## Digital technology paves way for efficient service delivery, governance: PM



New Delhi, Nov 23 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today said digital technology paves way for efficient service delivery and governance. Inaugurating fifth global conference on cyber space, Shri Modi said, digital technology has

emerged as a great enabler and helping business for growth of the economy. He said technology breaks barriers and has given a level playing field to the society. The Prime Minister said the power of technology

in improving governance is the need of the hour. He said the rapid change in digital domain has brought changes in the entire world and the cyber space remains a key area of innovation. Shri Modi said, his government wants to

make cyber space enabler for differently abled.

On the occasion, Shri Modi also launched UMANG app, which is a unified platform for multiple government of India mobile apps.

Global Conference on Cyber Space two-day mega event began in New Delhi. For the first time, the event is being organized in India. The theme of the conference is Cyber for All: A Secure and Inclusive Cyberspace for Sustainable Development.

Representatives from 124 countries and 33 Ministerial delegates from 31 countries are attending the conference.

New Delhi, Nov 23

Centre has promulgated Indian Forest (Amendment) Ordinance, 2017 to encourage bamboo cultivation in non-forest areas.

The ordinance exempts bamboo grown in non-forest areas from definition of tree, thereby dispensing with the requirement of felling and transit permit for its economic use.

Bamboo, though, taxonomically a grass, was legally defined as a tree under the Indian Forest Act, 1927.

Before this amendment, the felling and transit of bamboo grown on the forest as well non-forest land attracted the provisions of the Indian Forest Act and was a major

The Minister said with the removal of legal and regulatory hardships being faced by farmers and private individuals, it will create a viable option for the cultivation of 12.6 million hectares of cultivable wasteland.

The measure will go a long way in enhancing the agricultural income of farmers and tribals, especially in North-East and Central India.

The amendment will encourage farmers and other individuals to take up plantation/ block plantation of suitable bamboo species on degraded land, in addition to the plantation on agricultural land and other private lands under the agro-forestry mission.

impediment for bamboo cultivation by farmers on the non-forest land.

The Cabinet had yesterday approved the promulgation of the Ordinance in this regard.

Minister of Environment Dr Harsh Vardhan said bamboo grown in the forest areas shall continue to be

governed by the provisions of Indian Forest Act.

He underlined that the amendment and the resultant change in classification of bamboo grown in non-forest areas will usher in much needed and far-reaching reforms in the bamboo sector.

management dealing with school education, with the main objective of preparing a sound database as it serves as a powerful tool for effective planning of the system of elementary as well as secondary education. In the absence of reliable data, the projection for creation of new educational facilities

and infrastructural support becomes fraught with undesirable consequences and thereby may result in defective planning.

In order to develop a unified data base of schools from the academic year 2012-13, under U-DISE, data is being collected from all the schools (having classes

from Pre-Primary to Class-XII), irrespective of type or management. A n y school functional in these islands but not included in the previous year, i.e. 2016-17 U-DISE data, has been asked to approach to the State Project Office, SSA, Shiksha Sadan, Link Road, Port Blair with detailed

## Tenants advised to refrain from unauthorized cutting & dumping of Earth

Port Blair, Nov. 23

The District Administration has cautioned persons involved in illegal/unauthorised Earth cutting and dumping, not to indulge in any unauthorized activity of cutting, transportation and levelling of land without legal permit. In a press release received here today, the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman has stated that some tenants are changing the nature and character of their agriculture land by cutting/dumping earth illegally. Thus action is

being taken in the backdrop of serious and irreparable damage to the fragile ecology, specially the submerged pockets of land of these Islands by violating the provisions envisaged in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Land Revenue and Land Reforms Regulation 1966 as well as the A & N Islands Minor Mineral Rules, 2012.

While the Administration is combating to get development, the shoddy work being done is undoing all the hard work put in. Hence all such persons

involved in illegal/unauthorised Earth cutting and dumping are warned not to indulge in any unauthorized activity of cutting, transportation and levelling of land without legal permit and are directed to desist from such activities and any violation in this regard will be viewed very seriously and action will be taken under the provision of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Land Revenue and Land Reforms Regulation 1966 as well as the A & N Islands Minor Mineral Rules, 2012, the release added.

information of their institution. All the schools operational in Andaman & Nicobar Islands have been asked to extend necessary cooperation to the Cluster Resource Centres (CRCs) and Block Resource Centres (BRCs) for the collection of information for which the requisite U-DISE formats will be provided to schools through their concerned Cluster Resource Center (CRC). The refusal/failure on the part of any institution to provide the requisite information in the prescribed format within the due date shall invite consequences. VEC/SMC/PTA members are requested to ensure that the data being furnished should be as per physical existence and records available in the school. As per the guidelines of Ministry of Human Resource Development, GoI, New Delhi schools functional under the control of central authorities like Central School, JNV etc also need to provide data under U-DISE, a communication received here from the Education Deptt said.
