PM stresses on permanent solutions to tackle water scarcity & drought

New Delhi, May 22
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has called for taking holistic view on water conservation and environment preservation. Speaking in the 20th edition of Mann Ki Baat programme on All India Radio today, Shri Modi stressed on permanent solutions to tackle water scarcity and drought in several parts of the



country.

In his over half an hour address to the nation, he said, there should be more focus on per drop more crop, micro and drip irrigation and optimum utilization of traditional sources of water including ponds. He asked countrymen to use technology and perfect planning in water conservation.

He said, people's participation in these efforts can become foundation of success. Referring to his meetings with Chief Ministers of 11 drought-hit states, he appreciated the various programmes launched by Maharashtra, Gujarat, Chattisgarh, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan. Speaking on the recent massive forest fire in Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, the Prime Minister said, carelessness

and dry leaves were the main cause of the fire. He said, protecting forest and saving water is everyone's duty.

Congratulating the successful students in various board examinations whose results were declared recently, Shri Modi consoled non-successful students saying this is not the end of the road. He advised them to identify and focus on their strength.

Shri Modi called upon the people to promote cashless transactions through Jan Dhan, Aadhar and Mobile (JAM) to move forward to cashless society. Referring to employment of 1.25 lakh Banking Correspondents, the Prime Minister said, it is his government's resolve to bring banking services to people's doorsteps. He said, post-offices are also being sensitized to serve as a banking institutions. He said, these measures will bring transparency and put a check on the use of black money.

ISRO's first ever 'Made-in-India' space shuttle all set for launch today

New Delhi, May 22
The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) will make history with the launch of its indigenous 'space shuttle' which is fully 'Made-in-India'. ISRO is going to launch tomorrow its very first Reusable Satellite Launch Vehicle Technology Demonstrator (RLV-TD). RLV-TD is a step towards the historic launch of the advanced RLV by 2020. In March this year, the integration of the space shuttle parts with electronic tests was done. VSSC Director K Sivan said that RLV-TD is at Sriharikota spaceport and the final mission readiness tests are being conducted for its maiden launch on Monday.



Current RLV-TD incurs a project cost of Rs 95 crore. The advanced RLV with ABPS uses atmospheric air as oxidizer for combustion, with vehicle fuel to propel the rocket, and it can bring down space travel cost by 110th and eventually by 1100th later.

Anurag Thakur unanimously elected as new BCCI President



Anurag Thakur has been elected as the new President of the Board of Control for Cricket in India. The 41-year-old Thakur was elected unanimously at a special general meeting Sunday to replace Shashank Manohar, who quit the position this month to become Chairman of the International Cricket Council.

Mumbai, May 22
Anurag Thakur was on Sunday unanimously elected as the BCCI president, while Ajay Shirke was chosen as secretary in a smooth change of guard at a time when the world's richest Board is sailing through choppy waters. The 41-year-old Thakur replaced Shashank Manohar who quit the position to take up the ICC chairman's job. The Maharashtra Cricket Association chief and business magnate Shirke expectedly filled in the secretary's post which was left vacant by Thakur's resignation on Saturday. Senior BCCI vice-president CK Khanna chaired the Mary Kom, Sarita Devi fail to qualify for Rio

Special General Meeting (SGM) and announced Thakur's name for the top job.

Manohar's exit from the top post barely seven months into his tenure had necessitated the election of the new chief of the world's richest and most powerful cricket body. Thakur, who resigned as the secretary of the Board, got the signatures of all six east zone units in his BCCI presidential nomination form on Saturday, paving the way for his unanimous choice as the 34th President of the august cricket body. In a show of solidarity on Saturday, all the six east units - Cricket Association of Bengal, Assam CA, Tripura CA, NCC and Jharkhand SCA - had signed

his nomination papers even though the rules required only one unit to nominate the name of the presidential candidate. It was the East zone's turn this time. Maharashtra Cricket Association chief and business magnate Ajay Shirke, who was top-contender for the post, has also been unanimously appointed as the secretary of the Board. The BJP MP from Hamirpur in Himachal Pradesh will be taking over the reins of the embattled Board in rather tough times as the BCCI is facing heat from the Supreme Court to implement the Justice R M Lodha Committee's recommendations for sweeping reforms. Thakur, incidentally, will go into the books as the first first-class cricketer to turn BCCI

president after Raj Singh Dungarpur lay down office in 1998-99. Although cricket legend Sunil Gavaskar had held the post jointly with another Test cricketer Shivlal Yadav briefly, specifically in charge of IPL affairs, that had been done at the direction of the Supreme Court which ordered then President N Srinivasan to step aside in the wake of the 2013 IPL betting and spot-fixing scandal. While Dungarpur had played 86 first-class matches for Rajasthan and the then Madhya Bharat as a medium pacer and also claimed 206 wickets, Thakur has represented HP in a lone Ranji Trophy game as a right-hand batsman and off break bowler in 2000-11 season.

Shooter Jitu Rai finishes fourth in Munich World Cup

New Delhi, May 22
India's pistol ace Jitu Rai reached his third final in as many International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cups this year, confirming he is in good shape with just over two months to go for the Rio 2016 summer Olympics. On competition day two of the ISSF World Cup (rifle/pistol) at Munich's Olympic Shooting Range, Jitu finished fourth in his favourite men's 50m pistol event. Anisa Sayyed in the women's 25m pistol also reached her second World Cup final round in two years and finished sixth overall, rounding off a good day for India which saw a representative in each of the two finals listed for the day. Jitu was struggling as he began

his qualification round in the 50m pistol, but high scores of 95 each in his third and fifth 10 shot relays saw him register a score of 560 at the end of six relays to qualify for the finals in eighth position. In familiar territory, Jitu started well, being in second position for a little while before a low round of scores saw him finish outside the medals. Spain's Pablo Carrera won Gold while former Olympic Champions Wei Pang of China and Jongoh Jin of Korea won the Silver and Bronze medals respectively. In the women's 25m pistol Anisa, who had ended the precision stage of qualification yesterday in 12th position shot a brilliant rapid fire round today to qualify for the final

round in eighth position with a score of 582. In the first competition stage of the final round, Anisa shot 13 out of 25 hits to go into a shoot-off with two others for a place in the Bronze medal match-up. She, however, was first to be eliminated and ended a credible sixth. The Gold medal in the event went to Jingjing Zhang of China while Olena Kostevych of Ukraine won the Silver. Naphaswan Yangpaibon of Thailand won the Bronze. Day three of competition will see the finals of the men's 50m rifle prone and men's 25m rapid fire pistol events. Indian hopes in the events will be carried by Gagan Narang and Gurpreet Singh respectively.

Mohun Bagan floors Aizawl, wins 14th Fed Cup title

Kolkata, May 22
Mohun Bagan perfected a spectacular second-half resurgence to floor Aizawl FC by a record 5-0 margin and regain the Federation Cup football title after eight years, at the Indira Gandhi Stadium here on Saturday. Prominent Figuring prominently in Bagan's win with two goals was Mizoram striker Jeje Lalpekhlua while Haitian Sony Norde, Dhanachandra Singh and Bikramjit Singh scored one each. Aizawl, which had surprised everyone with a series of outstanding performances including the vanquishing of I-League champion Bengaluru FC, had to submit to Bagan's supremacy.

The Kolkata giant produced one of its finest runs of success, scoring 17 goals and conceding just two in the five matches it played in the tournament and in the process extending the record of winning the title to 14. The last time Bagan had won the title was in 2008, when it beat Dempo 1-0 at home. Bagan, which had struggled in a barren first half, made a fantastic turnaround after the break. Fine understanding between Sony and Jeje found the latter chipping down a long floater from Bikramjit Singh. Sony finished with a sharp first-timer to beat Aizawl goalkeeper Soram Poirei in the 48th minute.

Ashwin retains No. 2 spot in Test bowlers ranking

Dubai, May 22
Off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin has managed to retain his second spot in the latest ICC Player Rankings for Test Bowlers issued on Sunday, while no Indian features in the top 10 batsmen list. Ashwin (871) trails England's Stuart Broad (872) by just a point while another Englishman James Anderson has returned to the top three following his 10-wicket haul at Headingley against Sri Lanka to leapfrog Yasir Shah of Pakistan and South Africa's Dale Steyn. Anderson earned 49 points for

his performance, which has put him on a career-high 854 points. The ICC Player Rankings for Test batsmen is headed by Australia captain Steven Smith (925), followed by England's Joe Root (876), New Zealand skipper Kane Williamson (868), South Africa's Hashim Amla (860) and veteran Pakistan batsman Younus Khan (826). Ashwin continues to head the Test all-rounders' ranking with 406 points. Bangladesh's Shakib Al Hasan is second ahead of England's Broad.

Usain Bolt wins 100 at Golden Spike in 9.98

Barbados, May 22
Usain Bolt used his strong finish to win the 100 meters in 9.98 seconds at the Golden Spike meet. Bolt recovered from a slow start but pulled ahead in the second half of the race to breeze unchallenged to the victory. Christine Day of Jamaica took the women's 400 in 51.09 seconds, well ahead of Carline Muir of Canada who clocked 51.84 seconds while Jessica Beard of the United States had 51.88 seconds third. Sprint king Usain Bolt ramped up his preparations for the Rio

Olympics by running a sub-10 second time in the 100 metres at the Ostrava Golden Spike meeting. The Jamaican, making his second start this season and running in front of his parents, faced little competition in his annual trip to the Czech event as he ran 9.98 to finish 0.23 ahead of Ramon Gittens of Barbados. As he approaches the end of his Olympic career, Bolt is aiming for an unprecedented 'threepeat' at the Rio Games in August where he will defend his 100, 200 and 4x100 relay titles.
