Disclose undeclared assets by Sept 30: PM Modi

New Delhi, Jul 24 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has asked people with undeclared assets to come clean by 30th of September this year, and take benefit from the Income Declaration Scheme. Speaking at a felicitation function organized for the Prime Minister by All India Gems and Jewellery Trade Federation on Saturday, Shri Modi said it is a better alternative than living in fear of the government and Income Tax officers. Saying that



he wanted citizens to sleep peacefully, Shri Modi said he would not like to take action against people who do not declare assets till the last date of the scheme. The Prime Minister asked the gems and jewelry industry to work towards establishing a global presence and to look beyond the domestic market. He also called for

innovation and skill development to achieve the objective. Shri Modi noted that there is an increasing global demand for handmade jewellery. Recalling the recent issues related to excise duty, the Prime Minister said these issues gave an opportunity for the gems and jewellery industry and the Government to better understand each other.

Govt. proposes four more bills for passing in current session of Parliament

New Delhi, July 24 The government has proposed four more bills for consideration and passing in next week of the current Monsoon session of Parliament. These include the Benami Transactions (Prevention) Amendment Bill, 2015 and the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2016 in Lok Sabha and the Prevention of Corruption (Amendment) Bill, 2013 and the Whistle Blowers Protection (Amendment) Bill, 2015 in Rajya Sabha.

Port Blair, July 24

Alliance Air is suspending its CRJ flight operated on Delhi-Bhubaneswar- Port Blair and the chartered flights on Port Blair-Car Nicobar sector w.e.f. 1st August, 2016. This is due to the withdrawal of CRJ aircraft from the fleet of Alliance Air.

To cater the needs of passengers, the Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen. A.K. Singh (Retd) is taking up the case with the Civil Aviation Minister to find some alternative by introduction of services of wide bodied aircraft by Air India on sector Delhi-Bhubaneswar-Port Blair or by increasing the frequency of Air India flight AI 487/488 on Delhi-Vizag-Port Blair sector on daily basis.

Further, arrangement has also been made for conveyance of civilian passengers in IAF Dornier aircraft on Port Blair-Car Nicobar-Campbell bay sector, a communication from the Dy. Director, Civil Aviation said here today.

Air Force and Navy intensify search operations for the missing IAF aircraft

New Delhi, July 24 The Air Force and Navy have intensified search operations for the missing AN-32 aircraft. Speaking to media Public Relations Officer of the Indian Navy Captain D K Sharma said, the search has covered four lakh square kilometres. He said, 12 Naval ships and 4 coast guard ships along with 17 aircraft from Air Force, Navy and Coast Guard have been mobilized towards this operation. Captain Sharma said, the weather improved marginally today thereby

aiding deployment of additional assets and intensification of the search in a larger area. The sea however continues to be rough, making the conditions challenging. He said, various other government agencies have also been requested to provide satellite imagery of the area to aid the operations which will continue till further review of the situation. The family members of all personnel on board the missing aircraft were reached out to by their respective Services and

were assured that they are not alone and the government has mobilized all possible assets in one of the largest operations of its kind.

Need to be best in every match to be medal contender: Oltmans

Bangaluru, July 24
Their recent impressive showings have raised serious expectations from the national men's hockey team in the Olympics and it's chief coach Roelant Oltmans said if his wards can give their best in every match, India stand a good chance of finishing in the podium in Rio.
"The team is eager and ready to challenge itself. In the lead up to the Olympics, we have shown some really good performances. It shows the ability of this team against the top sides in the world. Now the idea is to show and prove that it was not one-off," Oltmans said ahead of the team's departure for the Games.
"We still have to show that we can repeat such a performance in every match at the Olympic Games. Our challenge is to do our best every day in Brazil. If we're able to do so, we stand a good chance of a medal," he added.
After a 10-day gruelling national camp here, the 16-member Indian team departed for Madrid in the early hours on Sunday, where they will play two friendly matches against Spain before heading to Rio. Newly-appointed captain PR Sreejesh, who replaced long-

standing skipper Sardar Singh, was upbeat about his team's prospects in Rio.
"It's heartening to see the kind of support we are getting ahead of the Olympics. This will only motivate us to do better," said Sreejesh, who successfully led the Indian team to a historic silver medal at the recent FIH Champions Trophy.
"We hope to gain some match practice in Madrid. We leave for Rio on July 29 from Madrid. The boys are upbeat, well prepared and eager to start the tournament," he added.
Sreejesh said in a sporting carnival like the Olympics, they can ill-afford to take any team lightly. "Every match in Rio will be crucial. Every team will play to win, be it Ireland, Canada or Holland. We can't take anyone lightly.

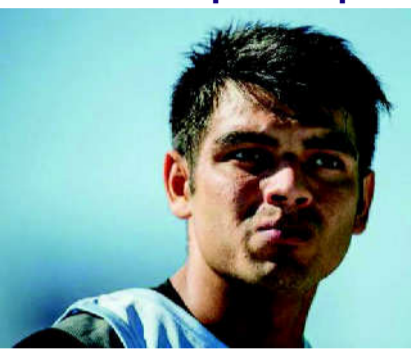
PM to flag off 'Run for Rio' event at India Gate in New Delhi on 31st July

RBI to monitor banks on customer rights

Mumbai, July 24
Reserve Bank will shortly start monitoring banks on issues relating to customer rights in five broad areas. RBI Executive Director U S Paliwal said the areas on which the regulator will be conducting surveys and supervision at various banks are - right to privacy, right to fair treatment &

transparency, fair and honest dealing, right to suitability and right to grievance redress & compensation.
Mr. Paliwal said RBI had asked the banks to have their board-approved plans in place by June 30. Now RBI will start monitoring and supervising the banks on issues relating to customer rights. He said RBI has its own mechanism to see how banks are doing on this. He was talking to reporters in Mumbai on the sidelines of an event organised by Dun & Bradstreet, a company which is the world's leading source of commercial information and insight on businesses.
