Issuance & updation of E-way bill mandatory UTGST Department carries out random checking for E-way bill updation of cargos at Haddo Wharf

Port Blair, July 23

E-way bill is basically a compliance mechanism wherein by way of a digital interface the person causing the movement of goods uploads the relevant information prior to the commencement of movement of goods and generates e-way bill on the GST portal. As per the provisions of Rule 138 of CGST Rules, 2017, issuance and updation of E-way bill is mandatory. It has been made compulsory in Andaman & Nicobar Islands from May, 2018. A team of officers from the



UTGST Department recently carried out random checking for E-way Bill updation of cargos coming from mainland to Andaman and Nicobar Islands at Haddo Wharf. During the checks, it was found that the cargos coming from various ports of mainland are accompanied with irregular E-way bills with information updated only

in Part - A and the information in Part - B being incomplete. Non-updation of E-way bill tantamount to imposition of penalty equal to the tax incidence on the goods in transit.

The UTGST Department has appealed to all the traders and other stakeholders to compulsory issue and update E-way bills or penal action on defaulters shall be taken by the Department. The Port Blair Municipal Council in coordination with Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs & National Safai Karamcharis Finance & Development Corporation (NSKFDC) & Nationalized partner bank i.e., Canara Bank conducted Swachhata Udhayami Loan Mela in the month of January 2021. Through loan mela, the objective is to provide required equipment towards sanitation & solid waste management to the registered Self Help Group (SHG) of PBMC under DAY-NULM & informal individuals working for sanitation &



waste management. In this connection, a loan disbursement programme was organized today. Out of 5 applications, 3 beneficiaries benefitted under Revised Self Employment Scheme for Rehabilitation of Manual Scavengers (SRMS) of NSKFDC. A loan amount of Rs. 23,41,730/- including a capital subsidy of Rs. 9,60,432/- through Canara Bank were disbursed directly to the vehicles/ machinery suppliers for procurement of vehicles/ machinery in regard to concerned SHG member to cater to their demands. It was also ascertained by PBMC that by adopting these machineries, the Self Help Group will enhance their sanitation & solid waste management works & thereby help in generating more livelihoods and shall also be able to pay the loan with interest @ 6% per annum, which is admissible for a repayment of loan period of 07-10 years. Vaccination- shield against the virus 2,72,312 eligible beneficiaries vaccinated in Isles so far

Port Blair, July 23

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with co-morbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.



As per data available, a total of 2, 72,312

beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 4112 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 2326 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which,

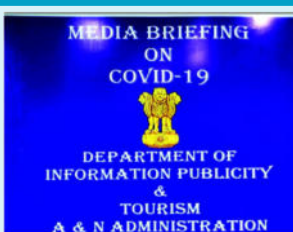

Tokyo, July 23
 The biggest sporting event in the world, the 32nd Summer Olympic Games got underway with a glittering opening ceremony in Tokyo this evening, after a one-year postponement due to the Corona virus pandemic. The mega quadrennial event is being held at the newly-built National Stadium in the Japanese capital. The event started with pink fireworks

bursting into the air after a countdown. The ceremony took place in the presence of just a few hundred officials and dignitaries, including Japan's Emperor Naruhito, French President, Mr. Emmanuel Macron and US First Lady Ms. Jill Biden. Boxer M.C. Mary Kom and Indian Men's Hockey team's captain Manpreet Singh led the 127-member strong Indian contingent.

Setting up of Mobile Labs for Soil Testing

New Delhi, July 23 (PIB) Since 2015, based on demand from states, 107 mobile labs have been set up under Soil Health Management programme. In all total 11531 labs have been set up including 491 static labs, 107 mobile labs, 8811 mini labs and 2122 village level labs. Government has been implementing Soil Health Card (SHC) scheme since 2015 to provide soil test

based fertilizer use recommendations periodically to the farmers in the country. Soil health card provides nutrient status of the soil along with prescription about balanced and integrated use of inorganic and organic fertilizers to maintain good health that results in increase in production. SHC based fertilizer use advisories are issued to farmers from

time to time. Demonstrations about balanced use of fertilizers based on soil health card recommendations and training to the farmers on proper and integrated use of fertilizers are integral part of the scheme. State/ district agriculture machinery and panchayats, village level rural development workers like KrishiSakhis, PasuSakhis are involved in educating

farmers on right use of fertilizers. Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) also imparts training, organizes front line demonstrations to educate farmers on this aspect. This information was given in a written reply by the Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shri Narendra Singh Tomar in Rajya Sabha today.

Promoting Organic Farming under Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY)

New Delhi, July 23 (PIB) Government of India has been implementing dedicated scheme of Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY) since 2015-16 to promote chemical free organic farming in the country in cluster mode. Under the programme, financial assistance of Rs 50000/ha/3 years is provided for cluster formation, capacity building, incentive for inputs, value addition and marketing. Out of it, Rs 31000/ha/3 years is provided for preparation / procurement of organic inputs such as bio/organic fertilisers, Farmers Welfare Shri biopesticides, seeds etc. through DBT and Rs 8800/

ha/ 3 years is provided for value addition and marketing that includes post harvest management practices like storage. A total fund of Rs 1197.64 cr has been released to states and UTs for the last four years under the programme. Financial assistance of Rs 3000 /hectare for 3 years is provided for Cluster formation (of 20 ha) and Capacity building including exposure visits, and trainings of field functionaries. This information was given in a written reply by the Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shri Narendra Singh Tomar in Rajya Sabha today.

Ayurvedic products helped to improve the immunity of people during the Corona pandemic

New Delhi, July 23 The Ministry of AYUSH has developed and launched the AYUSH Sanjivani mobile application to generate data on the acceptance and usage of Ayush advocacies and measures among the population and its impact in the prevention of COVID-19. A cross-sectional analysis of the responses received from approximately 1.47

crore respondents through this App, highlighted that 85.1% of the respondents reported use of AYUSH measures for prevention of COVID-19, among which 89.8% respondents agreed to have been benefitted from the practice of AYUSH advisory. 79.1% of the users responded that the AYUSH measures gave an overall feeling of good health. 63.4% reported improvement in parameters of well being like sleep, appetite, bowel habits, stamina and mental well being.

Ministry of AYUSH has prepared a draft scheme namely "Pradhan Mantri VRIKSHA AYUSH Yojna" for promotion of Herbal Cultivation to increase the production of medicinal herbs used in Ayurvedic drugs in near future, which is yet to be approved. This information was given by Minister of State for Ayush Shri Mahendra Bahai Munjapara in a written reply in Lok Sabha today.

Over 42.34 crore doses of COVID vaccine administered in the country so far

New Delhi, July 23 India has administered over 42 crore 34 lakh doses of COVID-19 vaccine so far under Nationwide Vaccination Drive. The Union Health Ministry said, more than 54 lakh 76 thousand vaccine doses were administered in the last 24 hours. The Ministry said, 38 thousand 740 patients recovered during the last 24 hours and the recovery rate now stands at 97.36 per cent. Till now, more than three crore four lakh people have recovered from COVID-19. The Country reported 35 thousand 342 new cases in last 24 hours. DRDO conducts successful flight-test of New Generation Akash missile

Chandipur, July 23 Defence Research and Development Organisation, DRDO conducted a successful flight-test of New Generation Akash missile from Integrated Test Range, Chandipur off the coast of Odisha on Friday. The test was carried out against a high-speed unmanned



aerial target which was successfully intercepted by the missile. The test was carried out amidst inclement weather conditions proving the all-weather capability of the weapon system. The system performance was validated through the data captured by a number of Radar, Telemetry and Electro Optical Tracking systems deployed by Integrated Test Range, Chandipur. 


