90% in favour of demonetisation, PM's app survey reveals

New Delhi, Nov 23
 Ninety per cent of the respondents have supported the government decision to scrap 500 and 1000 notes. Yesterday, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had sought people's views on the decision to of demonetisation through Narendra Modi App. In the survey, 92 per cent respondents felt that demonetisation will have an impact on curbing black money, corruption and terrorism. 99 per cent of respondents expressed their views that corruption and Black money needs to be fought and eliminated. 90 per cent respondents think that the Narendra Modi government's move to tackle black money is brilliant, while 92 per cent think that its efforts against corruption are very good. 98 per cent respondents believe that black money exists in India. In a tweet, Shri Modi thanked the people for their historic participation in the survey. In the public opinion survey, five lakh people participated and sent their



views on the ten questions posed to them during last 30 hours. The survey opened for the public at 10 AM yesterday. The survey sought people's opinion on whether they believe

Railways waives off service tax for booking online tickets

New Delhi, Nov 23
 In a bid to encourage cashless transactions in the wake of the demonetisation exercise, the Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation has done away with service tax charges on online bookings done through its website till 31st of December. A tax of 20 rupees is usually levied on sleeper class tickets and 40 rupees on AC class tickets while transacting via the IRCTC website. The tickets booked through the IRCTC website will become cheaper from today.

Ten pacts including civil nuclear power inked during PM's Japan visit: Govt

New Delhi, Nov 23
 Minister of State for External Affairs Shri M J Akbar today made a statement in both the Houses of Parliament about Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's visit to Japan on 11th and 12th of this month. Shri Akbar said, during the visit of Shri Modi, visible progress was achieved across the three pillars of bilateral engagement namely, strategic, economic and people to people. He informed, ten agreements covering diverse fields of engagement were signed during the visit. He said, a significant outcome of the visit was signing of the Agreement on cooperation in the peaceful uses of Nuclear energy. Japanese Prime Minister Mr Shinzo Abe along with Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi called upon Pakistan to bring the perpetrators of terrorist attacks, including November 2008 Mumbai attack and 2016 Pathankot attack to justice.

India's GSLV MK III rocket ready for launch early next year

New Delhi, Nov. 23
 The first developmental flight of India's GSLV MK III rocket is ready for launch early next year. It will put satellites weighing upto four tonne in desired orbits. Minister of State in Prime Minister's Office, Shri Jitendra Singh gave this information in the Lok Sabha today. He told the House in a written reply that the country's latest Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle, GSLV MK II is also to be launched soon. It has had three successful experimental flights so far. Powered by indigenous cryogenic engines, it is capable of carrying a weight of 150 kilogram into the solar orbit. He added that ISRO is going to involve the country's industry in commercial launch services.

IIT Kharagpur ranked top varsity in India in international survey

New Delhi, Nov 23
 For the second time in a row, IIT Kharagpur has been ranked as the top institution in the country by QS Employability Ranking, with IIT Bombay also figuring in the list of top 100 universities in the world. The IIT Kharagpur has been ranked in the range of 71-80, the highest position among Indian institutions, out of 200 universities from across the world. IIT Bombay, ranked next to IIT Kharagpur, is the only other institution from India to have been ranked among the top 100. (Contd. on last page)

Demonetisation: NABARD sanctions Rs 21,000 cr to district central co-op banks

New Delhi, Nov 23
 Economic Affairs Secretary Shri. Shaktikanta Das today said that for benefit of farmers National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development has sanctioned Rs 21,000 crores to rural areas to enable district cooperative banks to pass the money to primary agri-societies. Speaking to media in New Delhi this morning, Shri. Das said, it will help farmers for the present Rabi season. He said, no service charge will be levied on digital financial transactions using feature phones (which are not smartphones) till 31st December. He said, all switching charges and other charges have been waived till December 31 in RUPAY cards and service providers have also agreed to waive all debit cards till the same period. Shri Das said, the intention behind the gesture is to ensure that more and more people move towards digital transactions. RBI asks banks to ensure adequate cash supply to cooperative, rural Banks

New Delhi, Nov 23

The Reserve Bank of India has asked banks to ensure adequate cash supply to cooperative banks and Regional Rural Banks so that farmers can have enough valid notes needed for purchase of seeds, fertiliser and other inputs during the ongoing rabi season. In a notification issued in Mumbai last evening, RBI has estimated that about Rupees 35,000 crore would be required to support farmers and to ensure unhindered farming operations. The apex bank has stated, that National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) will be utilising its own cash credit limits up to about 23,000 crore rupees to ensure loans for Primary Agricultural Credit Society and farmers.

It further said, bank branches located in Agricultural Produce Market Committee may also be given adequate cash to facilitate smooth procurement. The decision comes after Finance Minister Arun Jaitley had a meeting with RBI, NABARD and all bankers and impressed upon them to make available funds to the cooperative sector as it is an important financing mechanism for rural India. The Reserve Bank has also asked banks to increase their vigilance and take stern action against employees who indulge in fraudulent practices while



exchanging or depositing the old 500 and 1000 rupee notes. RBI said it has noticed that some bank branch officials, in connivance with some miscreants, are indulging in fraudulent practices. It has asked banks to ensure strict compliance with rules set in this regard and maintain denomination wise details of all the notes deposited in the

account of each and every bank customer, regular or otherwise. It has asked banks to remain prepared to provide these details at short notice. In a relief to wedding families, RBI relaxed one of the conditions for withdrawal of 2.5 lakh rupees, from their own accounts by making declaration for payments beyond 10,000 rupees

only. Earlier, the drawee had to declare all payments made, of the 2.5 lakh rupees withdrawn from the account. With the public facing cash crunch, RBI has introduced special dispensation for small merchants and doubled the limit of semi-closed Prepaid Payment Instruments (PPIs) to 20,000 rupees to facilitate digital transactions. While balance in such PPIs cannot exceed 20,000 rupees at any point of time, the merchants can transfer funds from such PPIs to their own linked bank accounts up to 50,000 rupees per month, without any limit per transaction. This measure will be effective till 30th of December. In the statement RBI also dispelled rumours of fake 10 rupees coin in circulation. RBI asked people not to give credence to such rumours and continue to accept these coins as legal tender in all their transactions without any hesitation. Earlier, the Government had allowed farmers to purchase seeds with old denomination bank notes of 500 rupees from Centres, units and other outlets belonging to the Central or State Governments on production of proof of identity. The provision is in addition to the decision taken for making cash available with the farmers by permitting them to draw up to 25,000 rupees per week from their accounts.

Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn of Thailand was conferred the first 'World Sanskrit Award' on Monday for her contribution towards promotion of the language. The award was presented by Vice President Shri Hamid Ansari at a function. The award, instituted by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), is presented to eminent

Sanskrit scholars to recognise their outstanding contribution to the study/teaching/research in Sanskrit language and literature. The 60-year-old Thai Princess is an eminent Sanskrit scholar and had played a prominent role as Royal Patron for the World Sanskrit Conference held earlier in Bangkok. Sirindhorn is an educator and scholar of Sanskrit and Pali.

AH&VS keeps watch on entry of livestock and related products in Isles

Port Blair, Nov. 23

An outbreak of Avian Influenza (H5N8) has been confirmed in wild birds in Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, neighbouring states and domestic ducks in Kerala during the month of October, 2016. The Country (India), however, is free from the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza strain (H5N9) which has the potential to affect human health due to its zoonotic nature.

Though the H5N8 strain of Avian Influenza virus reported from the current outbreaks are not pathogenic and have not been known to affect humans anywhere in the World, it is always advisable to take precautionary measures. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands are free from most of the contagious and infectious diseases of livestock and poultry birds including avian influenza. To maintain this status the

Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS) keeps strict vigil on the entry of livestock and related products into these islands.

The AH&VS along with the Department of Environment and Forests keep a constant vigil on the occurrence and pattern of mortality in poultry and wild birds.

The general public have also been advised to report any unusual mortality in birds to the nearest veterinary institution for further investigation. The poultry farmers are also advised to ensure strict bio-security measures in their farms to prevent ingress of infectious diseases and to adopt hygienic measures for disposal of the poultry waste, preferably by incineration or deep burial.

The AH&VS Department conducts regular surveillance against the

disease and is well prepared to control and eradicate the disease if it is reported from the Islands.

The livestock owners and also the general public are hereby requested to contribute in keeping the territory free from avian influenza and other livestock diseases by following the guidelines for import of animal from mainland.

They are also requested to report any unusual mortality in livestock and poultry, including wild birds, to concerned authorities for further investigation.

It is also informed that this information is routine and issued in public interest to create awareness about the disease following outbreaks in isolated areas in New Delhi, Gwalior and Kerala during October, 2016, a communication from the Director, AH & VS said.


