

Health Ministry to launch population based prevention, screening and control programme for five non-communicable diseases

New Delhi, Jan 22
Non-Communicable diseases (NCDs) which are Cardiovascular Diseases (CVDs) such as heart attacks and stroke, Diabetes, Chronic Respiratory Diseases (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Diseases and Asthma) and Cancer inter alia account for over 60% of all mortality in India. Of these, nearly 55% are premature mortality. This imposes a financial and social cost on families and the country. According to the World Economic Forum, India stands to lose \$ 4.58 trillion (Rs 311.94 trillion between 2012 and 2030 due to non-communicable diseases.

Since these conditions do not exhibit symptoms until complications set in, it is essential to detect them early. Early detection of NCDs not only enables onset of treatment but prevents high financial costs and suffering. For some cancers, survival rates are good when they are detected and treated in the early stages. Screening for these conditions, which can be undertaken at the level of the Sub Centre or Primary Health Centres helps early detection and also serves to raise health awareness among people to lead healthy lifestyles. Given that primary health care, including prevention and

health promotion can lead to improved health and developmental outcomes at much lower cost, the Ministry is now expanding access to prevention and primary care services. As part of the National Health Mission, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare is launching

population based prevention, screening and control programme for five common non-communicable diseases, namely Hypertension, Diabetes, and Cancers of oral cavity, breast and cervix. On February 4th coinciding with World Cancer Day, Union Health

and Family Welfare Minister is expected to launch the programme. The training of frontline workers- the ASHA and ANM which will be initiated and in some sub-centres, population based screening will also start. Detailed protocols for

Cooperative banks can't accept deposits under PMGKY: Govt

New Delhi, Jan 22
Government has clarified that Co-operative Banks are not authorised to accept deposits under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Deposit Scheme (PMGKDS). The scheme allows assesses to

disclose previously unaccounted and undeclared income under its ambit. The PMGKDS permits voluntary declarations of previously undisclosed income with an effective tax rate of 50% and requires assesses to

deposit a further 25% of such wealth into a four-year interest-free deposit. The scheme was launched on 17th of last month and will remain open for declarations upto 31st March this year.

Fit-again Saina lifts Malaysia Masters Grand Prix Gold

Sarawak (Malaysia), Jan 22
Indian badminton ace Saina Nehwal notched up her first title after a career-threatening injury by claiming the Malaysia Masters Grand Prix Gold with a hard-fought victory in the summit clash here on Sunday. Up against 18-year-old Thai Pompawee Chochuwong, the top-seeded London Olympics bronze-medallist triumphed 22-20 22-20 in a 46-minute clash. This was her 23rd title overall and the first after last year's Australian Open. The 26-year-old world No.10, who had been desperately looking for a title that boosts her confidence after recovering from a knee surgery last year, was squaring off against a rival ranked more than 50 places below her at 67th.



The two were meeting for the first time in the circuit and Saina was on the backfoot in the opening game when Chochuwong reeled off four consecutive points to grab the early initiative. Chochuwong maintained the advantage going forward and was placed 11-5 at the break. However, Saina narrowed the gap to make it 10-13 before drawing level at 19-19 and then saving a game point. Chochuwong could not handle the pressure thereafter as Saina drew from her experience to clinch the opening game after a 20-minute slog. In the second game as well, Chochuwong was quicker off the blocks with a 3-0 lead but this time Saina did not leave it for too late and took the lead at 7-5.

The Thai teenager, however, drew level at 8-8 and 11-11 but Saina did not allow her to clinch the momentum. The Hyderabad remained in the lead, albeit slender, before blowing away four match points to help Chochuwong draw level at 20-20. But the Indian managed to get over the hiccup and wrap up the issue soon after for what would be a massive morale-booster for her.

David Warner ton sets up Australia's series win

Sydney, Jan 22
David Warner's SCG love affair continued with another dynamic century during the fourth One-Day International (ODI) against Pakistan on Sunday (January 22) to propel Australia to an 86-run win and a series victory with one match to spare. Warner's 119-ball 130 was the catalyst of Australia's mammoth 353 for 6 with Pakistan falling well short to be bowled out for 267 in the 44th over.

It continued Warner's astounding form at the SCG after his momentous Test match there earlier this month where he scored a century in the opening session of the match and notched the fastest half-century in Australian Test history in the second dig. His latest SCG special was his 12th career ODI century, with eight of them having come in the past 12 months.

Australian Open: Leander Paes Wins, Sania Mirza Loses



Melbourne, Jan 22
It was a mixed Sunday for Indian tennis players taking part at the Australian Open. While legendary Leander Paes won his mixed doubles opener at Melbourne Park, Sania Mirza failed to progress in women's doubles, losing the third round encounter. Veteran Paes and Switzerland's Martina Hingis won their first match against Australians Destanee Aiava and Marc Polmans 6-4, 6-3 to progress to the second round in Melbourne. The Indo-Swiss duo took 51 minutes to pull off a straight sets win with the help of two aces. They had 20 winners and committed nine unforced errors to their opponents' 15 winners and 12 unforced errors. However, Sania was in for disappointment as the Indian, partnering Barbora Strycova of Czech Republic, lost to Japanese E Hozumi and M Kato 3-6, 6-2, 2-6 in a third round match that lasted one hour and 53 minutes. Sania and Barbora were seeded fourth in the year's first Grand Slam tournament. In mixed doubles though, Sania and Croatia's Ivan Dodig are in the second round, as well as Rohan Bopanna, both of whom won their matches on Saturday.

India-Bangladesh one-off Test postponed to February 9

New Delhi, Jan 22
Bangladesh's one-off Test match against India scheduled to be held at the Rajiv Gandhi International Stadium in Hyderabad has been postponed by one day. It was initially slated to start on Wednesday (February 8), but now the match will commence on the next day. "The Test was originally meant to start on a Wednesday. So we thought it would be better on all fronts if it starts on a Thursday and we could get crowds in for the Test," ESPNcricinfo quoted a BCCI official as saying. Despite being granted Test status in 2000, Bangladesh haven't played a Test in India. However, they have toured India to partake in various tournaments, including the World T20, 2016. Bangladesh also participated in the Asia Cup hosted by India in 1990, they were invited to take part in a tri-series also involving Kenya and India in 1998 and played the Champions Trophy that was held by the Asian nation in 2006. Bangladesh, who are currently touring New Zealand, are expected to return home on January 26.

Australian Open: Andy Murray dumped out by Mischa Zverev

Melbourne, Jan 22
In Tennis, world number one Andy Murray today made a shock exit from the Australian Open, the first Grand Slam of the season, at Melbourne. In the fourth round game, Murray was stunned by an unseeded German Mischa Zverev, 5-7, 7-5, 2-6, 4-6.



World number two Novak Djokovic has already bowed out of the tournament. Roger Federer will be seen in action against Kei Nishikori for a last-8 berth later today. In the other Singles matches, 8th seed Svetlana Kuznetsova of Russia made an exit, while Stanislas Wawrinka and Venus Williams advanced to the quarter-finals. In Women's Doubles, the fourth seeded Indo-Czech pair of Sania Mirza and Barbora Strycova crashed out in the third round after losing to the unseeded Japanese team of Eri Hozumi and Miyu Kato, 3-6, 6-

New Delhi, Jan 22
The table tennis fans are in for a real treat with India set to host its first ever ITTF World Tour event here from February 14-19. 11Even Sports, a company promoting table tennis in the country has won the bid to host the India Open, which will be the second leg of the ITTF World Tour. The first of the 12 leg tour is currently being played in Budapest, Hungary. The tournament will carry prize money of USD 120,000, the highest offering for a table tennis tournament in India. Other countries to host the ITTF 2017 World Tour are Hungary (19-22 Jan); Qatar (23-26 Feb); Tokyo (16-18 June); Korea (20-23 April); China (22-

25 June); Australia (29 June-2 July); Czech Republic (24-27 Aug); Austria (1-3 Sept); Bulgaria (7-10 Sept); Germany (10-12 Nov) and Sweden (16-19 Nov). The best paddlers in the world compete for glory and World Tour Standing points at the events with the top 16 making the cut for the World Tour Finals. "The Seamaster ITTF 2017 World Tour India Open offers an excellent opportunity to position India on the global table tennis map," said Vita Dani, 11Even Sports chairperson. treatment, referrals and follow-up on these disease conditions will be provided. In the first phase, the population based screening component will be rolled out in 100 districts in 32 states and UTs with about 1000 sub-centres undertaking screening before March 31st of this year. ASHAs will also be capturing information on major risk factors so that persons at risk could be counselled on leading healthy lifestyles to prevent onset of NCDs. In subsequent phases, Chronic Obstructive Respiratory diseases will be included and the programme will be scaled up to cover other districts. Support to states will also be provided for community health promotion and prevention efforts, and referral and treatment.
