## Britain votes to exit EU in historic referendum

London, June 24  
In a historic development, the UK has voted to leave the European Union after 43 years as the 'Brexit' camp on Friday took a seemingly unassailable lead over the 'Remain' camp in a down-to-wire referendum with far reaching implications for the world. 52 per cent of the Britons in Thursday's vote favoured leaving the 28-member EU, while 48 per cent supported staying in the bloc. The vote - which

saw an extremely high turnout of around 72 per cent with over 30 million people voting- reverses the public verdict back in 1975, when the UK voted to remain a member of then European Economic Community, which later became the EU. The UK will be the first country to leave the bloc. As expected, the result sent ripples across the world as the pound fell to its lowest level against the dollar since 1985.

**BCCI to host mini IPL overseas in September**

New Delhi, June 24  
The BCCI is set to introduce a new Twenty20 event, to be branded as mini IPL, outside India in September.  
"In the month of September, the BCCI is willing to host a mini IPL or IPL overseas with all the eight teams participating," BCCI president Anurag Thakur said at the conclusion of the Board's Working Committee meeting in Dharamsala.  
"It will be a shorter format, not home and away matches but a lesser number of matches. In a two-week window we should be able to complete it," he said.  
The BCCI move was on the cards with the scrapping of the Champions League T20 last year. The details of the shortened version of IPL are yet to be chalked out and possible venues are US and UAE, which has already hosted part of the IPL in 2014.  
The full-fledged IPL lasts about for almost two months.  
The ninth edition of the tournament was held in India from April 9 to

May 29.  
Minutes after Thakur's statement, the BCCI issued a release stating that "BCCI will explore the option of hosting Mini IPL overseas in September".  
Going overseas is not new to IPL as the entire 2009 edition was held in South Africa due to the general election in India.  
Anil Kumble's appointment as the head coach of the Indian team was also approved at the meeting.  
In another significant decision, the Committee approved that an Under-19 Cricketer can represent India only once in the Under 19 World Cup and any player entering the system at Under 19 stage can play only two seasons of Under 19 cricket.  
Amongst other decisions taken, the BCCI will now have a separate marketing budget for the promotion of the Test cricket.  
"The BCCI and the State Units will work together towards

promotion and marketing of International matches," said the BCCI statement as the Indian team gets ready for a busy home season consisting of 13 Tests.  
The Working Committee also approved the Technical Committee's recommendation to hold Ranji Trophy matches at neutral venues.  
In another big change to domestic cricket, the Committee announced a new T20 league in place of Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy.  
"First, all state teams will play an Inter zonal league in their respective zones. All five zones selecting a zonal side to play an Inter Zonal League will follow it," the release added.  
The release also stated that BCCI will start annual awards for state associations in categories like best website, best Facebook page, best Twitter handle, best Instagram, best media facility and best media operations.

**Ranji Trophy to be held at neutral venues, confirms BCCI**

Port Blair, June 24  
The RSC Open Volleyball League-cum-knockout tournament will be held at the Multipurpose Hall of Netaji Stadium from June 25, 2016. The Director of Sports, Shri Ingit Pratap Singh, will inaugurate the tournament at 4.30 pm as the chief guest. The Chairperson, Municipal Council, Smt Sheela Singh will be the guest of honour.

New Delhi, June 24  
In a revolutionary move, the BCCI's working committee has approved the technical committee's proposal to hold all upcoming Ranji Trophy matches at neutral venues.  
Anurag Thakur, the BCCI president, confirmed the development on Friday in Dharamsala, where the board is conducting its first annual cricket

conclave. As TOI had reported earlier this week, quite a few associations have opposed the idea, which was recommended by the Sourav Ganguly-led panel last month. The concept was mooted after many Ranji Trophy games finished last season inside three, or even two days, as teams opted to go for square turners in their quest for a win.

**RBI releases framework on payments systems**

Mumbai, Jun 24  
Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released its much awaited 'Vision-2018' document yesterday. The 'Payment and Settlement Systems in India: Vision-2018' aims at building best of class payment and settlement systems for a 'less-cash' India and ensuring access of mobile banking services to even basic phone users.  
The current vision document is focusing on improving the infrastructure and regulations in the country to reduce cash transactions and increase use of technology. RBI said that its vision document focuses on responsive regulation, robust infrastructure, effective supervision and customer centricity.  
RBI said the proposed new policies to be framed under

the Vision with focus on electronic payments will influence trends in payment systems in the country.  
Service providers will be encouraged to use technology to provide innovative easy to use

mobile based payment solutions in an interoperable environment without compromising on security. RBI expects the Vision to result in a continued decrease in the share of paper-based clearing instruments.

**UN strongly condemns latest North Korean missile launches**

New York, June 24  
The UN Security Council has strongly condemned North Korea for launching two ballistic missiles this week. The UNSC termed them a grave violation of a ban on all ballistic missile activity that is contributing to the country's nuclear weapons programme.  
The council reiterated its demand that North Korea end its flagrant violations, halt all nuclear tests and ballistic missile activity, and comply with five UN sanctions resolutions

imposed since the country's first nuclear test in 2006.  
In a statement approved by all 15 members last night, the council said missile launches improve North Korea's nuclear delivery systems and increase tensions in the region.  
The council urged all countries to redouble efforts to fully implement sanctions against North Korea, especially those imposed in March which were the toughest in two decades.

He said that economies of the SCO member countries will also benefit in the areas of trade, information technology, agriculture and health care. Shri Modi thanked all members of the SCO for supporting India's inclusion in the group saying that India will sign memorandum of obligations which will initiate the formal process of bringing India as full member in the group. He said India will take part in the next SCO to be held at Kazakhstan next year. Earlier Russian President Mr Vladimir Putin told that India would India's membership would be formally announced next year.
