The President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, will confer the National Teachers Awards 2026 on 48 school teachers at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, on September 5, 2026, on the occasion of Teachers Day.

Among the 48 awardees is Shri J. Prakash Rao of PM SHRI Government Model Senior Secondary School (GMSSS), Mayabunder, Pokadera, Andaman &

Nicobar Islands, who has been selected for his exemplary contribution to school education.

Organic Certification Renewal under Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana initiated in Nicobar District

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 24

The Department of Agriculture, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, has initiated the process for renewal of organic certification under the Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY) in Car Nicobar and the Nancowrie group of Islands, with the objective of promoting sustainable, chemical-free and climate-resilient agricultural practices among farmers.

The Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme launched by the

Government of India during 2015-16 under the National Mission of Sustainable Agriculture (NMSA). The scheme promotes sustainable and eco-friendly models of agricultural production, with emphasis on improving soil fertility, conserving natural resources and producing healthy, chemical-residue-free food through organic farming practices.

Under PKVY, the Participatory Guarantee System (PGS-India) serves as a key mechanism for quality assurance and organic certification. Farmers are

provided the flexibility to adopt suitable forms of organic farming in accordance with PGS-India standards, while the cluster-based approach supports not only farm management and organic input production but also quality assurance, value addition and direct marketing.

A significant milestone was achieved in 2021-22, when 14,491 hectares of the Nicobar group of Islands were declared as a traditional organic area under the Large Area Certification (LAC) component of PKVY with

effect from 6th April, 2021. The organic certification subsequently expired, as certification data is required to be updated annually on the PGS portal for renewal and issuance of the Organic Certificate.

The Department of Agriculture is now taking steps to renew the organic certification in Car Nicobar and the Nancowrie group of Islands. The initiative is expected to further strengthen institutional support to farmers through a cluster-based approach and encourage

South Andaman Forest Division seizes Padauk Sawn Timber and Furniture at Maccapahad

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 24 On 22.08.2026, while conducting routine patrolling in the Maccapahad revenue area near the BSNL Tower, the Beat staff of Garacharama Range, South Andaman Forest Division, detected 0.116 cbm Padauk sawn timber and furniture kept in the premises/work shed belonging to Shri S. Ramakrishna, R/o Junglighthat. On enquiry, no valid documents or bills could be produced in support of the possession of the said timber and furniture. The matter was accordingly brought to the notice of the Range Officer, Garacharama Range. Subsequently, the Range Officer, Garacharama Range and Assistant Conservator of Forests, South Andaman Division, visited the spot and inspected the materials. The Padauk sawn timber and furniture were seized at the spot following due procedure in the presence of independent witnesses. The seized items were thereafter brought to the Range Office, Garacharama, for safe custody and further necessary action. The person concerned was also brought to the Range Office for further enquiry/investigation. Further investigation is underway to ascertain the source of the timber and other relevant facts, and necessary action will be taken in accordance with law. The South Andaman Forest Division reiterates its appeal to the general public to cooperate in safeguarding the forests and wildlife of the Islands and to report any information regarding illegal hunting, possession, transport, storage or trade of forest and wildlife produce through the Forest Department Helpline 03192-255228. The identity of informants will be kept strictly confidential, a press release from DFO, SA said.

N&MA Police intensify Anti-Drug operations: 13 NDPS cases registered

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 24 North & Middle Andaman District Police continues its sustained efforts to curb drug trafficking and ensure a safe and drug-free environment across the district. As of August 2026, a total of 13 cases under the NDPS Act have been registered across N&MA District, resulting in the apprehension of 13 accused persons and seizure of approximately 6.2 kg of suspected Ganja, 6 cannabis plants, 2.7 grams of Methamphetamine and 5 grams of Heroin. Investigation into these cases is underway to identify and unearth the wider network, linkages and supply chains associated with the arrested accused persons. As part of effective prosecution and follow-up action, 5 accused persons have so far been convicted by the Hon'ble Courts in ongoing NDPS cases, with sentences of imprisonment and a total fine of Rs.26,000/. The Police urge community members to support this ongoing mission. Please report any illegal activities to the nearest police station or through the 100 and 112 helplines. The identities of all informants will be kept strictly confidential, and suitable rewards will be provided for actionable information, a press release from SP, N&M Andaman said.

Conviction in NDPS case: Accused convicted in Anti-Narcotics Police Station Case

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 24 Demonstrating its continued commitment to combating drug trafficking and ensuring effective prosecution of narcotics offences, the Anti-Narcotics Police Station (ANPS), A&N Police has secured another conviction in an NDPS case registered. The case pertains to FIR No. 09/2024 dated 12.07.2024 registered under the provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985, wherein the Anti-Narcotics Police Station apprehended Smt. Bhagabati Mistri, W/o Shri Prohlad Mistry, aged 46 years, a resident of Kumirmari Kachhari Para, Narendrapur, Basanti, South 24 Parganas, West Bengal, presently residing at Hutbay No. 22, and recovered illicit ganja from his conscious possession during an anti-narcotics operation. The contraband was seized and the accused was arrested after observing all prescribed legal formalities. The investigation of the case was carried out by ASI Sanjay Yadav, Anti-Narcotics Police Station, whose diligent investigation and timely submission of the charge sheet resulted in the successful prosecution of the case. The accused was subsequently convicted on 12.08.2026 by the Hon'ble Court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, South Andaman, and the case was disposed of in accordance with law. Consumption, transportation, sale and trafficking of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances are serious offences punishable under the NDPS Act, 1985. Depending upon the nature and quantity of the contraband involved, offenders are liable for rigorous imprisonment of up to 20 years and a fine of up to Rs.2,00,000/- or more, as prescribed under the Act, a press release from SP (CID) said.

13. 36. The overall noise level in and around the quarry area will be kept well within prescribed limits of noise emissions as per Environment Protection Act, 1986 and rules framed there under.

37. That the lease holder shall carry out quarrying in accordance with all other provisions applicable for undertaking quarrying including the provisions of Forest(Conservation) Act,1980 and Environment (Protection) Act,1986 and the rules made there under.

38. The lease holder shall abide all the conditions laid down in the Environment Clearance granted by the competent Authority vide EC identification No. EC26C0108AN5607064N and the lease holder shall comply/abide with any additional terms/conditions if any stipulated at any time and all environmental concerns and the safety of the workers are to be addressed.

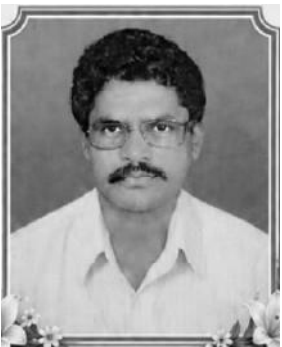
