Setting up of Atal Tinkering Laboratories; applications invited from schools

Grant-in-aid of Rs.10 lakh to each school in first phase

Port Blair, June 23
The Government of India has setup the 'Atal Innovation Mission' (AIM) at NITI Aayog with an aim to promote a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship in India. To foster creativity and scientific temper in students, Atal Innovation Mission will establish 500 Atal Tinkering Laboratories (ATL) in schools and one time

establishment grant-in-aid of Rs.10 lakh will be provided for its establishment. Further, an amount of Rs.10 lakh would be provided for each ATL over a period of 5 years to meet operational expenses. Thus, an amount of Rs.20 lakh per Atal Tinkering Laboratory in each selected school will be spent. Young children will get a chance to work with tools and equipment to understand the concepts of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) and also give shape to their creativity. The schools having grade VI - XII managed by Government (State Government, Local Body (Zilla Parishad/Municipal) or Private Trust/Society, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan and Navodaya Vidyalaya are eligible to

Governor of A&N Islands. At a despatch ceremony of enrolled boys of A&N Islands, organised by the Recruiting Office (HQ) Chennai, at the Tagore Auditorium here this evening, the Lt Governor, Lt Gen AK Singh (Retd), presented them with the certificates of recruitment. Addressing the new recruits on the occasion, the Lt Governor said that there cannot be a more honourable profession than the Armed Forces. "Each one of you who have been selected, should feel proud that you have got an opportunity to serve our motherland", he said.

The Lt. assistance rendered by CIARI in all the desired platform of A & N Administration and assured help in establishing

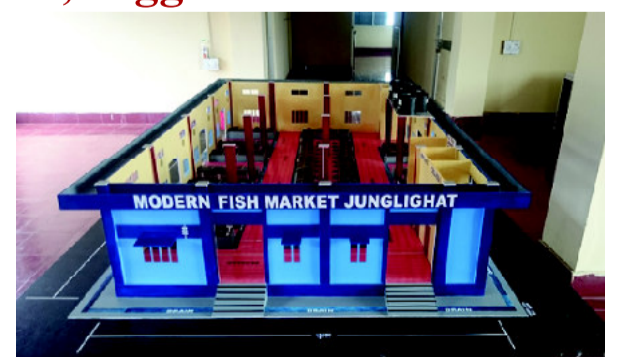

Kumble appointed India's head coach for one year

Dharamsala, Jun 23
Former captain Anil Kumble was today appointed the Indian cricket team's head coach for a one-year tenure, bringing an end to the prolonged suspense over who will take over the reins of the side. The 45-year-old Kumble pipped former Team Director Ravi Shastri, Australians Tom Moody and Stuart Law and a host of others to clinch the high-profile position following an elaborate selection process headed by a three-member Cricket Advisory Committee (CAC). The committee comprising greats Sachin Tendulkar, VVS Laxman and Sourav Ganguly had interviewed 10 candidates for the job in Kolkata on Tuesday in a marathon session which lasted close to 10 hours.

"BCCI has been very transparent. We fixed a criteria. There was the CAC as well. They have gone through the process, interviewed and recommended few names. After discussions with various stakeholders, we have decided that Anil Kumble will be the head

coach of the Indian cricket team for the next one year," BCCI President Shri Anurag Thakur said in a press conference here. "It is not about Indian or foreign, it is about who is best for the job. I think we have used the services of best players who have served

Indian cricket. There was no such limitation that we have to have only an Indian coach. We wanted the best for the Indian team," he added. Kumble, the highest wicket-taker for India till date and third in the international list behind Muttiah Muralitharan and Shane Warne, emerged as a front-runner in the last few days even though he has no experience in coaching in the international arena. Kumble's stint as a mentor with IPL teams such as Royal Challengers Bangalore and Mumbai Indians as well as his vast experience as an international cricketer might have tilted the scale in his favour. The former leg-spinner played 132 Test matches and 271 ODIs in a career spanning close to two decades. Kumble finished his Test career with 619 scalps and accumulated 337 ODI wickets which put his combined tally at 956 in two formats. The leg-spinner was the only bowler after England's Jim Laker to have taken all 10 wickets in a Test innings.

Rio bus missed but Mary Kom not quitting just yet

London, Jun 23
Mary Kom's last hope for an Olympic berth might be over after the denial of a wildcard, but star Indian woman boxer on Thursday said she would not hang up her gloves just yet.

The 33-year-old five-time world champion could not make the cut for Rio via the two qualifiers and last-ditch attempts by the Indian Olympic Association and the ad-hoc committee administering boxing in India to fetch her a wildcard entry also fell through after the IOC declined the request.

The London Olympic bronze-medallist missed two chances to



book a Rio berth-first in March at the Asian Zone Qualifiers and then last month at the World Championships. After this, the IOA and the ad-hoc committee approached the International Boxing Association (AIBA) for a

Chile storm into Copa America football final



Chicago, June 23
Charles Aranguiz and Jose Pedro Feunzalida scored in the first half and defending champion Chile returned to the Copa America championship with a soggy 2-0 victory over Colombia on Wednesday night.

Led by Claudio Bravo's stellar effort in goal, Chile earned its fourth straight win since a 2-1 loss to top-ranked Argentina in their Group D opener. Next up is a rematch with La Albiceleste in the final Sunday night in New Jersey. Chile also faced Lionel Messi and Argentina in last year's championship, with La Roja winning 4-1 in a penalty shootout after a 0-0 extra-time draw. Argentina was the last country to repeat as Copa champions in consecutive years, accomplishing the feat in 1946 and 1947.

James Rodriguez and

Colombia got off to a slow start and their push for a comeback was hampered by a strong line of thunderstorms that delayed the start of the second half by more than two hours, drenching the playing surface and making it difficult to stay on your feet at Soldier Field, home of the NFL's Chicago Bears.

Colombia, which will face the United States in the third-place game on Saturday night in Arizona, also had to play with 10 men after Carlos Sanchez received his second yellow card in the 57th minute.
