Air Force Transport Plane AN-32 missing after takeoff from Airbase at Chennai

Port Blair, July 22

An IAF AN-32 transport plane operating between Tambaram (near Chennai) and Port Blair lost contact with the Air Traffic Control of Chennai at 0846 hrs. The aircraft had taken off from Tambaram at 0830h and was scheduled to arrive at Port Blair around 1140 hrs. 23 passengers who included service personnel and defence civilians were embarked on the aircraft. In addition, the Air crew consisting of six IAF personnel were also on board.

Aircraft Overdue procedures were initiated by the Command when the aircraft did not report to the ATC Port Blair. Three aircraft, ten Naval ships and four Coast Guard

Principal Director of Audit observes irregularities in purchase of two crematoriums

Port Blair, July 22

The Principal Director of Audit, Central, Kolkata has noticed in the Audit report of the period from 01.04.2009 to 31.03.2011 that the work 'setting up of the LPG Crematorium at Garacharma' was executed by the Zilla Parishad in the burning ghat situated at Garacharma. In spite of utilizing a huge amount of Rs. 72.89,360/-,

the LPG Crematorium installed, is still non-functional from the date of its installation.

The Principal Director of Audit, in their audit para, had also observed "unfruitful expenditure for Rs. 160.12 lakhs and irregularities in purchase of two crematoriums" by the Zilla Parishads.

The Administration has taken a serious view on the issue and directed the Anti-Corruption Unit to lodge an FIR and conduct an enquiry. It is

Applications invited for admission to B.A.L.L.B for the academic session 2016-2017

Port Blair, July 22

Applications have been invited from eligible candidates for admission into B.A.L.L.B Integrated 5 years Degree Course from this academic session 2016-17. The prospectus along with information brochure will be available from the Office of the Principal/OSD, Andaman Law College, Transport Bhawan, Phoenix Bay-744101 w.e.f July 26, 2016.

As per admission criteria students who have passed +2 from any stream are eligible. The minimum percentage of marks not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of the total marks in case of OBC and ST applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying examination. Candidates with compartment/supplementary in any subject in the qualifying examination will not be

eligible for admission.

Applicant of general category should not be more than 20 years of age and not more than 22 for ST/OBMC on the year of seeking admission. Altogether there are 30 seats and the seats will be allotted to various categories fixed by Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi's order no.U-14040/5/96/ANL, dated 30th may 1996.

Ramkumar advances to quarterfinals of US Challenger

Binghamton (USA), July 22
Young Indian Davis Cupper Ramkumar Ramanathan fought past Jose Statham in a three-setter to make it to the singles quarterfinals of the USD 50,000 ATP Challenger tournament, here. The 214-ranked 21-year-old Indian, who made his Davis Cup debut last week in Chandigarh against Korea, rallied to beat his Kiwi opponent 2-6 6-4 7-6(3) in two hours and 22 minutes and booked a last-eight berth in the hard court event. Ramkumar said it was a relief to win a tie-breaker after losing quite a few in the last few weeks. It was the first tie-breaker that Ramkumar managed to win having lost five in a row since Wimbledon Qualifiers. "It was a close match. The guy

had great returns and passing shots. I had to go for my serve and shots. In the third set I broke him but was broken back. I was serving for the match at 6-5 but could not seal it. It was a good tie-breaker to win after losing a few in the past few months. I am looking forward to playing the next match," Ramkumar told PTI after his match. Ramkumar took a while to settle on hard courts after playing on grass last week and found his rhythm from the second set onwards. After making it one-set apiece, Ramkumar made a fiery start to the deciding set by sending down four consecutive aces to hold at love.

It is clearly visible from the above table that the ratio of allocation of funds i.e. GP:PS:ZP:70:15:15, is being accurately maintained. In Gram Panchayats, the Budget Estimate (total allocation) in 2016-17 in GIA (Gen), Rural Road and Water Supply sectors have increased by 27.22%, 77.32% and 464.20% respectively in comparison to Final Estimate (total expenditure) in 2015-16. In Panchayat Samities, the Budget Estimate (total allocation) in 2016-17 in GIA (Gen), Rural Road and Water Supply sectors have increased by 15.06%, 5.95% and 101.50% respectively in comparison to Final Estimate (total expenditure) in 2015-16. The funds are distributed among the PRIs on the basis of Distribution Index assigned to them, taking into account, the population of the region and the Cost Index of the APWD calculated on the basis of the remoteness of the region. Accordingly, due to increase in the population of Panchayat Samities Prothrapur, Ferrargunj, Rangat and Mayabunder, their funds have increased, a communication from Directorate of RD, PRIs and ULBs said.
