI cricket and came from just 162 innings. But even Kohli's flashing blade doesn't seem to be able to stop the rampant Baggy Greens, who, despite integrating a handful of new players, seem unstoppable at the moment. MS Dhoni's men's one hope is that Australia, with the series already done and dusted, take their foot off the gas and allow their opponents a chance. These two countries have contested 122 ODIs in total with Australia boasting a 72-40 advantage over India.

The Vice President (Fleet Personnel) SCI, Kolkata was parralely contacted over phone in the morning of 21st Jan and was explained the factual position and thereafter requested to make necessary arrangements for repatriation of Shri Lokanadham. SUH from Oman at the earliest to enable him to attend the last rites of his mother. The Vice President of SCI immediately thereafter through an E-Mail directed the SCI representative and the Ship Staff to contact the agent of SCI in Oman for immediate completion of the formalities so that the individual is repatriated to Port Blair at the earliest. The Agent of SCI at Oman took immediate necessary action for completing all formalities from the Embassy Office which is about 600 KM far from the Drydock (DUQM.)

Knowing the fact that Friday is a holiday at Oman the SCI agent drove to Muscat (600 KM) with all required documents on the same day ie on 21.01.2016 and the VISA formalities were completed expeditiously on the same day. With VISA in hand, the SCI agent drove back to Ship (600 KM) so that Shri Lokanadham could then come out of the Ship to catch the Flight. As the Flights operate from Muscat the distance of 600 KM had to be covered again by Shri Lokanadham to catch the Flight. Shri Lokanadham is scheduled to arrive Chennai in the early hours of 23.01.2016 and by about 13:30 hrs. at Port Blair by Jet Airways on the same day. The above sequence of events clearly brings out all out efforts made both by A & N Administration and SCI to repatriate Shri. Lokanadham to Port Blair from Oman to be able to attend the last rites of his mother, the Director, Shipping Services added in the press release.
