along with Tehsildar, Port Blair inspected the site on receipt of information from area Patwari/Public and thereafter the eviction process was carried out.

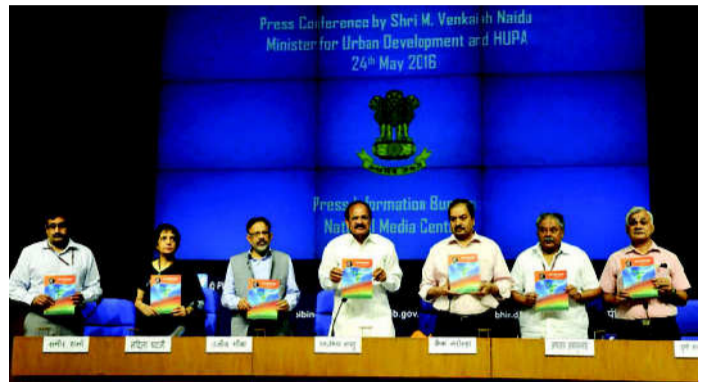

## Port Blair successful in Smart City challenge

## Lt. Governor gives credit to Isles citizens

Port Blair, May 24  
The Ministry of Urban Development Govt of India has declared Port Blair city selected amongst the list of the 23 cities under Fast Track Smart City Challenge. The Lt. Governor had congratulated the citizens of the city on being successful. He has further congratulated the Mission Directorate, A&N Administration, PBMC and other line departments in giving shape to the Smart City Proposal of the Port Blair City. The Lt. Governor has also expressed his gratitude to the Hon'ble Prime Minister and Hon'ble Union Minister of Urban development for their vision, leadership and guidance.

Port Blair city had participated in Smart City challenge under fast track city in which 23 cities had taken part from all over the country. Accordingly, the Smart City Proposal of the city was revised to be inline with the demands and desires of the citizens. Need assessment survey of the citizens through Micro Planning Framework was conducted by PBMC to assess the genuine aspirations of the public. The projects were framed under smart city proposal ensuring that the issues raised by the people are addressed in a "SMART" way. Further the detailed proposal with respective project scope, finances and execution strategy was worked out in consultation with various departments of the administration. The finalised proposal was submitted to the Ministry on 21st May 2016. After rigorous evaluation the proposal was announced successful. Ministry will be extending financial support to Port Blair city for execution of various projects proposed under the smart city. This will



Announcing the winners at a media conference on the occasion of two years of the Government in office, Minister of Urban Development and Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu said that the cities that participated in the competition improved the quality of smart city plans by up to over 25% to become eligible for selection. With the selection of these 13 cities, 25 States/UTs are now covered under Smart City Mission. On the occasion, Shri Naidu released a publication 'Urban Renaissance : May, 2014-May, 2016' giving a detailed account of paradigm shift in attitudes and approaches to urban planning and governance and the major drivers of urban revival and transformation set in motion during the last two years.

Shri Naidu informed that Lucknow that missed the list of first 20 smart cities improved the quality of its smart city plan by 19% to make it to the select list. Other winners of Fast Track competition were ; Warangal, Telangana (13%), Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh (27%), Chandigarh (9%), Raipur, Chattisgarh (25%), New Town Kolkata (11%), Bhagalpur, Bihar (25%), Panaji, Goa (9%), Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar Islands (26%), Imphal, Manipur (27%), Ranchi, Jharkhand (27%), Agartala, Tripura (25%) and Faridabad, Haryana (12%).

These 13 cities were selected based on the marks scored by them in the Fast Track competition and the bench marks set by the top performers in the first round of Smart City Challenge competition in which the first 20 cities were selected from among 98 mission cities.

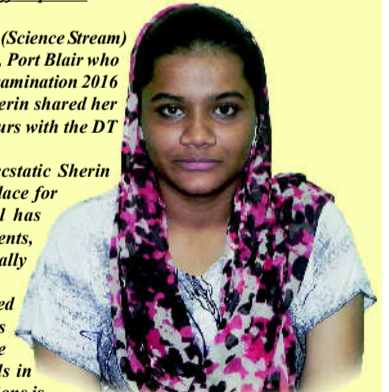

Rio medal winners to be considered for Khel Ratna, Arjuna

New Delhi, May 24  
In a bid to ensure that Olympic medallists get immediate recognition, the Sports Ministry today said medal winners from the upcoming Rio Games will be considered for this year's Khel Ratna and Arjuna Awards. The ministry said the decision has been taken so that athletes need not wait for one full year after their medal-winning performances at the Olympic Games.



The medal winners in individual events who have already not been conferred with Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna in the past will be considered for the highest sporting honour. "Medal winners in team events, who have played stellar roles in the medal won by the team for the country in Rio Olympics 2016 such as number of goals scored, number of goals saved etc., and who have already not been conferred with Arjuna Award in the past will be considered for Arjuna Awards," the Ministry said.

As per the existing provisions of the schemes of Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna and Arjuna Awards, sports achievements of the sports persons for the last four years preceding the year of award, i.e., sports achievements during the period 2011 to 2015 are to be considered.

Pankaj Advani wins Asian 6-Red snooker

Mumbai, May 24  
India's ace cueist Pankaj Advani created history in Abu Dhabi by clinching the Asian 6-Red snooker title. Advani thus became the first in the world to hold both world and continental titles in 6-Red snooker at the same time, according to information received here. The double IBSF World 6-Red snooker champion stamped his authority again in the short format of the game, defeating top-seeded Malaysian Keen Hoh Moh 7-5 on Sunday night. Advani kept his nerve in a battle of fluctuating fortunes. With a confidence boosting 6-1 semifinal victory against compatriot Aditya Mehta to book his spot in the finals and coming closer to winning his first continental title, Advani clearly

walked to the table with the utmost poise winning the first frame 39-4. With a loss of the second frame, 6-51 to the Malaysian who scored a break of 51, Advani won the third frame 40-14 before losing the fourth frame, 37-0. The fifth and sixth frame belonged solely to the 30-year-old Advani who cleared the table 41-7 and 44-8 respectively. With the Indian ace leading the match 4-2 at the end of six frames, Keen Hoh Moh fought back by winning the seventh frame, 38-21 only to lose the eighth frame 24-45 with Advani securing a 45 break.
