Additional measures to address the criticality are being expedited and power cuts have been necessitated during day time due to required maintenance of DG sets. I appeal to all citizens of Port Blair and South Andaman to conserve energy by adopting Demand Side Management to cope up with the crisis of power shortage. The residents are advised to consume power judiciously by using minimal lights and switch off all non-required lights, fans & other electrical gadgets. The use of Electric Irons, Refrigerators, Mixer / Grinder, Microwave Oven and Air Conditioners etc. may be strictly avoided during evening peak hours from 5.00 PM to 11.00 PM. Air Conditioning may be kept on 25°C which is appropriate for our weather. This not only reduces the power bill but also saves power by halving the demand.

I also appeal to all the Establishments and other large consumers who have their own standby DG Sets to run the same during evening peak hours from 5.00 PM to 11.00 PM. These joint efforts will help in mitigating the power situation thereby minimizing load shedding. Once again all the citizens and residents are requested to contribute towards mitigating the critical situation and cooperate by adopting prudent energy conservation measures.

The flight schedule of Inter-Island helicopter service has been revised. As per the new schedule, there will be total 16 sorties per week to Car Nicobar from Monday to Saturday, Saturday. For Katchal, Kamorta & Teressa, the services will be available weekly 6 days from Monday to Saturday, while for Chowra weekly 2 sorties will be available on Monday and Wednesday. For Campbell Bay, the helicopter services will be operated on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday & Saturday. Similarly, for Hutbay there

Harmanpreet will be assisted by Smriti Mandhana, who has been named as the vice-captain. The All-India Women's Selection Committee today named the T20I squad, which will play five T20Is against South Africa women after the completion of the ODI series. World Cup runner-up skipper Mithali Raj will lead the Indian women's squad in the three-match ODI series preceding the T20s.

T20 specialist Anuja Patil has been included in the 15-member squad as also debutant all-rounder Radha Yadav and wicketkeeper



Nuzhat Parveen.

Mona Meshram, wicketkeeper Sushma Verma, Ekta Bisht and Punam are the notable absentees from the ODI squad. The T20 squad also features 17-year-old Mumbai player Jemimah Rodrigues, who also has been named in the ODI team.

The teenager had grabbed headlines after scoring 202 in 163 balls in an U-19 game. The first match of the T20 series will be played in Potchefstroom on February followed by games at East London

Mock Drill on earthquake conducted by DSS

As a part of Disaster preparedness, the Directorate of Shipping Services has conducted a Mock Drill on earthquake followed by Tsunami today in the premises of Marine Dockyard. This Mock Drill was conducted in coordination with the Directorate of Disaster Management, A & N Administration. In the mock drill, the scenario of major earthquake was replicated, followed with a major Tsunami suppose to hit Port Blair in 30 to 60 minutes.

Immediately on activation of Tsunami siren installed inside the Marine Dockyard, all personnel following the Standard Operating Procedure, vacated their respective place of work and



through the prescribed escape route reached to the pre determined Tsunami Shelter Point at Marine Hill near IMF Canteen within a span of 23 minutes. Simultaneously, all operational vessels were also moved to deep sea. Altogether 753 personnel including employees of DSS, IRBn personnel posted at Marine Dockyard and

staff of private contractors working inside the marine dockyard, participated in the mock drill. Eventually at Shelter Point a combined briefing was undertaken by Shri. Mahinder Singh (AME) the Nodal Officer, Disaster Management, DSS and the officers from the Directorate of Disaster Management, a communication said.

Indian men's hockey team registered a fighting 3-2 win over hosts New Zealand in their opening match at the second-leg of Four-Nation Invitational Tournament, here on Wednesday.

Lalit Upadhyay (7th minute), Harjeet Singh (32nd) and Rupinder Pal Singh (36th) scored for India while New Zealand's goals came from sticks of Daniel Harris (23rd) and Kane Russell (37th). The home team were dominant early on and were quick to make potential circle penetrations but the Indian defence stood tall.

India made a breakthrough soon when skipper Manpreet Singh found Vivek Sagar Prasad swiftly moving towards



the top of the circle. But Vivek's reverse hit rebounded off the New Zealand keeper and found Lalit who scored past Devon Manchester to give India a 1-0 lead.

The second quarter saw New Zealand fight back, constantly attacking the Indian circle which kept Indian goalkeeper P R Sreejesh busy at the post. One such circle penetration won New Zealand their first penalty corner of the match but

Russell's drag flick was well saved by Sreejesh.

An error by an Indian defender saw New Zealand equalise in the following minutes when Harris scored from a rebound. India came back with a fresh approach after the change of ends and striker Mandeep Singh was clever to earn their first penalty corner of the match in the 32nd minute which was successfully converted by Harjeet.

Clinical Federer into 43rd Grand Slam semi

Melbourne, Jan 24

Defending champion Roger Federer swept into a record 14th Australian Open semi-final with an immaculate straight sets win over long-time rival Tomas Berdych on today.

The second seed cruised to a 7-6 (7/1), 6-3, 6-4 win in 2hr 14min on Rod Laver Arena and will face unseeded South Korean Chung Hyeon on Friday for a place in the final. The 19-time Grand Slam champion, who hasn't lost in five matches against Berdych in Melbourne, will play in his 43rd Grand Slam semi-final, a



record for the post-1968 Open Era.

The Swiss legend has yet to face Chung, who has got past six-time champion Novak Djokovic and world No.4 Alexander Zverev to get to the

last four. Federer's latest victory was his 92nd in 105 matches in Melbourne to make the Australian Open his most successful Grand Slam in terms of matches won along with Wimbledon.

Last year, aged 10, Hursey became the youngest player to represent Wales' senior table tennis team when she helped her country beat Kosovo in the European Championship

qualifier.

Hursey, who took up table tennis at the age of five, said she hopes to make the most of the opportunity without putting too much pressure on herself. "I don't normally get nervous. I know I am so young and will have lots of chances," she told BBC Wales.

lies in small details and our wealth, status etc. does not guarantee happiness". He shared tips on how we can live a fully fledged life without extravagant expenditure. He also drew the attention of the students towards poverty stricken world and urged them to refrain from wasting food and resources.

Prof. Kural is one of the most well-known Turkish environmental activists and a pioneer of the anti-smoking movement. On the subject of environmental protection, he gives free conferences in schools, if he is invited to. He has traversed across the globe and covered 248 different countries so far and intends to complete the remaining by this year. His mission of travelling the world is mainly to experience the un-experienced, to see the unseen and to share the beauty of this world with the people he comes across. In the past, Kural has moderated several television programs and has written several articles too for the Turkish daily.
