# India face England, Australia play South Africa on ICC T20 Women's World Cup semifinals

## Shafali Verma rises to top from 20th position

Sydney, Mar 4  
India face 2009 winner England in the first semifinal of the ICC Women's T20 World Cup on Thursday (March 5, 2020) with four-time champion Australia taking on South Africa in the second knockout match later in the day. Both the semifinals will be played at the iconic Sydney Cricket Ground in Australia. South Africa, the 2014 semifinalist, emerged as Group B topper after their match against the West Indies at Sydney Showground was washed due to heavy rains. Both the teams were awarded one point each which meant South Africa ended with seven points after winning three matches and one no result. England came second with six points.

Shafali Verma, India's teenage sensation who has been riding on her spectacular performance at the ongoing T20 World Cup, rose to the top spot in the ICC women's T20 International rankings. The 16-year-old replaced New Zealand's Suzie Bates at the top, who had been the top batter since October 2018. Shafali scored 161 runs in four innings to become the only Indian batter other than Mithali Raj to reach the top of ICC women's T20I batting rankings. Shafali will now take on England as the top-ranked batter, facing top-ranked bowler Sophie Ecclestone on Thursday.

## Sakshi Chaudhary advances to quarters of boxing's Asian Olympic Qualifiers

Amman (Jordan), Mar 4  
Former junior world champion Sakshi Chaudhary (57kg) stunned Asian silver-medallist and fourth seed Nilawan Techasuep of Thailand to enter the quarterfinals of the Asian Olympic Qualifiers for boxing here on Wednesday. The two-time youth world champion Indian, who is only 19, prevailed in a split verdict against the Asian Games bronze-medallist in an engrossing second-round bout after both the boxers got opening-round byes. Sakshi will next be up against Korea's Im Aeji on March 9.



Making the semifinals would assure her of a spot in the Tokyo Olympics scheduled in July-August this year. The opening round was fought on even keel for most part but Sakshi managed to be ahead of her fancied rival in a split verdict. Techasuep came out all guns blazing in the second round and caught Sakshi off-guard with a barrage of combination straight punches. The Indian was pushed to the backfoot by the aggressive Thai, whose left jab was particularly eye-catching.

## ICC Test rankings: India retain No 1 spot despite defeat in New Zealand

Dubai, Mar 4  
India has retained its number one spot and captain Virat Kohli remained static at second in the ICC rankings despite a dismal Test series against New Zealand. India have 116 rating points, six more than New Zealand with third-placed Australia accumulating 108 points. The ICC in a statement today said Kohli remains in the second position in the batting rankings despite a poor show in the just-concluded Test series

against New Zealand in which he made 38 runs in four innings. New Zealand opener Tom Blundell and his Indian counterpart Prithvi Shaw and debutant paceman Kyle Jamieson were among the biggest movers in the rankings, released today. Blundell was rewarded with a jump of 27 places to No. 46. Shaw, rose 17 places to No. 76. Australia's Steve Smith retained his top spot, holding a 25-point advantage over Kohli.

Marnus Labuschagne jumped one spot to round off the top three, taking the place of New Zealand captain Kane Williamson. Among bowlers, Tim Southee's Player of the Series-winning performance against India took him into the top five, with a jump of two places to No. 4, while Jasprit Bumrah and Trent Boult returned to the top 10. But the biggest gainer was Jamieson, who rose from No. 80 to 43.

## Gaurav, Ashish enter pre-quarters of Asian Olympic Qualifiers

Amman, Jordan, Mar 4  
The seasoned duo of Gaurav Solanki (57kg) and Ashish Kumar (75kg) advanced to the pre-quarterfinals of the Asian Olympic Qualifiers for boxing with dominating wins in their respective opening-round bouts here. Commonwealth Games gold-medallist Solanki defeated two-time Kyrgyz national champion Akybek Esenbek Uulu, while Asian Championship silver-medallist Ashish got the better of Taiwan's Kan Chia-Wei. Both the Indians won 5-0 following strong performances. Ashish will square off against Kyrgyzstan's Omurbek Bekzhigit Uulu, who has been seeded fourth. The Indian had beaten Uulu in the quarterfinals of the Asian Championships last year. Solanki, whose CWG gold was in the 52kg division, will be up against top-seeded Uzbek Mirzazbek Mirzakhallilov, who got a bye into the second round. Mirzakhallilov is the reigning



world champion in this weight category besides being a gold-medallist at the 2018 Asian Games as well as the Asian Championships. Solanki dominated from the word go, helped by Uulu's poor defence. The Indian was relentless and accurate in his attacks, scoring mostly through clean straight punches. Later, Ashish also produced a confident performance against a sprightly rival. The Indian kept his guard low and relied on counter-attacks to get the judges' nod.
