Lucknow, Sep 23
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said, the government targets to provide shelter to every poor in urban and rural area by 2022. Addressing a public meeting at Shahanshahpur village on the second and last day of his two-day visit to his parliamentary constituency Varanasi, he said, building crores of homes will generate jobs and income.

New York, Sept 23
World Bank President Mr Jim Kim has said India has been growing pretty robustly. Speaking at the Bloomberg Global Business Forum meeting in New York, Mr Kim said Japan, Europe and the US along with India were

growing and there was a levelling-out in developing countries. He called for more cooperation among the multilateral system, private sector and the governments to take advantage of the current win-win situation.

Bhutan backs India's bid for permanent seat in UN Security Council

New York, Sep 23
Bhutan has said that countries like India, Japan, Brazil and Germany must be given permanent seats in the UN Security Council, as it backed reforms in the world body to revitalise and

strengthen it. Bhutan Prime Minister Mr Tshering Tobgay said, the UN reforms will be incomplete without reforming the Security Council to reflect the changing realities of the world.

In his address to the UN General Assembly, Mr Tobgay said countries like India, Japan, Brazil and Germany must be called upon to serve as permanent members in the Security Council. He also said Africa must be appropriately represented.

Vehicles with GVW of over 16 MT will not be permitted on vehicle ferry vessels of DSS

Port Blair, Sept 23
The matter regarding restriction on transhipment of heavily loaded trucks through the vehicle ferry vessels in the ATR Creeks was reviewed by the Directorate of Shipping Services alongwith officials of State Transport Department and representatives of Andaman Chamber of Commerce today. In view of the difficulties expressed by them in the review meeting, the matter was deliberated at length and later it was jointly decided to impose restrictions on transhipment of vehicles in the vehicle ferry vessels with Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW) more than 16 MT and multi axle loaded vehicles, which means vehicles with GVW of more than 16 MT and loaded multi axle vehicles will not

be permitted on the Vehicle Ferry Vessels of the Directorate of Shipping Services.

Further in order to check and control the plying of heavily loaded trucks in the ATR creeks, it was also decided to implement a checking mechanism at

Jirakatang Post as per which, all loaded vehicles/trucks henceforth, before entering Andaman Trunk Road are mandatorily required to submit a self declaration and challan, intimating the quantity of cargo loaded in the vehicles, with the officials

of Transport Department and Police Personnel at Jirakatang Post, which would be subject to verification. Only after due verification by the nominated officials at this Post, the vehicles would be allowed to move

Electricity Deptt urges Puja Committees to use minimum lights & electrical gadgets

Port Blair, Sept 23
The Electricity Department has appealed to all the Durga Puja committees of Port Blair and South Andaman to go for bare minimum decorative lights & electrical gadgets and avoid high consuming halogen lamps. The Puja committees have also been strongly advised to keep standby DG sets to avoid complete darkness in the absence of main supply.

In a press release received here today, the Superintending Engineer, Electricity Department has clarified that power generation available capacity is still less as compared to the demand during evening peak hours. The Department has made all possible efforts to add more generators, but the new generators will be available only in November, 2017 except 2

Nos. 1 MW Generators which will be added by end of this month. Due to these reasons, the Electricity Department is compelled to carryout load shedding during day, as and when required, and during evening peak hours by rotation. All Durga Puja Committees in A&N Islands have also been asked to strictly ensure

Indonesia issues highest level alert for volcano on Bali

Bali, Sep 23
Indonesia has issued its highest level alert for a volcano on Bali, warning that an eruption of Mount Agung could be imminent. About 10,000 people have already been evacuated, with officials urging people to stay at least nine kilometres away from Mount Agung. Official said tremors have been reported, and there are

indications that magma is rising to the surface. Early today, officials said that increased seismic activity was ongoing, hours after the alert level was raised. The latest report from Indonesia's volcano observatory for aviation said the likelihood of an eruption appears to be increasing. Mount Agung, which is more than 3,000m above sea level, lies in the eastern part of Bali.

that all electrical safety precaution is taken while illuminating the Durga Puja Pandals and on the road side near the pandals. All electric lines, equipments and apparatus used, should be of sufficient rating of power, insulation and estimated fault current and sufficient mechanical strength for the duty which they are required to perform and shall be constructed, installed, protected, worked and maintained in such a manner so as to ensure safety of human beings, animal and property. The decorative lights should compulsorily be 5 1/2 feet above the ground level so that it is out of the reach of children.

The electrical contractors engaged in illumination / decoration of Puja Pandals and the vehicles used for Visharjan of idols have been advised to strictly adhere to the safety regulations and precautions while handling the electrical appliances. All the electrical wires / cables used should be properly insulated to avoid any mishap / loss of life.

The general public have also been advised to be cautious and vigilant of the electrical wires and cables used for illumination / decoration of Puja Pandals while visiting them, the release added.
