SVPMC conducts intensive shoreline cleaning drive at Prem Nagar seashore; directions issued for immediate removal of redundant boats and vessels

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 22 The Secretary, Sri Vijaya Puram Municipal Council (SVPMC) conducted a comprehensive joint site inspection on 11th September, 2026, at Ward No. 06, 07, and 09. Following the inspection, strict directions were issued for the immediate execution of an intensive sanitation and shoreline cleaning drive alongside the seashore and the Burning Ghat area located at Prem Nagar, Ward No. 07.

The inspection revealed that a significant number of abandoned, damaged, and redundant boats and vessels left on the shoreline are causing a major public nuisance, contributing heavily to waste accumulation, and severely disrupting the natural beauty of the coastal area. Hon'ble Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation inaugurates 3rd National Conference of Anti-Narcotics Task Force Heads of States/UTs in New Delhi

Time has come to take a strong and decisive blow on narcotics, which have become a serious threat to the country and the world: Hon'ble Union Home Minister

New Delhi, Sept. 22 (PIB) Hon'ble Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah today inaugurated the 3rd National Conference of Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) Heads of States/UTs in New Delhi. On this occasion, the Hon'ble Union Home Minister launched the newly designed website of the NCB. In the two-day conference organised by the NCB, ANTF heads from 36 States and Union Territories, along with representatives of concerned Government Departments and other stakeholders, are participating.

In his address, Hon'ble Union Home Minister, Shri Amit Shah said that



under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, we have for the past five years been taking one step after another in an effort to achieve the difficult goal of a drug free India. He said that the time has now come to deliver a decisive blow against narcotics, which have become the most serious threat to the country and the world, and to achieve victory through collective efforts. Shri Shah said that by 31 December 2029, we will collectively succeed in uprooting the drug trade from India.

Shri Amit Shah said that in the past five years we have achieved success against several challenges such as terrorism in Kashmir, insurgency in the Northeast and the problem of Naxalism. The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) with the cooperation of all the states, we have ended these major problems that have confronted the country for decades. He said that the fight against drugs is the most difficult of all battles, but we cannot abandon this fight. Shri Shah said that to build a Viksit Bharat by 2047, to save

future generations and to connect the youth with India's development, the only option before us is to make India drug-free. We will have to fight this problem unitedly and with passion, and we must achieve victory.

Shri Amit Shah said that whatever we have done so far is not enough. Until the Principal of every school, the Patwari of the village, the PSI of the police station, the Director General of Police and the Chief Secretary of the State, and even the Home Secretary of the Government of India,

work in one direction, we will not achieve success. He said that today's conference is the most important because this time we will move forward towards complete victory by fixing Target, Timeline and Accountability.

Hon'ble Union Home Minister said that we now have to move from Meeting to Mission, from Reporting to Result, from Seizure to the dismantling of Networks, and from Case to Conviction. He said that until all departments of the state governments and the Government of India engage in this work, we cannot move forward.

Shri Amit Shah said that Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has set the target of building a Viksit Bharat by August 15, 2047 before the 140 crore citizens of the country, when India will be at the forefront globally in every sector. He said that if we are to achieve this goal, we cannot do so with a youth power and future generation hollowed out by addiction. He stated

Women's cricket team extends dominance, delivers India its first Gold at Asian Games 2026

Aichi-Nagoya, Sept 22

Harmanpreet Kaur-led side opened India's gold medal account at the Asian Games 2026 on Tuesday, defeating Sri Lanka in the women's cricket final at Korogi Sports Park in Nisshin to end the country's wait for a top-podium finish in Aichi-Nagoya.

The defending champions produced a dominant performance in the gold-medal clash, first posting a mammoth 216/3 after opting to bat before bowling out Sri Lanka for just 69 to seal a commanding 147-run victory.

The result gave India their first gold and seventh medal overall at the Asian Games, with the tally now standing at one gold, four silver and two bronze medals.

Smriti Mandhana, Shafali Verma and



Richa Ghosh were the architects of India's imposing total. Mandhana smashed 79 off 45 balls, while Shafali contributed 48 off 29. Richa then provided a spectacular finish,

remaining unbeaten on 49 off just 22 balls. India's batters cleared the boundary 13 times during their innings as they posted their highest-ever total in women's cricket at the Asian Games.

Mandhana and Shafali gave India a flying start, adding 99 for the opening wicket before the latter was dismissed for her brisk 48. Mandhana continued her assault and brought up her half-century before eventually falling for 79. Harmanpreet made 19, but Richa ensured there was no let-up in India's scoring rate. Her unbeaten cameo, which included six fours and three sixes, took India past the 200-run mark and set Sri Lanka a daunting target.

With the ball, India maintained their dominance. Deepti Sharma (3/6) took three wickets, while fellow spinners Shafali Verma (2/3), Shreyanka Patil (2/9) and Shree Charani (2/13) claimed two wickets each as Sri Lanka were bowled out for a modest total.

that India is the youngest country in the world, which is why the threat is also the largest for us in the global context. This is our necessity because the health, skills, labour, and thinking capacity of the youth alone can lead the country to that goal, and drugs damage all four of these capacities.

Hon'ble Union Home Minister said that for emerging challenges such as synthetic drugs, diversion of precursor chemicals, new communication technologies, dark-net, drug markets, crypto, dead-drop delivery systems, and international drug networks, a team of officers who think 'out-of-the-box' should be constituted in every state, and success should be shared and implemented across the entire nation.

Shri Amit Shah stated that the Vision Document 2026-2029 rests on four pillars: Enforcement, intelligence & operations, Control of precursor & synthetic drugs, Demand & harm reduction, and Capacity building & coordination. Over 100 targets have been categorized across these four pillars. Under the target of registering 1 lakh Nashamukt Mitras outlined in the Vision Document, various Ministries have registered 46,780 Nashamukt Mitras so far, and they are already operational. To take this campaign to the grassroots level, Nashamukt Mitras will visit 10 lakh schools, colleges, and institutions across the country in the coming days to caution the youth and sensitize campus directors.

Shri Amit Shah said that today we are discussing converting the roadmap into results, and the most crucial element of the brainstorming taking place over these two days is compassion. Our goal should be to transform the ANTF into an 'Anti-Narco Mission Command', and State Chief Secretaries will need to adopt a different approach regarding manpower, technology, budget, and other resources. The Home Minister added that the Government of India is emphasizing technology and forensics in capacity building.

Hon'ble Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation stated that instead of maintaining a seizure-centric approach, we must move forward with the objective of dismantling entire networks. Our priority, along with backward-forward investigation, must also include financial investigation and tracing digital links. Our strike must hit the funds earned by drug dealers. Shri Shah said that cartels must be targeted at three levels: the entry point, the inter-state distribution system, and the local sales networks within districts. Further, districts will be categorized into three clusters: those where drugs are manufactured or enter the country, those serving as transportation corridors, and those where consumption takes place.

Hon'ble Union Home Minister stated that we must increase the utilization of PITNDPS, as there is a strong need for it in the country. A complete roadmap from investigation to conviction must be formulated in coordination with public prosecutors. A dedicated campaign must be launched to deport foreign accused present in India and blacklist them so they can never re-enter the country. Moreover, the fugitives who are supplying drugs to the country from abroad should be caught and brought before the Indian courts. By targeting borders and production centres, all loopholes must be plugged. Every ANTF should integrate the entire process of converting information to actionable intelligence into the work culture of their respective state police force. The Hon'ble Home Minister expressed confidence that we will succeed in this fight against drugs and emerge victorious.

Participation in this national conference will assist states, departments, and agencies under the 'Whole of Government Approach' to move forward with renewed resolve to effectively combat drug trafficking across the country over the next three years.

The deliberations held during the conference will help strengthen the effective enforcement of drug control laws and make the strategies adopted to protect the country's youth from drugs more impactful. This national event will provide an effective platform to bolster a future-ready partnership between the NCB and ANTFs of States and Union Territories to tackle drug abuse and fulfil the pledge of a Nasha Mukta Bharat.

> All operational fishing boat owners and commercial boat operators must shift and anchor their vessels at least 20 metres away from the shoreline before the cleaning drive commences.

> Residents of adjoining areas must safeguard their personal belongings and dismantle any unauthorized sheds or temporary structures obstructing the work site.

The cleaning operations will be scheduled in alignment with sea tidal movements to ensure safety and maximum operational efficiency. The general public, fishermen, and commercial operators have been explicitly notified that the Sri Vijaya Puram Municipal Council (SVPMC) shall not be held responsible for any collateral damage caused to boats, vessels, structures, or any other private property remaining in the zone during the course of this enforcement and cleaning operation.

The SVPMC earnestly solicits the full cooperation of all residents and stakeholders to help restore the sanitation and natural environment of the Prem Nagar coast, a press release from SVPMC said.

Asian Games: India sweep Japan 3-0 to enter badminton men's team semifinals, assure medal



Ichinomiya, Sept 22

India secured at least a bronze medal in the men's team badminton event at the 2026 Asian Games after defeating Japan 3-0 in the quarterfinals at the Ichinomiya City Municipal Gymnasium on Tuesday. Lakshya Sen overcame a strong challenge from Kodai Naraoka in the opening singles before the doubles pairing of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty extended India's

lead. Ayush Shetty then completed the clean sweep with a straight-game win over Koki Watanabe. Lakshya had to fight back after losing the opening game 11-21. The Indian responded strongly, winning the second game 21-5 to force a decider. Naraoka regained control in the third game and opened up a five-point lead, but Lakshya fought back to level the score at 19-19 before taking the next two points to win 11-21, 21-5, 21-19.

India Beat Japan by Two Runs in Rain-Hit T20I in Nagoya

Sano, Sept 22

India narrowly avoided a historic upset, defeating hosts Japan by two runs in a rain-curtailed, five-overs-a-side one-off T20 International match at the Sano International Cricket Ground today. This was India's 200th victory in T20 Internationals, including Super Over wins. After a nearly 2.5-hour delay due to a wet outfield, India skipper Shreyas Iyer won the toss and opted to

bat first. However, Japan's spinners made the most of the conditions, restricting the visitors to 32 for 4 after five overs. Chasing 33 off 30 balls, Japan gave India a major scare and came agonisingly close to pulling off one of the biggest upsets in their cricketing

history. Washington Sundar struck twice to halt Japan's momentum, while Axar Patel kept things tight with his experience and control. The hosts managed to score 30 for 3 in five overs and eventually fell two runs short, handing India a nervy victory.

Asian Games 2026: India beat Thailand 3-2 to enter women's TT quarterfinals

Toyota City, Sept 22

India fought back from a 1-2 deficit to defeat Thailand 3-2 in the women's team table tennis Round of 16 at the Asian Games 2026 on Tuesday, with Sreeja Akula securing the win in the deciding match. India had a difficult start as Orawan Paranang recovered from two games down to beat Sreeja 7-11, 1-11, 11-9, 11-6, 12-10 and put Thailand ahead. Yashaswini Ghorpade levelled the tie with a hard-fought 3-2 victory over Suthasini Sawettabut. She won the opening game 11-8 but



dropped the next two 5-11, 7-11 before fighting back to take the fourth and fifth games 11-9, 11-9. Thailand regained the lead when Diya Chitale lost a closely contested five-game match against Jinnapan Sawettabut. Chitale had a match point at 10-9 in the deciding game, but Jinnapan held her nerve to win 13-11. The match ended 7-11, 11-5, 11-7, 7-11, 11-13.

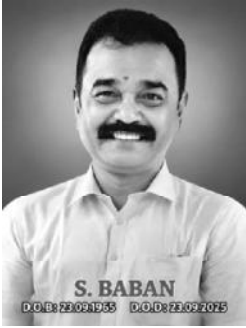
