 The CEO, State Health Agency, Smti. Kriti Garg has requested the people of A&N Islands to participate in the Ayushman Bharat e-Card generation process. She has also clarified that the current Ayushman Bharat e-cards are being generated for pre-existing list of around 80000 people.

Upon clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs, there is a proposal to include all the Islander Card holders in as Ayushman Bharat beneficiaries for which a separate Ayushman Bharat e-Card generation drive would be conducted in the future and public would be notified accordingly for the same.

Meanwhile, the State Health Agency in collaboration with the Auto Rickshaw Drivers Union conducted a special drive for Ayushman Bharat Beneficiary Identification and e-card generation last



month at GB Pant Hospital. This drive was conducted based on the fact that certain occupational categories of workers in the socio Economic Caste Census 2011 in urban area were identified as eligible beneficiaries under the scheme including construction workers, sanitation workers, transport workers in private sector, auto rickshaw drivers, tailors, shop worker, waiter, mechanic, security guard, washer man.

Apart from the above mentioned group of workers, sizable populations of A&N Islands

residents have already been included as beneficiaries of Ayushman Bharat. There are around 80000 Ayushman Bharat beneficiaries and only around 14000 such beneficiaries have collected their e-Cards. **Amit Panghal gets top billing, Mary Kom seeded 2nd in boxing's Asian Olympic Qualifiers**

Jordan, Mar 2  
World silver-medallist Amit Panghal (52kg) has been given the top billing in the men's competition while the iconic M C Mary Kom (51kg) seeded second in the women's event of the Asian Olympic Qualifiers for boxing starting in Jordan on Tuesday. Eight men and five women from India will be aiming to secure Tokyo Olympics berths at the continental event being conducted by the International Olympic Committee's (IOC) Boxing Task Force. While Panghal is the lone Indian man to be seeded, two-time world bronze-medallist Lovlina Borgohain (69kg) and



Pooja Rani (75kg) have been seeded second and fourth respectively in the women's competition. The Indian team arrived in Jordan on Friday last week after a training stint in Assisi, Italy, a country battling the novel coronavirus outbreak which has claimed

over 3,000 lives across the world since being discovered in Wuhan, China. "Everything is fine here. The team is in high spirits and we are looking forward to a strong performance," Indian boxing's High Performance Director Santiago Nieva said.

**New Zealand thrash India by seven wickets to sweep series 2-0**

Christchurch, Mar 2  
New Zealand romped to a seven-wicket victory over India in the second test in Christchurch on Monday for an emphatic 2-0 series sweep of the number one side in the world. The Black Caps dismissed the tourists for 124 in the first hour of the day before chasing down their 132-run victory target with half of the test to spare for the loss of three wickets. Henry Nicholls hit the winning run as New Zealand drove home a dominance that was only briefly challenged in the series as India succumbed to their first two defeats in the



World Test Championship. Openers Tom Latham (52) and Tom Blundell (55) did most of the work before falling to Umesh Yadav and Jasprit Bumrah respectively, the latter producing a peach of a ball to take out the batsman's offstump. New Zealand skipper Kane Williamson also made a cameo

with five runs before he was caught off his gloves fending another fizzing delivery from Bumrah. The hosts were already well within sight of their target by the time the wickets started falling, however, and it only spared India back-to-back thrashings by 10 wickets.
