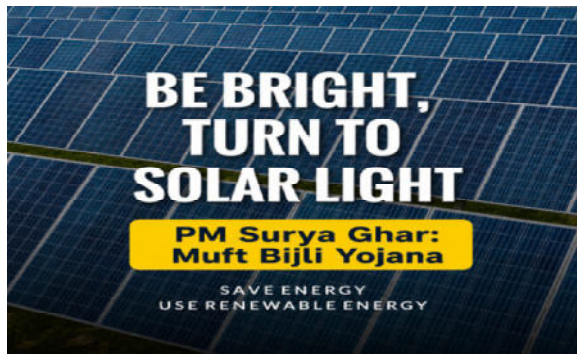

Outbreak of Canine Distemper disease in dogs reported in Sri Vijaya Puram; Dog owners cautioned

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 24

The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, has noted the occurrence of Canine Distemper Virus (CDV) infection in dogs in and around Sri Vijaya Puram over the last couple of weeks. This is a highly contagious and life-threatening viral disease that primarily affects unvaccinated or improperly vaccinated dogs.

Canine Distemper is caused by a Morbillivirus and attacks the respiratory, gastrointestinal, and nervous systems of puppies and adult dogs. Common symptoms include high fever (103-104°F), dry nose, congested eyes, ocular-nasal discharge, pneumonia, loss of appetite, vomiting, abdominal pain, r e s t l e s s n e s s , excitement, chomping of the jaw, excessive salivation, convulsions, epilepsy, chorea (jerky muscle movements), and hardening of f o o t p a d s (hyperkeratinization) leading to lameness.

Vaccination is the only means of prevention. Once infected there is no specific cure for Canine Distemper. Affected animal is managed by providing supportive care, preventing secondary infections, control of vomiting, diarrhea and neurological symptoms, and administration of fluids to combat dehydration.

Pet owners are strongly advised to take the following immediate preventive measures to protect their dogs and control the spread of the disease:

- ♦ Maintain strict cleanliness in the premises using mild disinfectants and antiseptic lotions. Isolate affected pets immediately.
- ♦ Limit the exposure of unvaccinated dogs to other dogs, especially in public places.
- ♦ Keep food and water

District Administration (SA) continues Anti-Encroachment Drive; illegal plantation removed at Shaheed Dweep

The District Administration, South Andaman in its continuous efforts to preserve community spaces and to ensure lawful use of public property has been keeping strict vigil and monitoring and Government land is being restored back from encroachment by unscrupulous elements in past few days in South Andaman District.

Pursuant to the ongoing drive, eviction operations were carried out today at Neil Kendra village, Shaheed Dweep. During the operation, encroachments in the form of unauthorized plantations raised on Government Revenue land were identified and removed. An area m e a s u r i n g approximately 1000 square meters of Government Revenue land has been reclaimed and restored to Government Khata.

The Administration has reiterated its zero-tolerance approach t o w a r d s encroachments and emphasized that any u n a u t h o r i z e d occupation of Government land will attract stringent legal action under the relevant provisions of law. Advanced Gastrointestinal Cancer Care now closer to home: GB Pant Hospital successfully performs two major Minimally Invasive GI Cancer Surgeries

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 24

In a significant milestone for healthcare in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the Department of Surgery at GB Pant Hospital has successfully performed two major cancer surgeries using advanced laparoscopic (minimally invasive) techniques.

The surgeries were carried out by Professor Dr. Saji Vargheese, Senior Surgical Consultant, Minimal Access Surgeon and Dr. Anis Akhtarkhavari, Assistant Professor of Paediatric Surgery, with the support of Professor Dr. Narayan and his anaesthesia team, showcasing the growing surgical expertise available within the Islands.

The first patient, a 67-year-old male diagnosed with cancer of the gastroesophageal junction, underwent a laparoscopic transhiatal esophagogastrectomy with esophagogastric anastomosis and feeding jejunostomy. This highly complex operation is considered one of the most challenging procedures

in gastrointestinal cancer surgery. The successful completion of this surgery through a minimally invasive approach is an extraordinary achievement and is believed to be the first such laparoscopic procedure performed in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

The second patient, a 37-year-old female with carcinoma of the colon, successfully underwent a laparoscopic extended right hemicolectomy, enabling complete removal of the cancer-bearing segment along with the associated lymphatic drainage.

Notably, both patients were fully diagnosed and evaluated at GB Pant Hospital using the institution's endoscopy and colonoscopy facilities, highlighting its capability to provide comprehensive gastrointestinal cancer care-from diagnosis to definitive surgical treatment-within the Islands.

These surgeries reflect the advanced laparoscopic skills of the surgical team. Compared with conventional open surgery, laparoscopic techniques offer several advantages, including smaller incisions, less postoperative pain, reduced blood loss, shorter hospital stay, faster recovery, and earlier return to normal activities, while maintaining excellent oncological outcomes.

The successful management of these complex cancer cases locally reduces the need for patients to travel to mainland centres for advanced treatment, thereby easing the financial, physical, and emotional burden on patients and their families.

This achievement underscores GB Pant Hospital's commitment to delivering state-of-the-art surgical and Gastrointestinal cancer care services to the people of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, a press release from DHS said.

This award has been started with the objective of raising the prestige of teachers and giving

public recognition to the meritorious services of outstanding teachers working in primary, middle and higher secondary schools.

All school teachers and heads of schools working in recognized primary/middle/higher secondary schools run by State Govt./UT Administration, local bodies, aided by State Govt. / UT Administration, Central Government Schools, schools run by Ministry of Defence and Eklayva Model Residential Schools (EMRS) run by Ministry of Tribal Affairs and school affiliated to CBSE or CISCE are eligible for consideration for the award.

Normally retired teachers are not eligible for the award but those who have served a part of this calendar year are

eligible (at least four months i.e, upto 30th April in the year to which national awards relate) may be considered if they fulfil all other conditions.

Teachers/Headmaster should not have indulged in tuitions, contractual teachers and Shiksha Mitras Educational Administrators, Inspectors of Education, staff of Training Institutes, are not eligible for the award.

Registrations for the self-nomination by teachers on the online web portal <http://nationalawards toteachers.education.gov.in> is open from 15.06.2026 and last date for the same is 10.07.2026. However, the date for final submission of self-nomination is 13.07.2026, a press release from Directorate of Education said.

bowls clean. Most common household disinfectants, including a 1:20 dilution of household bleach with water, can effectively kill the virus.

♦ Provide a semi-solid, soft or liquid diet to dogs showing symptoms. Maintain the balance of water, electrolytes, and probiotics by feeding curd. In cases of severe vomiting and diarrhea, fluid therapy under veterinary supervision is essential. ♦ Ensure your dog is properly vaccinated. The first dose is usually given between 6-8 weeks of age, followed by boosters every 3-4 weeks until the puppy is 16-20 weeks old.

New species of Wild Brinjal discovered in A&N Islands

Sri Vijaya Puram,June 24

Scientist from Botanical Survey of India, Dr. Lal Ji Singh discovered a new species of Wild Brinjal from one of the remote Island of Andaman group of Islands which situated under the biodiversity hotspots referred to as a part of the Indo-Burma Hotspot.

It was discovered in an evergreen forest of Middle Andaman by Eminent Botanist, Dr. Lal Ji Singh. Distribution of Solanum pandeyi is known only in restricted areas of the Islands and its conservation status is accessed as "Data Deficient (DD)" as per the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) categories and criteria. Recently its molecular analysis has been published in an International Journal of Botanical Taxonomy and Geobotany: Feddes Repertorium 136(3):147-274, 2025 with the collaboration of Dr. Shruti Kasana, University of Delhi. The new species of Wild Brinjal discovered from Andaman is named as Solanum pandeyi in honor of a Botanist, Prof. Arun Kumar Pandey, Department of Botany, University of Delhi. It is locally called as wild orange eggplant (Jungali Narangi Brinjal/ Jungali Narangi Baigan in Hindi) based on the colour of fruit and there pulp. This species has resistance potential against the brinjal crop diseases which indicates good genetic resource for develop a high-yielding, disease-resistant variety of edible brinjal variety -said by Lal Ji Singh.

Botanical Scientist, Dr. Singh is heading the regional centre of Botanical Survey of India and working in exploratory and conservation studies on flora of Andaman and Nicobar Islands since 2010. His dedication in the field of biodiversity research led to significant contribution in the taxonomy of flowering plants and commitment towards conservation of biodiversity discovered a new genus and more than 28 new

Awards Committee
