PM Modi reviews progress of key infrastructure sectors including renewable energy & railways



New Delhi, Aug 23 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi yesterday reviewed the progress of key infrastructure sectors. During the review, NITI Aayog made a presentation showing phenomenal progress in several key sectors, including renewable energy and railways. The Prime Minister was briefed on plans and strategies to further ramp up solar energy production

including rooftop generation. The cumulative installed capacity has crossed 44 Giga Watts in the new and renewable energy sector. Besides, 3.5 crore LED bulbs have been distributed. Reviewing the progress in the Petroleum and Natural Gas Sector, the Prime Minister sought to know the steps being taken to ramp up ethanol blending of petrol. He was informed

that over 15 crore households were covered under Direct Benefit Transfer for LPG in 2016. An official release said, during the review, the Prime Minister was told that Railways had achieved a target of daily passenger movement of 2.25 crore and 240 unmanned crossings have been eliminated in the first quarter of the current fiscal. Four fishermen rescued by Coast Guard

Port Blair, Aug 23

In a Search and Rescue Operation near Rangat Bay, Indian Coast Guard ship C-147 located and assisted a fishing dinghy Shyamla Kumari, with 4 crew. The dinghy was stranded at sea 12 nautical miles from Rangat due to engine failure. The boat had sailed from Panigath fishing harbour on Aug 20 for fishing. However, due to problem in her engine, the boat could not return. This information was given to police, who in turn

alerted Coast Guard for providing assistance to the boat.

On receipt of information, Coast Guard Ship C-147 patrolling in the area, was diverted to search for the missing boat. At about 1 pm, Coast Guard ship C-147 located the boat approximately 5 nautical miles North-East of Long Island. The crew informed that the boat was adrift since 9.30 am due to engine failure. Since repair of engine was not possible, the boat was towed to

Rangat harbour by Coast Guard ship and handed over to another boat arranged by the owner at 4 pm on Aug 23.

Coast Guard has reiterated that it is important for all fishermen to carry DAT and lifesaving equipment on their boats, so that they can inform Coast Guard authorities about any distress situation and can be saved. Fishermen can also inform about any distress situation to Coast Guard on toll free number 1554, a communication said.

Dato Windsor John said: "The AFC has been following the developments in India extremely closely. The AFC's Vision and Mission sets the goal of ensuring that football is the number one sport in Asia and India is a very important country if we are to achieve that objective." "Football in India has great potential for growth and development as was outlined by AIFF and it is important that we get the right structures and programmes in place so that the sport in India can grow and this is something AFC can assist with."

The Indian men's team, who were knocked out in the quarters, have dropped a place to 6th, while the women's team have moved up one place to 12th after making their first appearance in the Olympics in 36 years.

The Australian men's team and Netherlands women's team have retained their top spots.

Following the conclusion of the sensational men's and women's

hockey events at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) has released the latest FIH Hero World Rankings.

Olympic gold medalists Argentina (men) and Great Britain (women) both entered Rio 2016 sitting seventh in the rankings, but their stunning title successes have seen both climb rapidly up the table.

In the men's FIH Hero World Rankings, Australia's Kookaburras—who finished in sixth place in Rio—remain in first place, but newly crowned Olympic champions Argentina earned enough points to move up five places to second.

Argentina's Los Leones sit just ahead of fourth place finishers and now third-ranked Netherlands, with Rio 2016 Olympic bronze medalists Germany moving down one place to fourth in the rankings.
