Registration for vaccination of person aged more than 60 years, people between 45-59 years of age with co-morbid conditions begins

Beneficiaries urged to register their names; to be informed through SMS from Co-WIN portal for vaccination

Port Blair, March 1

The registration for vaccination of person aged more than 60 years, people between 45-59 years of age with co-morbid conditions with due certification from doctor, left over Health Care Workers and Frontline workers has begun today. In this regard, all the co-beneficiaries have been requested to get their

names registered in www.selfregistration.cowin.gov.in along with mobile numbers and Aadhar Card or Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC) or Photo ID card specified at the time of registration, in case of online registration. For categories with co-morbid conditions, Certificate of Co-morbidity from a registered Medical

Practitioner for citizens in the age group of 45 years to 59 years is necessary while for leftover HCWs and FLWs, Employment Certificate/ Official Identity Card- (either but with photo) is essential. They have also been advised to add in Aadhaar number while registering. The date of vaccination of the

registered beneficiaries will be declared soon as per the laid down criteria. Persons between 45-59 years of age with co-morbid conditions must have one of the other disease conditions and must be certified by a Registered Medical Practitioner for conditions viz. Heart Failure with hospital admission in past one

Guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution issued by MHA extended upto March 31 Chief Secretary issues Order for implementation of guidelines in whole of A&N Islands

Port Blair, March 1

In exercise of the powers conferred under section 10 (2) (1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Union Home Secretary and Chairman, National Executive Committee (NEC) vide Order dated 26.02.2021 has directed that the guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution issued on 27.01.2021 will be in force upto 31.03.2021.

Consequent upon this Order, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 24 (1) of the Disaster Management Act 2005, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration in the capacity as Chairperson, Union Territory Disaster

Management Executive Committee, for the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands has ordered that the Guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution issued by MHA vide order dated 27.01.2021, shall remain in force upto 31.03.2021 for the whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Deputy Commissioners and Departments concerned may issue necessary Standard Operating Procedures to implement the orders. National COVID-19 recovery rate reaches to 97.07 per cent

New Delhi, March 1
The country's COVID-19 recovery rate has reached to 97.07 per cent. During the last 24 hours, more than 11 thousand COVID patients have recovered. The total number of recoveries has gone up to over one crore seven lakh. Health Ministry said, the actual caseload currently comprises only 1.52 per cent of the total positive cases. Presently, the total number of active cases in the country is around one lakh 68 thousand. During the past 24 hours, 15 thousand 510 new cases were reported taking the total number of positive cases in the country to over one crore ten lakh. The Ministry said, currently, India's Case Fatality Rate is at 1.41 per cent, which is one of the lowest globally. During the last 24 hours, 106 deaths were reported taking the toll to one lakh 68 thousand 627. According to Indian Council of Medical Research, more than six lakh 27 thousand tests were conducted during the last 24 hours. The total number of samples tested so far has reached 21 crore 68 lakh. Scheme extended to farmers exclusively dealing with Animal Husbandry & Fisheries

Kisan Credit Card (KCC) Scheme aims at providing adequate and timely credit support from the banking system under a single window with flexible and simplified procedure to the farmers for their cultivation and other needs such as meeting short term credit requirements for cultivation of crops, post harvest expenses, produce marketing loan, consumption requirement of farmer household, working capital for maintenance of farm assets and activities allied to agriculture, investment credit requirement for agriculture & allied activities as per the provision of the scheme. The Govt. of India has taken special effort under Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan for the improvement of Agriculture which includes 100% saturation of PM-KISAN beneficiaries with KCC. The scheme has now been also extended to farmers exclusively dealing with Animal Husbandry and Fisheries. All the PM-KISAN beneficiaries who do not have Kisan Credit Card for availing credit from banks have been requested to contact the nearest Agriculture Sub-depot In-charges of their area for filling up of required form for KCC for availing the facility. A workshop was conducted on HIV/AIDS by Andaman Nicobar Aids Control Society (ANACS) at Pathargudda community hall recently. To create more awareness among the masses, a comprehensive programme of the AIDS awareness along with COVID-19 awareness has been planned in all the 24 Wards of PBMC. The programme will be conducted on rotation basis in all the existing community halls. Accordingly, the training programme for Sanitary Workers have been conceived with the mission to reach out to the last mile population for creating awareness on HIV/AIDS and its prevention. The newly conceived control measures like 'Know your Status' and 'Community Based Screening' (CBS) has been introduced to the Sanitary Workers for better receptivity of the programme. Shri Girish Kumar, AD(SPM) briefed the gathering about the symptoms and prevention of STD and the preventive measures against HIV infection. Vinesh Phogat bags Gold in Ukraine wrestling event



Ukraine, March 1
Indian wrestler Vinesh Phogat has won the gold medal in the women's 53-kg category at XXIV Outstanding Ukrainian Wrestlers and Coaches Memorial in Kyiv, Ukraine. Vinesh Phogat defeated world number seven Vanesa Kaladzinskaya of Belarus in the finals to win the gold medal and make a winning return to her first competitive outing since the Covid-19 induced lockdown. The Asian Games and Commonwealth Games gold medalist had defeated Romania's Ana A by fall in the semi-final to reach the summit clash. Vinesh has already booked a place in the Tokyo Olympics for the 53kg category. Since the coronavirus halted all competitions last year, it was the first competition of Vinesh, who is the only Indian woman wrestler to have qualified for the Tokyo Games. The 26 year old will be seen in action in the season's first ranking tournament from March 4-7 in Rome.

And whereas, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 10 (2) (1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Union Home Secretary and Chairman, National Executive Committee (NEC) vide order dated 26.02.2021 has directs that the guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution issued on 27.01.2021 will be in force upto 31.03.2021;

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 24 (1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the undersigned in the capacity as Chairperson, Union Territory Disaster Management Executive Committee, for the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands hereby orders that the Guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution issued by MHA vide order dated 27.01.2021, shall remain in force upto 31.03.2021 for the whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Deputy Commissioners and Departments concerned may issue necessary Standard Operating Procedures to implement the orders.

ORDER

In exercise of the powers, conferred under Section 10(2)(1) of the Disaster Management Act 2005, the undersigned hereby directs that guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution, issued vide Ministry of Home Affairs' Order of even number dated 27th January 2021, will remain in force upto 31st March 2021.

Guidelines for Surveillance, Containment and Caution [As per Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) Order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I (A) Dated 27th January, 2021]

The number of active cases of COVID-19 have been declining steadily over the last four months. However, with a view to consolidate the substantial gains that have been achieved against the spread of COVID-19, and to fully overcome the pandemic, there is a need to maintain caution and strictly follow the prescribed containment strategy, focussed on surveillance, containment and strict observance of the guidelines.

The following guidelines are issued to be effective from 1st February 2021.

COVID appropriate behavior

1. State/ UT Governments shall take all necessary measures to promote COVID-19 appropriate behaviour and ensure wearing of face masks, hand hygiene and social distancing.

2. The National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in Annexure I, shall be strictly followed throughout the country.

Surveillance and Containment

3. Containment Zones, if required, shall be carefully demarcated by the district authorities, at the micro level, taking into consideration the guidelines prescribed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) in this regard. Within the demarcated Containment Zones, containment measures, as prescribed by MoHFW, shall be scrupulously followed.

4. It shall be the responsibility of local district, police and municipal authorities to ensure that the prescribed Containment measures are strictly followed. State/ UT Governments shall ensure accountability of the officers concerned in this regard.

Strict adherence to the prescribed SOPs

5. All activities will be permitted outside Containment Zones. However, the following activities will be subject to strict adherence of SOPs, as indicated below:

- Social/ religious/ sports/ entertainment/ educational/ cultural/ religious gatherings, subject to SOP of the State/ UT concerned.
- Cinema halls and theatres, subject to a revised SOP to be issued by Ministry of Information & Broadcasting in consultation with MHA.
- Swimming pools, subject to a revised SOP to be issued by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MoYA&S) in consultation with MHA.
- Exhibition halls, subject to a revised SOP to be issued by the Department of Commerce in consultation with MHA.

6. For further opening up of international air travel of passengers, Ministry of Civil Aviation (MOCA) may take a decision in consultation with Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).

7. SOPs, as updated from time to time, have been prescribed for various activities. These include: movement by passenger trains; air travel; metro trains; schools; higher educational institutions; hotels and restaurants; shopping malls, multiplexes and entertainment parks; yoga centres and gymnasiums, etc. These SOPs shall be strictly enforced by the authorities concerned, who shall be responsible for their strict observance.

Local restrictions

8. There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods including those for cross land-border trade under Treaties with neighbouring countries. No separate permission/ approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements.

Protection of vulnerable persons

9. Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women, and children below the age of 10 years are advised to take necessary precautions.

Use of Aarogya Setu

10. Use of Aarogya Setu may continue on best effort basis on compatible mobile phones. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

Strict enforcement of the guidelines

11. All the District Magistrates shall strictly enforce the above measures. For the enforcement of social distancing, State/ UT Governments may, as far as possible, use the provisions of Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) of 1973.

12. Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable. Extracts of these penal provisions are at Annexure II.

Annexure I

NATIONAL DIRECTIVES FOR COVID-19 MANAGEMENT

1. **Face coverings:** Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places; in workplaces; and during transport.

2. **Social distancing:** Individuals must maintain adequate distance in public places. Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers.

3. **Spitting in public places** will be punishable with fine, as may be prescribed by the State/ UT local authority in accordance with its laws, rules or regulations. *Additional directives for Work Places*

4. **Staggering of work/ business hours** will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial & commercial establishments.

5. **Screening & hygiene:** Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash or sanitizer will be made at all entry points and of hand wash or sanitizer at exit points and common areas.

6. **Frequent sanitation** of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.

7. **Social distancing:** All persons in charge of work places will ensure adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

Annexure II

Offences and Penalties for Violation of Lockdown Measures

A. Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005

51. **Punishment for obstruction, etc.**—Whoever, without reasonable cause —

(a) obstructs any officer or employee of the Central Government or the State Government, or a person authorised by the National Authority or State Authority or District Authority in the discharge of his functions under this Act; or

(b) refuses to comply with any direction given by or on behalf of the Central Government or the State Government or the National Executive Committee or the State Executive Committee or the District Authority under this Act, shall on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year or with fine, or with both, and if such obstruction or refusal to comply with directions results in loss of lives or imminent danger thereof, shall on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years.

52. **Punishment for false claim.**—Whoever knowingly makes a claim which he knows or has reason to believe to be false for obtaining any relief, assistance, repair, reconstruction or other benefits consequent to disaster from any officer of the Central Government, the State Government, the National Authority, the State Authority or the District Authority, shall, on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, and also with fine.

53. **Punishment for misappropriation of money or materials, etc.**—Whoever, being entrusted with any money or materials, or otherwise being, in custody of, or dominion over, any money or goods, meant for providing relief in any threatening disaster situation or disaster, misappropriates or appropriates for his own use or disposes of such money or materials or any part thereof or willfully compels any other person so to do, shall on conviction be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, and also with fine.

54. **Punishment for false warning.**—Whoever makes or circulates a false alarm or warning as to disaster or its severity or magnitude, leading to panic, shall on conviction, be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to one year or with fine.

55. **Offences by Departments of the Government.**—(1) Where an offence under this Act has been committed by any Department of the Government, the head of the Department shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly unless he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where an offence under this Act has been committed by a Department of the Government and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or is attributable to any neglect on the part of, any officer, other than the head of the Department, such officer shall be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

56. **Failure of officer in duty or his connivance at the contravention of the provisions of this Act.**—Any officer, on whom any duty has been imposed by or under this Act and who ceases or refuses to perform or withdraws himself from the duties of his office shall, unless he has obtained the express written permission of his official superior or has other lawful excuse for so doing, be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year or with fine.

57. **Penalty for contravention of any order regarding requisitioning.**—If any person contravenes any order made under section 65, he shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year or with fine or with both.

58. **Offence by companies.**—(1) Where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company or body corporate, every person who at the time the offence was committed, was in charge of, and was responsible to, the company, for the conduct of the business of the company, as well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of the contravention and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly:

Provided that nothing in this sub-section shall render any such person liable to any punishment provided in this Act, if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he exercised due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company, and it is proved that the offence was committed with the consent or connivance of or is attributable to any neglect on the part of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall also, be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Explanation.—For the purpose of this section—

(a) "company" means anybody corporate and includes a firm or other association of individuals; and

(b) "director", in relation to a firm, means a partner in the firm.

59. **Previous sanction for prosecution.**—No prosecution for offences punishable under sections 55 and 56 shall be instituted except with the previous sanction of the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be, or of any officer authorised in this behalf, by general or special order, by such Government.

60. **Cognizance of offences.**—No court shall take cognizance of an offence under this Act except on a complaint made by—

(a) the National Authority, the State Authority, the Central Government, the State Government, the District Authority or any other authority or officer authorised in this behalf by that Authority or Government, as the case may be; or

(b) any person who has given notice of not less than thirty days in the manner prescribed, of the alleged offence and his intention to make a complaint to the National Authority, the State Authority, the Central Government, the State Government, the District Authority or any other authority or officer authorised as aforesaid.

B. Section 188 in the Indian Penal Code, 1860

188. **Disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant.** - Whoever, knowing that, by an order promulgated by a public servant lawfully empowered to promulgate such order, he is directed to abstain from a certain act, or to take certain order with certain property in his possession or under his management, disobeys such direction, shall, if such disobedience causes or tends to cause obstruction, annoyance or injury, or risk of obstruction, annoyance or injury, to any person lawfully employed, be punished with simple imprisonment for a term which may extend to one month or with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees, or with both; and if such disobedience causes or tends to cause danger to human life, health or safety, or causes or tends to cause a riot or affray, shall be punished with imprisonment of either

description for a term which may extend to six months, or with fine which may extend to one thousand rupees, or with both.

Explanation. - It is not necessary that the offender should intend to produce harm, or contemplate his disobedience as likely to produce harm. It is sufficient that he knows of the order which he disobeys, and that his disobedience produces, or is likely to produce, harm.

Illustration

An order is promulgated by a public servant lawfully empowered to promulgate such order, directing that a religious procession shall not pass down a certain street. A knowingly disobeys the order, and thereby causes danger of riot. A has committed the offence defined in this section.

Whereas, the use of Aadhaar as an identity document for delivery of services or benefits or subsidies simplifies the Government delivery processes, brings in transparency and efficiency, and enables beneficiaries to get their entitlements directly in a convenient and seamless manner by obviating the need to produce multiple documents to prove one's identity;

And whereas, the Department of Health Services, Andaman and Nicobar Administration (hereinafter referred to as Department) is implementing the "DULARI" Scheme (hereinafter referred to as the Scheme) for financial assistance to girl child born in the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

And whereas, under the Scheme, financial assistance in the form of fixed deposit at the time of birth, on passing VIII, X, XII and at the age of 21 years and 25 years if unmarried (hereinafter referred to as the benefit) is given to girl child of permanent inhabitants of the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands (hereinafter referred to as beneficiaries) as per the extant guidelines.

And whereas, the aforesaid Scheme involves recurring expenditure incurred from the Consolidated Fund of India;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of Section 7 of the Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and Other Subsidies, Benefits and Services) Act, 2016 (18 of 2016) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), the Lt. Governor (Administrator), the Andaman & Nicobar Islands hereby notifies the following, namely:-

1) An individual desirous of availing the benefit under the Scheme shall be hereby required to furnish proof of possession of the Aadhaar number or undergo Aadhaar authentication.

2) Any individual desirous of availing the benefit under the Scheme, who does not possess the Aadhaar number or, has not yet enrolled for Aadhaar, shall be required to make application for Aadhaarenrolment subject to the consent of her parents or guardians (in case of child beneficiary who has not completed eighteen years of age), provided that she is entitled to obtain Aadhaar as per Section 3 of the said Act and such child beneficiary shall visit any Aadhaar enrolment centre (list available at the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) website www.uidai.gov.in) to get enrolled for Aadhaar.

3) As per regulation 12 of the Aadhaar (Enrolment and Update) Regulations, 2016, the Department is required to offer Aadhaar enrolment facilities for the beneficiaries who are not yet enrolled for Aadhaar and in case there is no Aadhaar enrolment centre located in the respective Block or Tehsil, the Department shall provide Aadhaar enrolment facilities at convenient locations in coordination with the existing Registrars of UIDAI or by becoming a UIDAI Registrar themselves.

Provided that till the time Aadhaar is assigned to the individual, the benefit under the Scheme shall be given to such individuals subject to production of the following documents, namely:-

I. For children below 18 years old

(a) if the child has been enrolled after attaining the age of five years (with biometrics collection), her Aadhaar Enrolment Identification slip, or of bio-metric update identification slip; and

(b) any one of the following documents, namely:-

- (i) Birth Certificate; or Record of birth issued by the appropriate authority; or
- (ii) School identity card, duly signed by the Principal of the School, containing parent's names; and
- (c) any one of the following documents as proof of relationship of the beneficiary with the parent or legal guardian as per the extant Scheme guidelines, namely:-

(i) Birth Certificate; or Record of birth issued by the appropriate authority; or

(ii) Ration Card; or

(iii) Ex-Servicemen Contributory Health Scheme (ECHS) Card; or Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) Card; or Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) Card; or

(iv) Pension Card; or

(v) Army Canteen Card; or

(vi) any Government Family Entitlement Card; or

(vii) any other document as specified by the Department;

II. For beneficiaries 18 years and above

(ix) Certificate of identity having photo of such person issued by a Gazetted Officer or a Tehsildar on an official letter head; or

(x) any other document as specified by the Department

Provided further that the above documents shall be checked by an officer specifically designated by the Department for that purpose.

1. In order to provide benefits to the beneficiaries under the Scheme conveniently, the Department shall make all the required arrangements to ensure that wide publicity through media shall be given to the beneficiaries to make them aware of the requirement of Aadhaar under the Scheme.

2. In all cases, where Aadhaar authentication fails due to poor biometrics of the beneficiaries or due to any other reason, the following remedial mechanisms shall be adopted, namely:-

(a) in case of poor fingerprint quality, iris scan or face authentication facility shall be adopted for authentication, thereby the Department shall make provisions for iris scanners or face authentication along with finger-print authentication for delivery of benefits in seamless manner;

(b) in case the biometric authentication through fingerprints or iris scan or face authentication is not successful, wherever feasible and admissible authentication by Aadhaar One Time Password or Time-based One-Time Password with limited time validity, as the case may be, shall be offered;

(c) in all other cases where biometric or Aadhaar One Time Password or Time-based One-Time Password authentication is not possible, benefits under the Scheme may be given on the basis of physical Aadhaar letter whose authenticity can be verified through the Quick Response (QR) code printed on the Aadhaar letter and the necessary arrangement of Quick Response code reader shall be provided at the convenient locations by the Department.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained herein above, no child shall be denied benefit under the Scheme in case of failure to establish her identity by undergoing authentication, or furnishing proof of possession of Aadhaar number, or in the case of a child to whom no Aadhaar number has been assigned, producing an application for enrolment. The benefit shall be given to him by verifying his identity on the basis of other documents as mentioned in clauses I (b) and I (c) of the proviso of sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 1, and where benefit is given on the basis of such other documents, a separate register shall be maintained to record the same, which shall be reviewed and audited periodically by the Department.

4. In order to ensure that no bonafide beneficiary under the Scheme is deprived of her due benefits the Department shall follow the exception handling mechanism as specified in the Office Memorandum of Direct Benefit Transfer Mission, Cabinet Secretariat, Government of India No. D-26011/01/2017-DBT dated the 19th December, 2017 (available on <https://dbtbnar.gov.in/>).

5. This notification shall come into effect on the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.
