The study analysed social and economic conditions, health, education, housing and the environment.

Twenty20 Asia Cup

Dhoni's fitness a concern as India take on Bangladesh today



Mirpur, Feb 23
India enter the final phase of their preparations for next month's World Twenty20 with the Asia Cup starting on Wednesday but a cloud of uncertainty over skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni's availability threatens to disturb the side's momentum going into the tournament-opener against Bangladesh. Dhoni has suffered a muscle spasm during the team's training session on Monday, prompting the BCCI to rush Parthiv Patel as his back-up. The skipper's fitness is a concern going into tomorrow's match against the spirited hosts, who have built a reputation of being giant-slayers on more than one

occasion. The ODI series last year saw the emergence of left-arm pacer Mustafizur Rahman, who bamboozled the Indian batsmen with his variations. This tournament will also give 'Men in Blue' an opportunity to crack the 'Mustafizur Code', having failed miserably the last time round. The Indians have started their T20 preparations in right earnest having won back-to-back series against Australia 'Down Under' and Sri Lanka at home. After an indifferent performance in a high scoring ODI series in Australia, Ashwin found his mojo back at the start of the T20 series with 13 wickets from last six T20 games. In the series against Sri Lanka, he was virtually

unplayable, grabbing nine wickets in three games with career-best figures of 4/8 in the decider in Visakhapatnam. Nehra and Bumrah make a good pace attack with one having loads of experience and ability to read match situations effortlessly, and the other with an unusual action able to rattle the batsmen bowling yorkers at will. Bangladesh's strength is their bowling attack with Mustafizur, Taskin Ahmed and Al-Amin Hossain expected to pose a lot of challenge for the Indian batsmen. With a handsome IPL contract, Mustafizur may again intimidate the Indian batsmen with Taskin and Al-Amin for support.

Asia Cup will assess team's strengths: Kohli

Mirpur, Feb 23

Indian batting mainstay Virat Kohli on Tuesday said the Asia Cup starting here on Wednesday is a perfect platform to assess the team's strengths, weaknesses and its current standing on the global stage ahead of the big-ticket World Twenty20 next month.

India lock horns with Bangladesh in the tournament-opener of the Asia Cup T20 here on Wednesday, beginning their final phase of preparations for next month's World T20 to be held in India. "Going into the World Cup as I said, the conditions are going to be similar and we will probably be playing all these oppositions at some stage. So, as many teams as we play before the World Cup, it gives us a great opportunity to assess what the teams are like, what the balance is like, what their strengths and weaknesses are, and where do we stand compared to them. You can see it (Asia Cup) as a whole package before the World Cup," Kohli said at the pre-match press conference here. India begins the tournament on the back of some very impressive outings in the slam-bang format against Australia and Sri Lanka. "Asia Cup has always been a challenging tournament; it's like a mini event as far as the sub-continental teams are concerned. It's an opportunity to test yourself as I said against the best teams in the sub continent. It's a competitive tournament with different opposition with different set of skills testing you all the time."

development is one of its top priorities. Highlighting the welfare measures taken by government, he said the innovative initiatives have helped India jump 12 places in the latest rankings by World Bank on Ease of Doing Business.

Stating that India is a haven of stability in an increasingly turbulent global economy, Shri Mukherjee said GDP growth has increased making India the world's fastest growing economy. Talking about the Make in India initiative, the President said it has achieved 39 per cent increase in FDI inflow despite adverse global investment climate. He said inflation, fiscal deficit and current account deficit have all decreased. Amidst thumping of desks by members, the President said India has recorded the highest ever foreign exchange reserves in 2015.

The government has taken several steps to put in place a simplified, progressive and non-adversarial tax regime by incorporating internationally prevalent best practices in tax administration. The President said under the ambitious Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojna he was proud to say that it was the world's most successful financial inclusion programme. He said under the programme, out of over 21 crore accounts opened, 15 crore accounts are operational with an aggregate deposit of over 32,000 crore rupees. He said, rural development is one of the top priorities of the government. He said the grant of over two lakh crore rupees by the 14th Finance Commission over a five year period from 2015-16, exclusively for Gram Panchayats has been received with great enthusiasm by the states. Shri Mukherjee said the government aims at creating a 'Shikshit Swasth Swachh Bharat', an educated, healthy and clean India. He said the government is committed to provide housing for all by 2020. Emphasising the need for a robust infrastructure to unlock opportunities, President said the government is not only committed to providing all-weather roads to 1.78 lakh rural habitation but has also revived most of the 73 stalled highway projects. He said ambitious Bharatmala project worth 2.67 lakh crore rupees is on the anvil for development of national highways. He also added development of waterways is a priority area.

The President said the government has taken several measures to eliminate the scope of corruption and it has been unsparing in punishing those who are found guilty of corruption. He said the government's concerted efforts to tackle the menace of black money have started yielding results. On terrorism, the President said India is committed for forging mutual respectful relationship with Pakistan and creating an environment of cooperation in combating cross border terrorism. He congratulated the security forces in successfully foiling the attack at the Pathankot airbase.

Concluding his speech amidst thumping of desk by all the members present in the Central Hall, the President made an apparent remark over the debate on nationalism. He quoted Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose saying nationalism is inspired by the highest ideals of the human race, satyam, shivam, sundaram.

Bangladesh lift ban on umpire Nadir Shah

Dhaka, Feb 23

Bangladesh lifted the 10-year ban on former international cricket umpire Nadir Shah, allowing him to officiate in domestic matches. Shah was banned in March 2013 by the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) after a sting operation by an Indian TV channel allegedly found him willing to fix matches for cash. The private India TV channel aired the footage in October 2015, showing that Shah was willing to give LBW (leg before wicket) decisions on demand. Shah, who has stood in 40 One-Day Internationals (ODIs) and three Twenty20 Internationals (T20Is), was one of six umpires caught in the undercover investigation, including three from Sri Lanka and two from Pakistan.

India Women eye unassailable lead
