## New Education policy by December: MoS HRD



Thiruvananthapuram, Oct 23  
Union Minister of State for Human Resource Development Dr. Satya Pal Singh has said that the New Education Policy is in final stages and it would be announced in December. Inaugurating a 'National Academic meet' in

Thiruvananthapuram today, Dr. Singh said the policy envisages to 'correct' the course of education system in the country, that has followed a colonial mindset. He pointed out that unfortunately after independence, most of the academicians followed the

footsteps of British and Western scholars and deliberately denigrating Indian culture. Stating that the biggest challenge being faced by the education system and the government is 'how to de-colonise the Indian mind' and the government is

## MP meets Revenue Secretary, Ministry of Finance Requests to depute team to conduct study on the impact of GST in Isles

Port Blair, Oct 23  
In response to the demand of business community, traders, local manufacturers of A & N Islands, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Member of Parliament, A & N Islands met the Secretary (Revenue), Ministry of Finance at New Delhi on Oct.13 and briefed him about the problems being faced by the businessmen. The MP said, consequent upon introduction of uniformity of taxation by means of GST, the price index of local construction materials such as stone boulders,

stone chips, timber, still, sand, marine products like fish & sea food, agriculture products such as copra & arcanut, handicrafts items, bakery items, fabrication items etc, which was earlier being nullified by the regime of 'No Tax' in the Island have been substantially increased because of high freight and forwarding cost.

The prices of all non MRP products including essential commodities of daily necessities have also gone up. The cost of services, especially in tourism industry has also

been substantially increased because of inception of GST in this UT Islands. Hike of market price on account of GST is an additional financial burden for the Islanders, he said. The Islanders are now paying more than the consumers at mainland towards essential commodities. Main industry is tourism in this UT Islands and on account of adverse impact, high price may lead to decline in tourists visit to these Islands. The tourist may also choose other state

General Shri O P. Singh said that this project is being done on experimental basis. He said based on the experiences, this smart centre will be further strengthened.

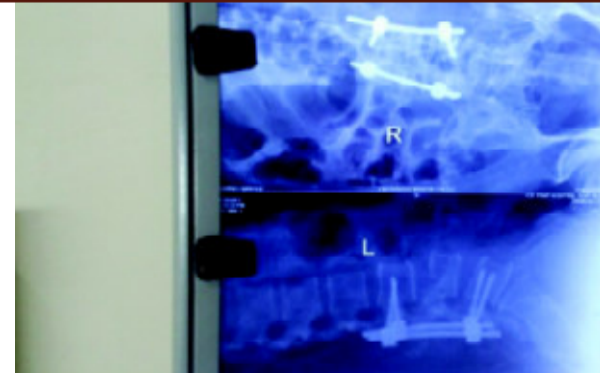

## First spinal surgery carried out in Isles

# Spinal Surgery Services available at ANIIMS- G. B. Pant Hospital

Port Blair, Oct 23  
Good news for the Islanders, as the Department of Orthopedics has begun spinal surgery services at ANIIMS- G. B. Pant hospital. Spinal injuries always results in emergency condition, requiring immediate attention. Moving such patients to mainland for surgery/ treatment can be very cumbersome and detrimental to the patient, as the injury may be aggravated during such a transfer. The best chance of recovery from any loss of power due to spinal trauma consists in decompression and fixation of the spine as early as possible with minimum shifting/transfer of the



patient. Due to these reasons, Spinal Surgery services were given top priority by the A & N Administration and the Department of Orthopedics, ANIIMS- GB Pant Hospital, consequently has become the first Super specialty Orthopedic services to be commissioned in these

Islands. The first case of Spinal surgery was done on Sept. 26, 2017, which was performed by the Spine Unit of the Department of orthopedics comprising of Dr. Amit Ray, Professor and HoD and Dr. Mithun Jumani, Senior Resident and team.

The surgery was conducted on a 58 year old patient, a Marine Engineer and a resident of Bathu Basti who had fallen from a ladder and sustained

## India v Sri Lanka: Murali Vijay returns for Sri Lanka Tests

New Delhi, Oct 23  
Murali Vijay has been recalled to India's squad for the first two Test matches against Sri Lanka, having recovered from the wrist injury that sent him home from Sri Lanka two months ago. He is the only change to India's previous Test squad, with his Tamil Nadu captain and opening partner Abhinav Mukund making way. R Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja and Kuldeep Yadav remain the preferred spinners, while the pace quotient continues to be Umesh Yadav, Mohammed Shami, Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Ishant Sharma with allrounder Hardik Pandya the fifth option. Wriddhiman Saha is, as expected, the first-choice wicketkeeper-batsman. Ajinkya Rahane has been made vice-captain for the series. Vijay last played a Test in

March, having missed all three Tests in Sri Lanka with an injured right wrist. Since then, his competitive cricket has been restricted to one Ranji Trophy match for Tamil Nadu, one for India Green in the Duleep Trophy and four Twenty20 games in the Tamil Nadu Premier League. Vijay made 17 runs in two innings during the Duleep Trophy game, in which he also took five wickets, and for Tamil Nadu he made 4 and 55 earlier this month. Like Vijay, there are a few other members of India's Test squad who have not played international cricket since the tour of Sri Lanka. Cheteshwar Pujara turned out for Nottinghamshire in England, with disappointing returns of 333 runs in 12 innings, and since then has managed 35

and 13 for Saurashtra in the Ranji Trophy. Saha has featured in just two Ranji matches for Bengal, with scores of 55, 15 and 27 and six catches. The Sri Lanka series starts November 16 at Eden Gardens, followed by Tests in Nagpur from November 24 and Delhi from December 2. ## Denmark Open: Kidambi Srikanth wins third Super Series title



Odens, Oct 23  
Kidambi Srikanth clinched his third Super Series Premier title with a dominating straight-game victory over Korean veteran Lee Hyun Il in a lopsided final of the USD 750,000 Denmark Open here on Sunday. Playing an opponent 12 years his senior, Srikanth asserted his dominance with a 21-10 21-5 win over 37-year-old Lee in a match that lasted just 25 minutes here. World No. 8 Srikanth didn't give any chances to the more experienced Lee, who looked a pale shadow of the man, who had beaten World No. 2 Son Wan Ho in the semi-finals yesterday. The duo were tied 4-4, before Srikanth changed gears and used his deception and powerful smashes to lead 9-5. A return going to the net

gave a point to Lee but Srikanth produced a brilliant cross court net dribble to bamboozle his opponent and moved into the break with a healthy 11-6 lead when the Korean went wide. Lee had no answers to Srikanth's razor-sharp smashes and cross court returns as the Indian led 14-8. Lee also made judgement errors at the baseline and also

miscued his strokes as Srikanth extended his advantage to 17-8 with another smash. The Korean hit two long shots and then sent one at the net to hand over a 20-8 lead to Srikanth. **Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has congratulated Srikanth for the win. Shri Modi said in a tweet that the victory has made every Indian proud.**

working on the policy in this regard. The Minister said it will be the first education policy that was discussed layer by layer and threadbare. Dr. Singh said improving the quality of education from the primary level, making higher education affordable to people and accessing higher education to more are some of the major issues faced by the education system. He said skill development is one of the major areas the government has given thrust upon. To prevent the exodus of students to foreign countries seeking education, Dr. Singh said the higher education institutions should be developed to the standard of Centres of International Excellence. He said accessibility to higher education in the country is only 25.6 per cent while in USA 86 per cent Germany 80 and in China 60 per cent. The Minister pointed out that the aim of the government is to improve the higher education system in the country to make available to more students. Stating that higher education is very expensive, Dr. Singh said it has to be made more affordable to all sections in the society. Indicating that changes are necessary in the Right to Education Act, Dr. Singh said the Act lacks teeth. The Act provides right to compulsory primary education. But what is the remedy if parents do not send their children to school. So many things have to be done in improving the primary education in the country, he added. The meet was organised by Bharatheeya Vichara Kendram as part of the navathi celebration of P Parameswar, Director of Vichara Kendram.

## Shreyas Iyer, Mohammed Siraj get India call-up for NZ T20s; Jadeja, Ashwin ignored

Mumbai batsman Shreyas Iyer and Hyderabad pacer Mohammed Siraj received maiden T20 call-ups as the BCCI Selection Committee headed by MSK Prasad on Monday announced India squad for the three-match T20 series against New Zealand at home. However, there was no place for allrounder Ravindra Jadeja and offspinner Ravichandran Ashwin who were once again overlooked for limited-overs internationals.

Sunrisers Hyderabad, came up with some impressive performances for India A during a recent tour of South Africa and matches against New Zealand. Iyer has been a consistent performer for Mumbai and India A during the past one year. He scored a double hundred earlier this year in a warm-up game against Australia, besides a match-winning hundred in the final against South Africa A in the summit clash of an away tri-series. His call-up is on expected lines as he has had some good knocks for the Delhi Daredevils

in the 2016 edition of the Indian Premier League. The series begins November 1, which will also be Ashish Nehra's farewell match as he bids adieu to cricket. Thakkar was previously placed at No 5 position and the rise to the top spot must have given him the boost that he needed after finishing runner-up at the 2017 Serbian Junior and Cadet Open.

Thus, the boy from Surat ensured a place for himself in the ITTF World Junior Circuit Finals to be staged next February in Luxembourg.

## Lewis Hamilton wins United States Grand Prix, on verge of 4th Formula One title

Washington, Oct 23  
Lewis Hamilton moved a step closer to his fourth world championship on Sunday when he won the United States Grand Prix, coming home ahead of his nearest title rival Sebastian Vettel. The 32-year-old Briton, who started from a record 72nd pole position, recovered after losing his advantage at the start to regain the lead and steer his Mercedes to his ninth win this year, his fifth in Texas and the 62nd of his career. Four-time champion Vettel came home second for Ferrari and with three races remaining trails Hamilton by 66 points in the drivers' title race. Hamilton now needs just to finish only fifth in Mexico next weekend to claim a fourth world title. Hamilton's victory, with Mercedes team-mate Valtteri



Bottas finishing fifth, confirmed the team as constructors

champions for 2017 and for the fourth consecutive season.
