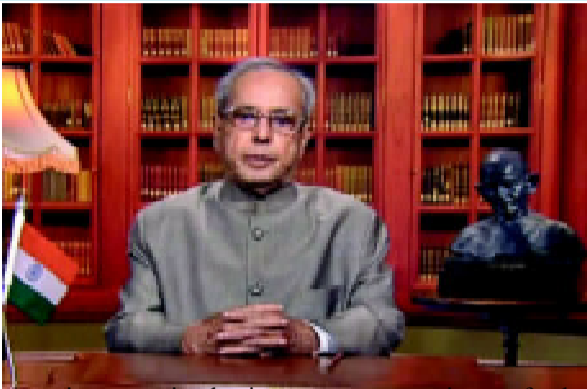

New Delhi, Jul 24
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee today said India's soul resides in pluralism and tolerance and the nation derives strength from tolerance. In his farewell address to the nation, the President said there are divergent strands in public discourse, but the essential prevalence of multiplicity of opinion cannot be denied. Expressing concern over the increasing violence in society, he said public discourse should be free from all forms of violence, physical as well as verbal. He said only a non-violent society can ensure the participation of all sections of the people, especially the marginalized and the dispossessed, in the democratic process. 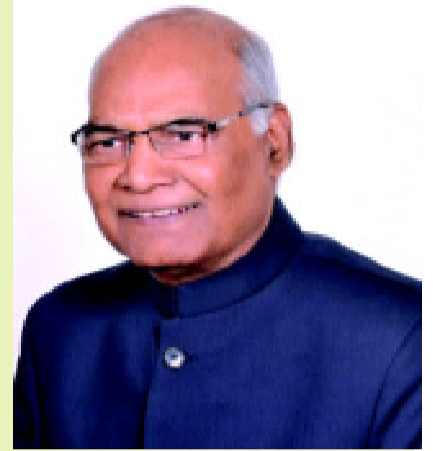

HM chairs first meeting of Islands Development Agency

Smith, Ross, Aves, Long & Little Andaman identified for holistic development in the first phase

New Delhi, July 24

The Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh chaired the first meeting of the newly constituted Islands Development Agency (IDA), here today. The IDA was set up on June 01, 2017 following the Prime Minister's review meeting for the development of islands.

The Union Home Minister presented the vision for developing India's maritime economy while preserving the natural eco-system and addressing the security concerns. He emphasized upon the need for sustainable development of Islands with people's participation.

The CEO, NITI Aayog made a detailed presentation on the current status and the way forward for holistic development of identified islands. He informed that Concept Development Plans and Detailed Master Plans are being prepared for identified islands with

principles of sustainability, people's participation, eco-system preservation and determination of carrying capacity as the guiding principles. Such an exercise is being taken up for the first time in the country. Admiral D.K. Joshi, former Navy Chief and Vice Chairman of IDA suggested taking up suitable interventions for sustainable implementation of planned projects. During the meeting, the progress being made for

the formulation of integrated master plans and other matters concerning the islands development were reviewed. It was also decided that Lt. Governor of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Administrator of Lakshadweep Islands will be included as members of IDA.

After detailed consultations with key stakeholders, 10 Islands namely Smith, Ross, Aves, Long and Little Andaman in Andaman & Nicobar and Minicoy, Bangaram, Suheli,

Cherium and Tinnakara in Lakshadweep have been identified for holistic development in the first phase. With this meeting, the efforts for holistic development of Islands of India received a major boost.

Other Members of the IDA including Cabinet Secretary, Home Secretary, Secretary (Environment, Forests and Climate Change), Secretary (Tourism) and Secretary (Tribal Welfare) also participated in the meeting.

CS to launch linking of CSCs with STARS today

Five CSCs to be enabled in the first phase

Port Blair, July 24

The Chief Secretary, A&N Islands, Shri Anindo Majumdar will launch the linking of Ship Ticket Advance Reservation System (STARS) with the Citizen Service Centres (CSCs) tomorrow (July 25) from the CSC located at Sippighat. The launching of the service would facilitate the citizens to buy their ship tickets from the various CSCs located across the Islands. The existing STARS programme was originally designed by

CRIS and commissioned in the year 2007 which has now been upgraded to be dovetailed with all the CSCs and would facilitate the purchase and cancellation of tickets through the widely dispersed CSCs across all the Islands.

The service will be launched initially at the five CSCs located at Sippighat, Ferrargunj, Bathu Basti, Dairy Farm and Bambooflat, on July 25 at 12 pm. The Directorate of Shipping Services would

thereafter in a span of next two months integrate all the remaining 25 odd CSCs in a phased manner and complete integration of all CSCs with STARS by 30th September 2017.

The A&N Administration has also approved a CSC service charge of Rs. 5/- towards each transaction of Foreshore and Inter Island sector and Rs.10/- for bunk and Rs. 20/- for cabin class of mainland vessels which will have to be borne by the respective

Permanent Enrolment Centre for Aadhaar set up at CS&CA Deptt. Separate slot for school going children

Port Blair, July 24

A Permanent Enrolment Centre for Aadhaar related services has become operational at the Directorate of Civil Supplies and Consumer

Affairs, Port Blair from today. Services like new enrolment, demographic and biometric updation will be extended from this centre. New enrolment service will be on free of

cost basis whereas for updation services, the prescribed rate by UIDAI will be charged from the applicants. The fee to be charged will be as under:

For the convenience of the school going children, there will be a separate slot for Aadhaar Enrolment from 3 pm to 5 pm daily except Saturday and Sundays. Initially, the correction and updation services will be extended

only on Saturday since Aadhaar coverage is the priority of the Department, once universal coverage is attained, updation services through this centre will be regularized on daily basis. Enrolment and updation forms will be available at the

centre which can be had on payment of Rs.2/- per form. The materials for setting up of PEC in other location have also arrived and more PECs will come up in other locations in short notice, a communication received here said.

Mithali named captain of ICC Women's World Cup team

London, July 24
India skipper Mithali Raj was on Monday chosen as the captain of the ICC Women's World Cup 2017 team by the International Cricket Council. The 34-year-old Indian was selected as captain after she led India to the final of the just-concluded ICC Women's World Cup. India lost to

England by nine runs in one of the most thrilling finals at the Lord's. Mithali led by example, scoring 409 runs during the 30-day tournament. She was at her best in a virtual quarter-final against New Zealand in Derby when she scored 109 to steer her side into the semifinals with a 186-run victory. Her other notable scores in the tournament were 71 against England in the tournament opener in Derby, 46 against the West Indies in Taunton, 53 against Sri Lanka in Derby and 69 against Australia in Bristol. Besides Mithali, Harmanpreet Kaur and Deepti Sharma were the other two Indians included in the ICC's team. The side includes four players from England -- player of the tournament Tamsin Beaumont, player of the final Anya Shrubsole, wicketkeeper Sarah Taylor and left-arm spinner Alex Hartley --, three from South Africa that included opener Laura Wolvaardt and bowlers Marizanne Kapp and Dane van Niekerk, and Australia all-rounder Ellyse Perry. England's Natalie Sciver, who scored 369 runs and took seven wickets, was chosen as the 12th player. Mithali, Taylor and Shrubsole have been picked in the Team of the Tournament for the second time in their careers. Mithali and Taylor were selected in the Team of the ICC Women's World Cup 2009, which England won in Sydney in 2009, while Shrubsole was named in the Team of the ICC Women's World Cup 2013, which Australia won in India in January/February 2013.

BCCI plans grand felicitation for Indian women's cricket team



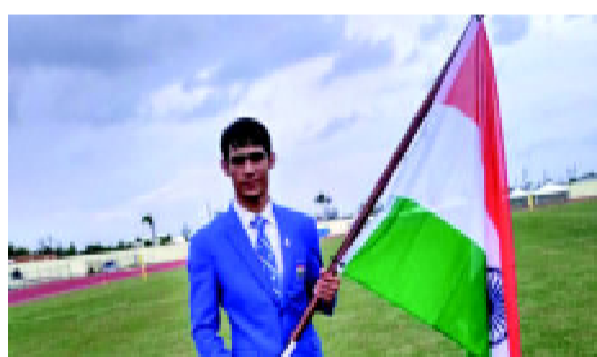
New Delhi, Jul 24
The BCCI is planning a grand felicitation for the Indian women's cricket team, which won a billion hearts despite a heartbreaking loss in the World Cup final at Lord's yesterday. The team is scheduled to return home in batches from

Wednesday onwards. The date and venue for the felicitation has not been finalised yet and will be done after checking the availability of the players. At the ceremony, the players will be presented with cheques of 50 lakh rupees each while the support staff will

receive will 25 lakh rupees each, as announced by the BCCI before the final. A BCCI official said, efforts are also on for a players' interaction with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who richly praised the women for taking India to their first final in 12 years.

Boxer Sachin Siwach wins gold at Commonwealth Youth Games

Bahamas, Jul 24
World Youth Champion Sachin Siwach on Sunday clinched a gold medal at the Commonwealth Youth Games after defeating Welsh boxer James Nathan Prober 4-1 in the final. Siwach, who won gold last year, was the only one of the 103 boxers to have clinched a gold so far in the tournament, taking place in Bahamas. He had stormed into the finals after defeating SA Kuse 5-0. The World Youth Champion was also the flag bearer of India for the tournament. Earlier this month, the boxer had claimed a silver medal at the Asian Youth Boxing Championship after losing 5-0 to Uzbekistan's Samandar



Kholmurodov in the final in Bangkok. Jony is the only other Indian to have claimed a medal at the ongoing tournament in Bahamas. She lost her final bout in the lightweight (60kg) category to Australian boxer Ella Jade Boot by a margin of a single point to claim silver. Earlier, Muhammed Etash Khan won bronze in the

bantamweight (56kg) division after losing in the semifinals. Khan went down 2-3 to England's Reuben Shiloh Defreitas. **KL Rahul ruled out of first Test with viral fever**

Galle, July 24
India opener K L Rahul was on Monday ruled out of the first cricket Test against Sri Lanka owing to viral fever. The BCCI, in a release, said Rahul is on his way to recovery and has been kept out of the series opener as a precautionary measure. "The BCCI medical team confirms that opening batsman Mr. KL Rahul is presently down with viral fever. There are no major health concerns and he is making rapid progress, much to the satisfaction of the medical team," said the BCCI in the statement. "As a precautionary measure, Mr. KL Rahul is advised further rest and hence will not be available for selection for the first Test match against Sri Lanka, which starts on July 26 at Galle," it added.

Ashwin hails Team India's rise to top Test ranking
Galle (Sri Lanka), July 24
Ravichandran Ashwin, who will play his 50th Test against Sri Lanka this week, on Monday hailed India's rebuilding effort to become the number one Test side. The 30-year-old Ashwin will be one of India's key players in the match starting in Galle on Wednesday, the first of three Tests. Ashwin believes life has come full circle for Virat Kohli's India since their last tour of Sri Lanka in 2015. India lost the Galle Test then but bounced back to beat the hosts 2-1. That spurred them on to regain their number one Test crown a year later. "In 2015 I think we were sandwiched in the middle of a

leadership takeover. Virat had just taken over in Australia and we came here having played one Test in Bangladesh," Ashwin said. "We had set ourselves a lot of goals for each other and I would say we have achieved them and come out with flying colours over the last couple of years as a group. "We have produced a lot of good cricketers. Some young cricketers have come in and put their hands up and some others have excelled really. That includes me, (Ravindra) Jadeja, Puji (Cheteshwar Pujara). "Sometimes I feel that even good cricketers lose out in this particular team because of the quality we have in the dressing room," he added.

H S Prannoy wins US Open Grand Prix Gold badminton title



California, Jul 24
Indian Shuttler H S Prannoy has won the US Open Grand Prix Gold badminton tournament title defeating his compatriot Parupalli Kashyap. At Anaheim, California, last night, Prannoy beat Kashyap 21-15, 20-22, 21-12. Prannoy had found place in the final defeating Vietnam's Tien Minh Nguyen while Kashyap overcame Korean Kwang Hee Heo in the semifinals. In the women's singles of the tournament, Japanese Aya Ohori won the final

beating Michelle Li of Canada. It was the second time this season that two Indians fought out for the title at international badminton. In

April, K Srikanth and B Sai Praneeth had played in the finals of Singapore Open with Sai Praneeth claiming his maiden Super Series title.

IRCTC plans to install 1,100 water vending machines at 450 stations

New Delhi, Jul 24
Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) plans to install 1,100 water vending machines at 450 stations in 2017-2018 as part of its efforts to ensure clean drinking water at low cost in rail premises across the country.

vending machines will provide clean drinking water at low cost, and that the initiative will help in generating employment for around 2,000 people. At present, there are 1,106 water vending machines at 345 stations in the country. The project was initiated in 2015 with an objective of providing potable water at nominal rates. Water is dispensed through the provision of Reverse Osmosis (RO) in these machines.

class levels. He said education system must accept disruption as a norm and prepare students to manage and build upon the disruptions. He also said universities should not be a place for rote-memorizing but an assembly of inquisitive minds.
