Defence Minister reviews search operations to locate missing Indian Air Force aircraft

New Delhi, Jul 23
Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar today reviewed the ongoing search operations to locate the missing Indian Air Force aircraft AN-32. He visited INS Rajali, the Naval Air Station at Arakkonam and was briefed on the search operations undertaken in the last 24 hours. The Minister directed that if need arises more resources

be diverted for the search and rescue operations. He was apprised of the difficult condition under which the operations are being undertaken due to thick monsoon clouds in the area making the search effort quite challenging. Shri Parrikar has directed that the operations be continued till further orders. Out of 29 people, who were on-board, six were crew

members, eleven were IAF personnel, two belonged to Indian Army and one person was from Indian Coast Guard. Eight civilians working with Indian Navy along with one sailor from Indian Navy were also traveling in the aircraft. The Defence Minister has directed all commanders to be in touch with the families of the missing service personnel.

Meanwhile, the PRO, Andaman Nicobar Command, while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here this evening informed that two aircrafts and five ships of ANC are actively involved in the search operations while another ship has joined the search operation under Eastern Naval Command, on the Chennai-Port Blair lines, primarily on the other side of it. The transport plane of the Indian Air Force with 29 people on board, including four officers went missing on Friday while flying from Chennai to Port Blair.

Army recruitment rally scheduled for September 2016

Port Blair, July 23
The Indian Army would be conducting Recruitment Rally for the year 2016-17, in September in Port Blair and Campbell Bay. The Director Recruitment, Colonel Abraham who is on coordination visit with the civil administration informed that this year again there would be 200 vacancies. During the last three years, there has been substantial increase in vacancies, wherein 84 candidates got selected in

2014, 53 in 2015, and in 2016 also there are 200 vacancies which have been increased by continuous efforts of the Lt Governor of A & N Islands with the highest level of the Indian Army. Recently on 23rd June, a batch of 53 candidates were given a send off by the Lt Governor after a motivating and encouraging talk. Col. Abraham informed that the objective of the recruitment rally is to reach out to the far-flung areas of the country and to inspire

the youth to join the Indian Army and serve the country with pride. He further apprised that though the vacancies are 200 but the candidates are not able to pass the physical, medical and written examinations which is a pre-requisite to get enrolled in the Army. Thereby, the vacancies get surrendered. He requested the Administration to train the aspirants so that the maximum vacancies can be utilized. Col Abraham categorically thanked the

Lt Governor for time and again pursuing the recruitment of the youth of Andamans. This has even made a difference in our Recruitment Directorate to put our best foot forward for the Islands. The Recruitment Directorate initiative to conduct a rally at Campbell Bay is also courtesy the Hon'ble Lt Governor, who has a vision to get youth from the remotest area of the country get connected to larger family of Indian Army and serve the Nation with pride.

Shri Modi had requested Afghan President Mr. Ashraf Ghani to expedite the efforts to rescue Judith.

The Port Blair Science Centre located at Goodwill Estate Corbyn's Cove road shall be arranging a Demonstration to spot the International Space station which shall be passing over Port Blair sky as per details given below:-

Date & time	Visible Duration	Max height	Appears	Disappears
24 th July, 2016 (Sunday) 6.40 pm	3 min	29°	10° above S	29° above ESE

The Space station shall be passing over the Port Blair sky at an height about 400 kms above sea level with a speed of 27,600 km per hour completing the orbit around earth in 92.69 minutes. All sightings will occur within a few hours before or after sunrise or sun set. This is the optimum viewing period as the sun reflects off the space station and contrasts against the darker sky. After the mass tree planting, a nature study tour was organized for the school students. Around 35 selected students from various Schools were taken

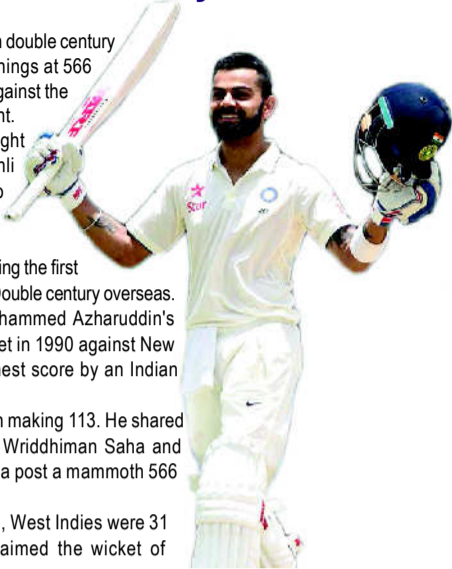

Virat Kohli becomes first Indian captain to hit double century overseas

Antigua, July 23
Virat Kohli slammed his maiden double century as India declared their first innings at 566 for 8 on day 2 of the first test against the West Indies at Antigua last night. Resuming play at the overnight score of 302 for 4, skipper Kohli and R. Ashwin continued to humble the Caribbean bowlers till lunch with some superb batting. Kohli made 200 becoming the first Indian captain to amass a test Double century overseas. He broke former skipper Mohammed Azharuddin's long-standing record of 192 set in 1990 against New Zealand. It was also the highest score by an Indian captain in the West Indies. Ashwin scored his 3rd Test ton making 113. He shared two over 50-run stands with Wriddhiman Saha and Amit Mishra to help Team India post a mammoth 566 for 8. When the stumps were drawn, West Indies were 31 for 1. Mohammed Shami claimed the wicket of Rajendra Chandrika.



Usain Bolt proves his fitness ahead of Rio Olympics

London, July 23
Ahead of next month's Rio Olympics, Jamaican sprinter Usain Bolt has proved his fitness at the Anniversary Games in London by dominating the Men's 200 metres race. The six-time Olympic champion clocked 19.89 seconds to finish first. Alonso Edward of Panama was second while Britain's Adam Gemili was third. The Bolt's performance comes days after he missed the Jamaican trials earlier this month with injury. Bolt won Gold in both 100 and 200 metres races at the London and Beijing Olympics, and will defend both titles in Rio.



The fastest 200 metres time of the year is 19.74 seconds set by American LaShawn Merritt. Bolt's world record is 19.19 seconds which he had set in 2009.

stated that within 10 days, National Highway Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (NHIDCL) will open its office in Port Blair. Accordingly, work on NH shall start in all probability from October 1, 2016 onwards as per the commitment of MD, NHIDCL. Creek Bridges shall be constructed on priority basis, said the MP.

The MP stated that 21 bridges will be constructed under Central Road Fund as per his recommendations. The MP informed that MORTH has sanctioned Rs 17.23 crores for the construction of 13.5 km long 2 roads at Hutbay-8 km, Car Nicobar-5.5 km. Rs 27.15 crore has been sanctioned for the construction of 35.2 km long 4 roads at Prothrapur-4.9 km, Prothrapur-2.2 km, Sholbay-10.0 km, Chunna Bhatta to Ferrarganj-10.1 km.

The MP also informed about the bridges and roads which are to be constructed under Central Road Fund (CRF) of Rs.100 crores for connectivity of the villages in various parts of A&N Island.

The MP stated that Secretary, MORTH on the direction of the Minister gave In-principal approval to the tune of Rs.46 Cr. for 21 bridges and between 12 - 20/07.2016 APWD submitted estimates for 8 bridges to the Ministry while estimate for the rest 14 bridges will be submitted by July, 2016.

The Member of Parliament also informed that 6 State Highways-(total-90.70 km) has been declared by MORTH as new National Highways viz. Little Andaman -22 km, Havelock Jetty to Radha Nagar beach -11 km, Govind Nagar junction to Kalapathar -9 km, Neil Island Jetty to Sitapur -4 km, Kalra junction to Ramnagar, Diglipur-20 kms, Diglipur Bazar to Hatilevel, Diglipur- 24.7 km.

He also highlighted about Improvement to Riding Quality Programme (IRQP) Works for the year 2014-15 estimated by APWD to MORTH which was to a tune of approx. 47 crore. Accordingly Rs. 10 crore has been sanctioned to APWD.

Mentioning about the present status of the MORTH approved 2 major bridges across Middle Strait & Humphrey Strait along NH-223, the MP informed that in principle approval was agreed upon for forest clearance from Chennai under stage one and cost of trees will be deposited and approval of stage -2 will be availed from Chennai.

Regarding Improvement to Riding Quality Programme(IRQP) works for the year 2014-15, the MP stated that the APWD has been asked to spend sanctioned amount (Rs 10 crore approximately) of year 2014-15 under IRQP works after getting approval from a committee headed by the Chief Secretary.

He also informed that under the scheme of renewable and green energy, Petronet will introduce LNG at Bambooflat to Shorepoint.

A good number of people including senior citizens gathered at MP Bhawan, the venue of the 'Aap Ki Adalat' which was moderated by Shri Rakesh Chandra Lal. During the question answer session, people from different walks of life posed questions concerning the development of these Islands. When asked about whether govt will compensate those who will be evacuated due to construction of two-lane National Highway, the MP said that Govt. will duly compensate as per the NH acquirement policy. To another query that the decision to award work to NHIDCL will lead to unemployment and local contractors will not get any work in the NH, Shri Ray clarified that local youths will be engaged and local contractors will get sub-works as they got in the major construction works being carried in A&N Islands. He further stated, showing a video clipping, that NH is being developed with new technology under which very less construction materials will be used besides it will reduce the construction cost with 20 years guarantee of the road. The MP further clarified that only NH part has been given to NHIDCL by MORTH while the APWD will get 46 Rs crores for construction of different roads, Rs 10 crores for repairing of roads and Rs 100 crores for establishing 21 bridges of different sizes in different Islands. On a suggestion for inviting senior officers of the Administration in such programme to get a clear picture on the delays in execution of works, the MP assured that very soon a programme titled 'Janata Darbar' will be arranged which will enable the general public to have one to one interaction with the officials including MP to get immediate clarifications. Later, the MP urged people to give in writing about their grievances, so that he can take up their issues in the current session of Parliament itself.
