Administration's initiative to support wood based industries and trade link to South East Asian Countries

Clarification on amendments to wood based industries (Establishment & Regulation) Guidelines 2016

Port Blair, Mar 7

In a communication received from Office of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, A&N Islands it has been communicated that Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (SU Division), Govt. of India has issued the following clarifications on Para 6-(ii) of Gazette notifications issued on 12.09.2017 on Amendments to Wood Based Industries (Establishments & Regulation) Guidelines, 2016, and location of wood based industries.

a) Industries/processing plants not operating with a band saw or re-saw shall not require license. Industries/processing plants operating with a circular saw upto thirty centimeter diameter shall not require license. b) Industries/processing plants not using round logs of domestic origin shall not require license, irrespective of

size and type of saw.

c) Industries/processing plants using round logs of species notified as agricultural produce and/or exempted from the regime of felling and transit regulations in the concerned state/UT, shall not require license, irrespective of size and type of saw.

Clarification on location of wood based industries in respect of para-5 of Gazette notification issued on 12.09.2017 on Amendments to Wood Based Industries (Establishment & Regulation) Guidelines 2016 is as under:-

a) The guidelines on location of wood based industries with respect to nearest forest or PA boundary are applicable to only those wood based industries which

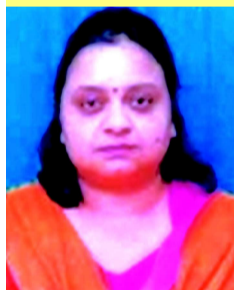

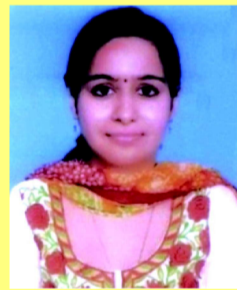

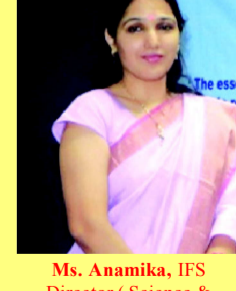

**ICC Women's T20 World Cup Final:
India to take on four-time champions
Australia on IWD**

Melbourne, Mar 7
Indian women are set to create history on the International Women's day tomorrow when they take on Australia in the women's T20 World Cup final at Melbourne.
Despite going unbeaten into the final, Indian eyes will have to overcome big match pressure as they will be up against the habitual winners Australia.
India topped the group stage and had beaten four-time champions Australia in the tournament opener. They advanced to their maiden summit clash on the point basis after the semifinal against England was washed out.



So far in the tournament, consistency of India's spin-heavy bowling attack along with refreshing firepower of 16-year-old Shafali Verma has contributed massively to the team's success. However, star batters Smriti Mandhana and Harmanpreet are expected to do much more for India to win their maiden ICC trophy.
On the other hand, Australia who are in the sixth successive final in seven editions will have advantage of familiar territory. But a sizable number of Indian fans too is expected at the iconic MCG.
More than 75,000 tickets have already been sold for the final.

**Amit Panghal advances to quarterfinals
of Asian Olympic Qualifiers**

Jordan, Mar 7
Star Indian boxer Amit Panghal advanced to the quarterfinals of the Asian Olympic Qualifiers in 52 kilogram category in Amman, Jordan, today. He triumphed over Mongolia's Enkhmanadakh Kharkhuu in a split 3-2 decision.
Panghal, who became India's first silver-medallist at the world championships last year, will now face 2019

Gulmarg, Mar. 7

He said that a training academy shall be established on the standards of International level in which international coaches shall impart training to sportspersons. Jordan, Mar 7
Indian boxer Vikas Krishan displayed a brilliant performance as he began his campaign at the Asian/Oceanian Olympic Qualifiers with a 5-0 victory against Kyrgyzstan's Nursultan Mamataly in Amman, Jordan. With this victory, Krishan has advanced to the quarter-finals, where he will meet the third seed Quincy Mensah Sewonrets Okazawa of Japan.



Also, the Commonwealth Games gold medallist, Krishan, is just one win away from securing a spot in the Tokyo Olympics.

the prices of medicines at Jan Aushadhi Centers are 50% to 90% less than the market. For example, a medicine used in the treatment of cancer which is available in the market for about Rs. 6.50 thousand, is available in Jan Aushadhi Centers for only Rs. 800.
"The cost of treatment is decreasing compared to before. I am told that till now, savings of Rs 2200 crores have been saved by crores of poor and middle class Indians all over the country due to Jan Aushadhi Centers", the PM said.
Prime Minister also commended the role of stakeholders running the Janaushadhi Centres. He also announced the decision to introduce awards related to Janaushadhi scheme to recognize the contribution of people associated with the Scheme.
Prime Minister said Janaushadhi scheme is also becoming a great means of confidence for youth including the disabled. Thousands of youths are employed in the process ranging from testing of generic medicines in labs to their last mile distribution in public health centres.
"The government is making every effort to expand health facilities in the country. Constant work is going on to make the Janaushadhi scheme also more effective", he added.
Prime Minister said that about 90 lakh poor patients have received treatment under Ayushman Bharat scheme. More than 6 lakh dialysis has been done free of cost under the Dialysis Program. Also, price control of more than one thousand essential medicines has saved Rs. 12,500 crore. Millions of patients have got new life due to the reduced cost of stents and knee implants.
"By the year 2025, we are working fast to make the country TB free. Under this scheme, modern health and wellness centers are being built in every village of the country. Till date, more than 31 thousand centers are completed", he added.
The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi urged every citizen of the country to understand his or her obligation towards health. "We must give due importance to cleanliness, yoga, balanced diet, sports and other exercises in our daily routine. Our efforts towards fitness will prove the resolve of a healthy India", he added.
