Parliament bids farewell to outgoing President Shri Pranab Mukherjee

New Delhi, Jul 23
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee has said that Parliament stands for debate, discussion and dissent adding that disruption hurts opposition more than the government. He said, disruption denies the opportunity to opposition to raise the concern of the people. In his farewell address at Central Hall of Parliament this evening, Shri Mukherjee said, voice of each Member of Parliament is important and it is unfortunate that the Parliamentary time devoted to legislation has been declining. Stressing the need for scrutiny and adequate discussion before passage of any legislation, he said, when Parliament fails to discharge its law making role or enacts laws without discussion, it breaches the trust reposed in it by the people.



The President said, ordinance route should only be adopted in compelling circumstances and there should be no recourse to ordinances on monetary matters. Shri Mukherjee said, ordinance route should also not be

taken on matters which are being considered or have been introduced in the house or committee of the house. The President described the passage of GST as a shining example of cooperative federalism

The national memorial for former President Dr A P J Abdul Kalam will be a standing testimony for the love and respect towards people's President. The foundation stone of Dr Kalam National memorial was laid at

Rameswaram last year on his first death anniversary. A seven feet bronze statue in Peikarumbu was also unveiled last year. The national memorial is set up by DRDO in 2.11 acres at a cost of Rs 16 crore. Dr Kalam died on July 27 in 2015 at Indian Institute of Management, Shillong where he had gone to deliver a lecture.

NEET question paper to be same for all languages: HRD Minister

Kolkata, Jul 23

Union Human Resource Development Minister Shri Prakash Javadekar has said, question paper for the all India medical entrance examination, NEET, for all languages will now be same.

Shri Javadekar told reporters in Kolkata yesterday that vernacular question papers for NEET will be mere translation of the question paper in English. He was replying to a question about the West

Bengal Education Minister's recent complain that this year the students appearing for NEET in vernacular languages had faced tougher questions than the ones set in English and Hindi. Shri Javadekar said that his Ministry is in discussion stage about 'one nation one test' in engineering. The Minister also said the Centre will soon introduce a detention policy for students in classes 5 and 8 with support from States.

He said, in a proposed bill to be passed in Parliament, power has been given to the States to have examinations for students at fifth and eighth standards in March. If students fail, they will be given one last chance to appear in an examination in May. He said, if a student fails in both attempts, he/she would be detained. Shri Javadekar also said that 25 states have already given consent to the move.

About Rs 72,000 cr undisclosed income detected by IT Department in last 3 years, Centre tells SC

New Delhi, July 23

Massive searches, seizures and surveys by the Income Tax Department over the last three years have led to the detection of around 71,941 crore rupees of undisclosed income in the country.

In an affidavit filed before Supreme Court, Finance Ministry said, during the period of demonetisation from November 9 last year to January 10 this year, the total undisclosed income

admitted was more than 5,400 crore rupees and the total quantity of gold seized stood at 303.367 kilograms.

It gave the details of the unaccounted income for three years from 1st April 1, 2014 to 28th February this year, including the demonetisation period. The affidavit said that during the three year period, searches were undertaken by the IT

Department in over 2,027 groups which led to the admission of undisclosed income of more than 36,051 crore rupees. It said, this is in addition to the seizure of undisclosed assets worth 2,890 crore rupees. Similarly in the mentioned period, the IT Department conducted more than 15,000 surveys which led to the detection of undisclosed income of more than 33,000 crore rupees.

India bag Silver & Bronze in High Jump at World Para athletics Championships

London, July 23
India bagged two medals in the high jump at the World Para Athletics Championships in London last night. While Sharad Kumar won a silver medal, Varun Bhati bagged bronze medal in the T42 event. Sharad recorded his career-best performance with a jump of 1.84 metre, just 0.02 metre short of USA's Sam Gwewe who took gold with a championship record. Varun Bhati's final successful jump was 1.77 metre. With that, India have increased their medal tally to five. Earlier, Sundar Singh Gurjar



opened India's account at the World Para Athletics Championships by clinching gold in the men's javelin throw event. Two days later, Amit Saroha added to the tally when he

clinched silver medal in the club throw event in the F-51 category. And just a day ago, discus thrower Karamiyoti Dalal claimed a brone medal in the Women's F55 category.

Neeraj Chopra finishes seventh at Monaco

Monaco, July 23
Watching Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra hurl the spear in competition can be an edge-of-the seat experience. He is prodigiously talented obviously. Being a World Junior champion, Chopra, still only 19, is one of the stars of the men's javelin throw. What makes watching him appealing is his ability to progressively improve during the six attempts. There's always an anticipation about a couple of big throws he can produce in the latter stages to upset the the appeacart.

it seemed like Chopra would fade away, he produced three 80-metre plus throws, including 85.23 in his final attempt to win gold. On Friday evening at the Stade Louis II,

Chopra was participating in his second Diamond League. He started off with a modest 75.52 metres, fouled in the next attempt and subsequently registered 78.58.

Diego Maradona's tour to Kolkata rescheduled

Kolkata, July 23
The much-awaited Diego Maradona's city sojourn in September is rescheduled to October 2-4, organisers said in Kolkata on Saturday. The Argentine legend in his second trip to the football-crazy city was to lock horns against former India captain Sourav Ganguly on September 19 as the exhibition match, titled 'Match for Unity' will now be held on the Gandhi Jayanti on October 2.

"To my fans, who are eagerly awaiting me in Kolkata, I wanted to let you know that I will now be coming on October 2," Maradona was quoted saying in a media release. The exhibition match would be held at the Aditya School of Sports in Barasat where he would conduct a football workshop. There will also be a host of other activities in the two-day visit including meeting Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, the release said.

We will show we can compete against the best: U-17 WC coach

New Delhi, Jul 23
India Under-17 football head coach Luis Norton de Matos today said that he has not lost hope of the country advancing beyond the group stages in the upcoming World Cup but termed his team's chances in the prestigious FIFA event as "small". Addressing a press conference here, de Matos said even in case his boys fail to go beyond the group stages, they will show the world that they can compete at the highest level and do the country proud.

"I will be realistic, I would say we have a small chance, considering the draw. But it can still happen. In football you never know," de Matos said, when asked about India's chances of going beyond the group stages. "Even if we could not go a long way in the tournament, I am sure the players will be competitive. They will show that India can compete at the same level, against the best in the world," said the 63-year-old Portuguese. "This World Cup is the beginning of the football project in India, not the end. The

performance of these boys will give a perfect start to this project," he added. India are clubbed along with strong teams Ghana (two-time champions and two-time runners-up), Colombia and United States. All of India's matches will be played in New Delhi. India will kick off their campaign against the USA on October 6 before taking on Colombia on October 9. The hosts will conclude the first phase with a match against Ghana.
