## CAA, NRC have nothing to do with people of any religion: PM

New Delhi, Dec 22 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has appealed to the people to shun violence and not damage public property saying that the Citizenship Amendment Act and National Register of Citizens (NRC) have nothing to do with the people of a particular religion. He also clarified that the government has not taken any decision on NRC, which is related to Assam State.

Addressing a rally at Ramlila ground in New Delhi today, Shri Modi said, the Citizenship Amendment Act was



aimed at giving citizenship to the persecuted minorities who migrated to India from neighbouring countries. Referring to various

developmental schemes undertaken by his government, Shri Modi said, people from all sections of the society are the beneficiaries. He said, there is no

discrimination on the basis of caste and religion. In this context, he said 70 lakh people were benefited under the Central health scheme Ayushman Bharat. He said, over 40 lakh residents in the national capital have seen a new ray of hope following the regularization of the unauthorized colonies.

The rally was organised to thank Prime Minister as a gesture of gratitude for the Centre's role in regularizing the 1731 unauthorised colonies in the national capital housing over 40 lakh people.

#### Floriculture cultivation - way to livelihood earning

Meet Smti. Jothi Prabha Soreng, a woman farmer from Ramnagar, Caddlegunj, who by adopting the technology of ICAR-CIARI has been successful in cultivating marigold in her field. She has procured the planting material of marigold from ICAR-CIARI and was also trained in technology of growing marigold by the scientists of ICAR-CIARI.

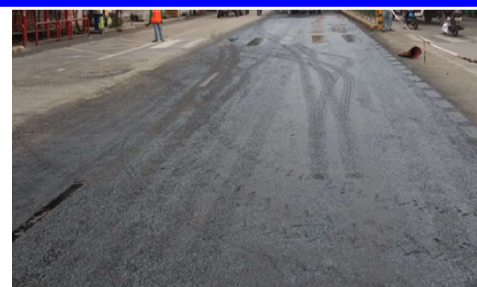
Recently, a field day was conducted by ICAR-CIARI at the farmer's field to share her success story with other farm women and Self Help Groups. During the field day visit, Dr. V. Baskaran, Principal Scientist briefed the participants about the technology for growing marigold while Dr. Zamir Ahmed, Principal Scientist detailed about the market linkage for successful income generation in flower crops.

Sharing her success story, Smti. Jothi said she has utilized the pinched terminal stem cuttings for further planting material production. Within 200 m2 area, she is harvesting about 3 to 4 Kgs of marigold flowers once in two days with an income of Rs 20,000 in two months. The crop is still yielding flowers.

### Coast Guard apprehends six Myanmarse with banned contraband

## Preliminary investigation reveals the substance as 'Methaqualone': ICGG MV Pathak



Port Blair, Dec 22

The Indian Coast Guard Region (A&N) in a swift sea - air coordinated operation apprehended six Myanmarse personnel with banned contraband approximately 125 nautical miles East of Little Andaman. Briefing media persons, the Commander Coast Guard Region (A&N) Inspector General MV Pathak today stated that the total weight of the contraband seized is 371 Kgs (approx.) and each packet contains suspicious white crystalline substance. IG Coast Guard informed that the seized contraband is worth



approximately Rs. 185 crores in the International market. Indian Coast Guard Ship has detained the Myanmarse boat for violations under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985

Shri Pathak disclosed that the CG ship carried out preliminary investigation with the available drug detection kit and found

**Nikhat Zareen selected for boxing trials of Olympic qualifiers**

New Delhi, Dec 22  
Nikhat Zareen was named among the Indian women boxers who will participate in the two-day trials scheduled for the Olympic qualifiers to be held at the Indira Gandhi Stadium from December 27. After the selection committee meeting in New Delhi, Nikhat from Telangana was handed the fourth spot in the 51 kg category which already has the six-time World Champion MC Mary Kom, RSPB's Jyoti Gulia and Haryana's Ritu Grewal as other contenders. Mary Kom has been ranked one, Nikhat was given a second ranking, while Jyoti and Ritu have been ranked third and fourth respectively. According to the Boxing Federation of India (BFI), boxers ranked 1 and 4 will fight and boxers ranked 2 and 3 will play against each other.



"The winners of each bout will make it to the final trial match and the winners here in each of the 5 categories will then be selected to be part of the Indian Team to participate in the Olympic Qualifiers - Asia & Oceania in Wuhan from February 3-14, 2020," BFI said in a release. Given the criteria, Nikhat will take on Jyoti, while Mary Kom will face Ritu with the winner of the two bouts set to face-off in a final trial match which will decide who makes it to the Indian team for the Olympic qualifiers. Nikhat has been demanding a trial with Mary Kom for long and was set to face the Manipuri boxer in the Big Bout League. But citing a back injury, Mary Kom had pulled out of the bout in the eleventh hour.

**Mirabai Chanu won Gold in 6th Qatar International Cup in Doha**

Doha, Dec 22  
Former world champion weightlifter Saikhom Mirabai Chanu won women's 49kg category gold medal at the 6th Qatar International Cup. The 25-year-old Chanu won gold with an effort of 194kg in the Olympic qualifying silver level event final rankings for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. The three periods of six months spread over November 2018 to April 2020 at least six events overall and in at least one gold and another silver level event. In the men's 67kg category India's Jeremy Lalrinnunga won the silver medal with a total lift of 306kg (140kg in snatch and 166kg in clean and jerk). The 2018 Commonwealth Games gold-medallist Indian managed to register only one clean lift in both the snatch and clean and jerk categories. She



managed to lift 83kg in her second attempt in snatch event but then failed to clear 87kg in her final try. In the clean and jerk section, Chanu lifted 111kg in her first attempt but was unable to heave 115kg and 116kg in her final two attempts. Anais Michel (172kg) and Manon Lorentz (165kg) won the silver and bronze medals respectively. Earlier this year at the World championship. She lifted 87kg followed by 114kg in clean and jerk for a total of 201kg. China's Jiang Huihua (212kg) won the gold. Chanu won 48kg gold at the 2017 edition in Anaheim, the USA with an overall effort of 194kgs, returned to action in February following a lower-back injury. She had missed the World Championships and Asian Games in 2018 owing to a back injury. The Manipuri clinched the gold medal in 49kg at the EGAT Cup was the first of the six Olympic qualifying events. **Maisnam Meiraba clinches Korea Jr Open Title, Sathish Kumar Karunakaran wins Bronze**

New Delhi, Dec 22  
Maisnam Meiraba Luwang lived up to his top billing as he clinched the boys singles U-19 title at the Woncheon Yonex Korea Junior Open International Challenge 2019 in Miryang, Korea on Saturday. The top seed from Manipur needed just 36 minutes to brush aside the challenge of 15th seed Lee Hak Joo of Korea in a 21-10, 21-13 win. Also claiming the bronze in the same category at this Junior International Challenge badminton tournament was eighth seed Sathish Kumar Karunakaran, who had bowed out to Luwang 16-21, 22-24 in a gritty semi-final contest on Friday. Luwang, who currently



holds the No. 9 spot in the World Junior Rankings, was impressive throughout the week and dropped just one game in six matches. This is the 16-year-old rising star's third international title this year following his triumphs at the Russian Junior White Nights 2019 and India Junior International 2019. Luwang would especially be pleased with the way he rebounded after a disappointing exit from the World Junior Championships last month, where he crashed out in the Round of 64.

ship entered Port Blair alongwith apprehended boat and crew at 8 am today. NCB team ex-Kolkata carried out the preliminary investigation and reported that the substance is believed to be banned drug Methaqualone, Shri Pathak added.



The IG further said that at about 1200 hrs on Dec 20, the CG Dornier sighted the non-Indian vessel operating east of Little Andaman. The vessel was not responding on VHF and ICGS Aruna Asaf Ali, on patrol, was diverted for investigation. At about 1800hrs on Dec 20, 2019, Aruna Asaf Ali sighted the boat 125 nautical miles from nearest land, Little Andaman. The vessel failed to stop on being challenged by the ship. The ship fired 3 warning shots in air and forced the vessel to stop. At 1815 hrs, the ship's boarding party embarked the vessel. The vessel was found to be of Myanmar origin with 6 crew onboard. Since the vessel was plying in Indian waters carrying unidentified items suspected of being contraband, the vessel was apprehended alongwith its crew. The Commander Coast Guard further informed that in the last three months, this is the second catch of contraband during independent operation conducted by Indian Coast Guard at sea in Andaman and Nicobar Region. The ever vigilant and sustained efforts by Indian Coast Guard has resulted in apprehension of seventh boat involved in violation of various laws within the Indian EEZ in last six months.
