ISRO successfully launches 20 satellites from Sriharikota; Prez, PM congratulate scientists

Sriharikota, Jun 22
Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) successfully launched a record 20 satellites in a single mission from Sriharikota in Andhra Pradesh this morning. Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle PSLV C-34, carrying India's latest earth observation satellite Cartosat-2 along with 19 co-passengers, lifted off from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at 9:26 AM.



These satellites include those from the US, Germany, Canada and Indonesia. With 20 satellites, the ISRO has beaten its previous record of placing 10 satellites into orbit in a single mission in 2008.

The primary satellite in this mission is the Cartosat-2. The images sent by

satellite will be used for drawing maps, urban and rural applications, coastal land use and regulation, road network monitoring and water distribution.

President Shri Pranab Mukherjee and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi have congratulated

ISRO on the launch. Shri Modi said in a tweet that India's space programme has shown time and again the transformative potential of science and technology in people's lives.

He said, India has over the years, developed expertise

and capability to help other nations in their space initiatives.

The Prime Minister also expressed happiness that students from institutions in Pune and Chennai played a role in the making of satellites.

No case of relief pending: DCSA

Port Blair, June 22
The District Office has clarified that no case of relief is kept pending in South Andaman District for more than 15 days. The District Administration is committed to provide early relief as per the norms to the persons affected by any accident. The A & N Administration has also come up with some norms of assistance through the scheme namely "A & N Islands Scheme for Providing Financial Assistance to Victims of Accidents" (who are not covered under the prevailing schemes of NDRF/SDRF norms approved by GOI).

During the inaugural function of 'Arunodaya' held at Junglighat yesterday, a citizen had raised the issue of grant of compensation to next of kin of the person died due to striking of lightning at Billyground village in North and Middle Andaman District. The Lt. Governor clarified to the citizens in the function that he has reviewed the subject of release of compensation after his joining and had instructed all concerned that relief should be given within 30 days time.

The Deputy Commissioner, North and Middle Andaman was also

contacted over phone and he has informed that no incident of death due to lightning has been reported at Billyground. However, an incident of lightning has occurred at Prafulla Nagar, Billyground, wherein lightning had struck on the ground and during which a person, who was tilling his farm was affected by the lightning. The person was provided immediate medical treatment and was discharged within two days.

Meanwhile, the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman recently (June 9) has accorded sanction for ex-gratia relief.

Honest toiler Saina Nehwal senses golden Rio opportunity

New Delhi, Jun 22
Saina Nehwal eschews the "natural talent" tag thrust upon her by Indian media and says only hard graft and good coaching have given her the chance to turn the Olympic badminton bronze she won four years ago in London into gold at the Rio Games. "Whatever I am today, it's because of my coaches," Nehwal told Reuters in an email interview following her victory at the Australian Open last week.



Chinese shuttler sat atop the women's singles rankings since Dane Tine Baun in late 2010. Nehwal, who will be 30 by the time the 2020 Olympics come around in Tokyo, believes Rio is her best chance of gold.

"They taught me smash, dribble and net game in copybook style and I trained five to six hours daily to master them. "I am a worker and my coaches know how to get the best out of me," added the 26-year-old, who became the first Indian shuttler to win an Olympic medal in 2012. While winning a medal in London was celebrated back home in success-starved India, her rise to the top of the world singles rankings in April last year was no less significant. It marked the first time a non-

"For 2020, it depends on my progress and health conditions. Rio is an ideal place to showcase my game," she said. "You can't predict results. You need hard work and God's blessing, apart from support from the fraternity," the world number six said. Rio will mark a third Olympics for Nehwal, who is hitting a rich vein of form at exactly the right time. Her second Australian Open title saw her beat world champions Ratchanok Intanon (2013) and Wang Yihan (2011)

before overpowering China's Sun Yu in the final in Sydney. "It is wonderful to win Australian Open prior to the Olympics. It is very satisfying to beat two world champions and a junior world champion (Malaysian Goh Jin Wei) in one tournament," she said. It was a welcome win for Nehwal, who had failed to reach a World Superseries final since last November in China and was returning from an Achilles injury she sustained at the end of last year.

India's L Devendro Singh enters semi-finals of Boxing World Olympic Qualifying Tournament

London, Jun 22
Indian boxers L Devendro Singh, Sumit Sangwan and Manoj Kumar are just a step away from qualifying for Rio Olympics in their respective weight category. At the International Boxing Association's World Qualifying Tournament in Baku, Azerbaijan, Commonwealth Games Silver medalist L Devendro stormed in to the semi-finals in 49 kg division yesterday. In the quarterfinals, he outbox South Africa's Banda Sibusiso 3-0.



quarterfinals yesterday. They will be through to the Rio Games if they enter the semifinals after a rest day today as five quota places are available in their weight categories. In the pre quarterfinals, while Sumit stormed past Sandaguren Erdenebayar of Mongolia 3-0, Manoj got the better of

Bulgaria's Ismetov Ayryn Smetov 3-0. Late last night, another Indian pugilist Vikas Krishan in 75 kg advanced to the pre-quarterfinals with a 3-0 win over Japan's Takahashi Makoto. He also has to make it to the semi-finals for a Rio Olympic berth.

Though Devendro is assured of a medal after the quarterfinals win but he will have to make the summit clash to qualify for Rio as only two quota places are up for grabs in the 49 kg division. Meanwhile, Sumit Sangwan in the 64 kg and Manoj Kumar in 81 kg made it to the

Spain 2-1. Earlier, Alvaro Morata had given an early lead to Spain but Croatia had equalised through Nikola Kalinic before the half time. The result means Spain finished second in Group D and will have to play Italy in the round of 16 on Monday at the Stade de France.
