## Centre to set up Medical Tourism & Wellness Board on World Tourism Day

New Delhi, Sept 22  
 Centre will set up Medical Tourism and Wellness Board on the occasion of World Tourism Day on 27th of this month. Participating in Public Speak Programme of All India Radio last night, Minister of State for Tourism and Culture, Dr Mahesh Sharma said, the Government will give a new shape to medical tourism keeping in view its importance in the country. Replying to listeners' queries, Dr. Sharma said, the Centre has accorded high priority to the safety and security of foreign tourists, particularly the women. Tourist Police has been deployed at tourist

destinations with the help of States' police to ensure the protection of foreign tourist. Dr Sharma said, the government has also started a tourist helpline 1363 to provide assistance and information to tourists. In reply to another query, Tourism and Culture Minister said the government will achieve the target of granting E-Tourist Visa to 150 countries by December this year. He said, the facility has been extended so far to 113 countries including United States of America, Germany, Australia and China to attract more foreign tourists to India. Dr Sharma also said, the government has taken cognizance of fake tourism offices operating in various

parts of the country and action is being taken against them. Replying to another question, Tourism Secretary Shri Vinod Zutshi said the Centre is making efforts to promote eco-tourism in the country with the help of States. He said, it is linked with the rural areas of the country and will generate more employment opportunities to the people of these areas. In reply to another question, Shri Zutshi said, Tourism Ministry is also promoting lesser known tourist destinations to attract more tourists at these places through theme-based tourist circuits like Swadesh Darshan Yojana.

## Safeguarding consumers' interest

### Enforcement teams of CS & CA Deptt. to conduct surprise inspection

Port Blair, Sept. 22  
 The Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs shall mobilize its enforcement team for conducting surprise inspection/raids in the entire UT to enforce various Acts/ Rules contained under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 and the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 to discourage any kind of unfair trade practices to safeguard the interest of the consumers. This Department is also a Nodal Agency for ensuring smooth functioning of District Forum & the State Commission functioning in this UT and any aggrieved consumer can lodge their

complaint in the appropriate forum for Justice which shall be disposed-off within 90 days from the date of filing of the case. In a press release received here today, the Assistant Controller (LM) has mentioned that it has come to the notice of the Department that certain Common Service Centers (CSC) are demanding money for issuance of various forms for obtaining ration cards whereas these forms are provided to all CSCs free of cost and it is mandated that all the services rendered through CSCs should be free of cost for which the Administration use to

reimburse certain fixed amount in lieu of services. The general public can obtain all types of forms required for applying ration cards from the Civil Supplies Department and other Supply Units at free of cost besides all CSCs. All the CSCs have been advised to render the services free of cost. Any such instance of demanding money from any of the citizen for providing services shall be viewed seriously and the law will take its own course, the Assistant Controller said in the release. As part of their preparations for next year's Olympic Games, India will compete against New Zealand in a six-match hockey Test series from October 2 to 11 in Auckland, Nelson and Christchurch.



"While India will play the first two matches against the New Zealand A team the last four matches will be played against the New Zealand senior men team," Hockey India said in a statement.  
For India, the Tour will be in preparation for the all-important FIH Hockey World League Final to be held in Raipur later this year, followed by the Rio Olympics slated in 2016. New Zealand, on the other hand, will seek to prepare for the upcoming Oceania Cup wherein a win there would confirm a berth for them in the Rio Olympics 2016.

**Andy Murray warned over plans to skip ATP Tour Finals for Davis Cup**

London, Sept 22  
Andy Murray has been told he is "required" to compete in the after the Scot discussed skipping the event to prepare for the Davis Cup final. After helping Great Britain reach a first Davis Cup final in 37 years by beating Australia, Murray suggested he might miss the hard-court ATP Tour Finals to prepare for the Davis Cup showpiece, which is expected to be played on clay.  
But although the Davis Cup final begins on November 27, just five days after the ATP Tour Finals conclude, ATP president Chris Kermode expects Murray to be present at London's O2 Arena. "The Barclays ATP World Tour Finals is a mandatory event on the ATP World Tour and all players who qualify, unless

injured, are required to compete in the event," Kermode said in comments quoted by several British newspapers on Tuesday. "He has had a fantastic season and earned his place among the world's top eight players to compete at the season finale. We are aware of the comments made after the Davis Cup tie in Glasgow, however our expectations are that, if fully fit, Andy would compete in this year's tournament.  
"Unless we hear otherwise via an official withdrawal, he is still entered to compete at the O2." Murray, 28, had told BBC Radio 5 live: "The O2 would obviously be a question mark for me if we were playing on the clay. I would go and train and prepare on the clay to get ready for the final.

**Indian golfer Rashid Khan looks forward to Asia-Pacific Open in Japan**

Ibaraki Prefecture, Sept 22  
Indian golfer Rashid Khan will be looking to overcome a few metal blocks and bounce back when he tees off at the Asia-Pacific Open Mitsubishi Diamond Cup, starting here on Thursday. The 24-year-old struggled earlier this year but plans to come back strongly when he makes his second appearance at the Y150 million (approximately USD 1.2 million) event sanctioned by the Asian Tour and Japan Golf Tour. The field will include a sizeable Indian golfers with the likes of SSP Chawrasia, Arjun Atwal, Rahil Gangjee, Jyoti Randhawa and Digvijay Singh. Khan, a two-time Asian Tour winner, worked with his mental

coach Aparna Jain during the off season to strengthen his game and prepare for the business-end of the Asian Tour season. "It has been more of a mental thing for me this year. When your mind is free you are more confident with your shots. I think too much sometimes.  
I need to focus on my current shot and not the next one," Khan said. Khan missed the cut in his debut appearance at the Otone Country Club, West Course last year but is confident of doing better in this year's showpiece event, which has attracted top names like Ryo Ishikawa, defending champion Hiroyuki Fujita and Thaworn Wiratchant of Thailand.

**There won't be reduction in Agri. production: Minister**

New Delhi, Sep 22  
Agriculture Minister Shri Radha Mohan Singh today assured that despite 14% deficit monsoon, there won't be any reduction in Agricultural production. The Minister said, they are setting a target of 133 million tonnes of food grain production for this Rabi season. He was speaking at the inaugural function of National Conference on Rabi Campaign on agriculture at National Agriculture Science Center, in New Delhi.

He said, in order to give boost to organic production in country, an input subsidy of 20,000 rupees per acre will be provided to farmers. The Minister said, 2015 has been declared as the International Year of Soils by the Sixty-eighth session of the United Nations General Assembly and December 5th will be celebrated as World Soil Day, by that date. He said, 14 crore farmers need to be sensitized about soil health in the country. He also stressed the need to implement Soil health card

scheme for farmers. However, majority of States participating in the conference expressed that maintaining soil health card with 190 rupees is not viable, and requested the center to increase the amount according to the market prices.
