Cath lab to become functional by year end Civil works for Cath lab, Modular OTs & Negative Pressure MDR TB Ward completed

The much awaited Cath Lab at G. B. Pant Hospital is expected to be completed by year end, as the civil work for the Caridac Lab has been completed and tender has been finalized, said the Director of Health Services, Dr. SP Burma while speaking to the DT Reporter recently. He also informed that once the Cath Lab is completed, coronary angiography and angioplasty can be done at GB Pant Hospital.

Dr. Burma further informed that civil works for three Modular OTs have been completed and spinal surgery has already been started in GB Pant Hospital while other surgeries like hip/knee replacement, neurosurgery, cardiothoracic surgery will also be performed once the equipments, manpower and complete infrastructure of the Modular OT is completed. Meanwhile, the civil work of Negative Pressure MDR TB Ward has been completed and once the HEPA Filter is installed, the Negative Pressure MDR TB Ward will become functional, he said. Similarly, the civil works for Burns Ward, Eye Ward and Oncology Wards have also been completed.

India vs South Africa: Wounded India gets back to training for third Test

Wanderers, Jan 23
India will seek to avoid a series whitewash when they play South Africa in the third and final Test at the Wanderers Stadium, starting on Wednesday. The Wanderers could live up to its reputation as a haven for fast bowlers, especially after South African captain Faf du Plessis expressed his disappointment with the slowness of the Centurion pitch where South Africa clinched the series last week. Two days out from the match, there was a generous covering of green grass on a surface baking under a hot sun, with groundsman Bethuel Buthelezi saying in a weekend newspaper interview that he was planning on preparing a "green mamba" -- which South Africans understand as a green pitch offering venomous assistance to seam bowlers. Firebrand seamer Shanthakumaran Sreesanth took five for 30, South Africa were bowled out for 84 in the first innings and



India went on to win by 123 runs. It remains one of only two Indian wins against 10 defeats in 19 Tests in South Africa. While bemoaning his team's poor batting in the current series, Indian captain Virat Kohli has hailed his bowlers, who have claimed 20 wickets in both Tests so far. This, he believes, gives India the ammunition to be competitive. Ajinkya Rahane, who did not play in the first two Tests, had a lengthy net at the weekend and could be recalled

Bangladesh beat Zimbabwe by 91 runs

Dhaka, Jan 23
Bangladesh clinched the win against Zimbabwe by 91 runs after bundling them out for 125 runs in a 217-run chase in Dhaka. Zimbabwe had a dismal start to the chase as they lost first three wickets for 20 runs. Later, Peter Moor and Sikandar Raza chipped in with some runs as the two scored a partnership of 34 runs for the fifth wicket but it didn't really help Graeme Creame's side as they lost wickets on regular intervals only to get bowled out for 125 runs. For Bangladesh, it was Shakib Al Hasan who bagged three wickets while Mashrafe Mortaza, Sunzamul Islam and Mustafizur Rahman scalped two apiece. edition of the tournament and his performance was the highlight from among the two matches here.

India open against New Zealand in second leg of 4-nation hockey

Wellington, Jan 23
India would be aiming to put behind the disappointment of a first-leg final loss when they open their campaign against hosts New Zealand in the second leg of the Four Nations Invitational Hockey Tournament. In the first leg of the tournament, India got off to a good start with 6-0 win against Japan but lost 0-2 to Belgium in the following match. Winning 3-1 against hosts New Zealand, who had beaten Belgium 5-4 in their first match, put the Manpreet Singh-led



Indian team in the final. India topped the pool table with a total of nine goals, having conceded only three in the pool stage while Belgium scored ten goals but conceded six. "As a team we have made

progress match after match. We had four young players make their debut and even scored in matches which is good," said chief coach Sjoerd Marijne about the team's performance in the first leg.

North Korea participation to highlight Winter Olympics opening ceremony

Pyeongchang, Jan 23
North Korea's participation at the next month's Winter Olympics will form an integral part of an opening ceremony that will highlight a key message of peace, Games organisers said on Tuesday. The 2018 Winter Olympics is being held in the mountainous resort town of Pyeongchang, 80 km (49.71 miles) from the heavily-fortified inter-Korean border, and kicks off with the opening ceremony on Feb. 9. Song Seung-whan, who is serving as the executive creative director for the Pyeongchang ceremonies, said peace had been set as the main motif of the opening

gala even before North Korea decided to join the Games. "We have worked on all of our scenarios under the theme of peace," Song, a renowned actor and producer, told a news conference in Pyeongchang. "Although North Korea's participation was decided belatedly, we think this will serve

as a good opportunity for us to convey our message more clearly." North Korea's presence at the Games had been speculated over for months amid heightened tensions surrounding Pyongyang's contentious nuclear and ballistic missile programme.

West Indies to host 2018 ICC Women's World T20

Dubai, Jan 23
The 2018 edition of the Women's World T20 will be hosted by Antigua and Barbuda, Guyana and St Lucia from November 9-24, the ICC has announced. Hosts Windies will defend the title they won with an eight-wicket victory over Australia in Kolkata in 2016. Stafanie Taylor, who was named as captain of the ICC Women's T20I Team of the Year 2017, won the player of the series award in India and is expected to once again lead the Windies in front of a passionate home crowd. The hosts will be joined by Australia, world champions England, New Zealand, India, Pakistan, South Africa and Sri Lanka who have all achieved qualification. The remaining two spots will be taken by Bangladesh, Holland, Ireland, Papua New Guinea, Scotland, Thailand, Uganda or United Arab

Emirates, all of whom will compete in the ICC Women's World Twenty20 Qualifier in the Netherlands from 3-14 July. The November event in the Caribbean will be the first stand-alone ICC Women's World Twenty20 after the past five events were played alongside the men's event. The Caribbean hosted the

World Cup in 2007 and then staged the World T20 in 2010 when the league matches of the women's tournament were played in St Kitts, while St Lucia hosted the two semi-finals. The final in Barbados was played after the men's final and was won by Australia when they beat New Zealand by three runs.

Rafael Nadal retires hurt, Marin Cilic in Australian Open semifinals

Melbourne, Jan 23
Rafael Nadal's drive towards a second Australian Open title came to a shuddering injury-induced halt Wednesday on a day of upsets that saw unseeded Kyle Edmund and Elise Mertens make the semifinals. The world number one retired against Marin Cilic after an upper right leg problem began troubling him the fourth set on Rod Laver Arena, with the Spaniard wincing in pain and

limping as he struggled to continue. His 3-6, 6-3, 6-7 (5/7), 6-2, 2-0 exit set up a last-four clash for the former US Open champion against Britain's Edmund, who stunned third seed Grigor Dimitrov 6-4, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4. Mertens, who is yet to drop a set, was equally convincing in blasting past world number four Elina Svitolina 6-4, 6-0 to become the first Belgian to make the semis since Kim Clijsters in 2012.
